2015 OUTLOOK

Baylor continues to, as its fearless leader **Art Briles** says, "turn hype into type," and in 2015 will field a veteran and proven team seeking to win a third consecutive Big 12 championship.

"We've got a very mature, very experienced football team that knows how to win big football games," Briles said.

The 2015 Bears return 30 veterans who have lettered on back-to-back Big 12 championship teams (and another 22 with one letter, from the 2014 title team). That's 52 lettermen with at least one ring who have been there, and done that, at a championship level.

After rebuilding Baylor football to an elite national level, any question of whether Briles could sustain the Bears' program among the nation's football powers was erased in 2014 – as BU repeated as Big 12 champions and finished seventh nationally. The Bears return 18 starters from the 2014 title squad and are a consensus top 10 pick in 2015 preseason projections.

Departed from 2014 are All-Americans **Bryce Petty**, **Bryce Hager** and **Antwan Goodley**, as well as two other NFL signees **Levi Norwood** and **Spencer Roth**. But the 2015 roster is loaded with decorated veterans led by returning All-Americans **Spencer Drango** (2014 consensus OT), **Shawn Oakman** (2014 third team DE - AP, Lindy's, Phil Steele) and **Corey Coleman** (2014 honorable mention WR - Sports Illustrated) as well as returning All-Big 12 honorees DE **Andrew Billings**, DT **Beau Blackshear**, WR **KD Cannon**, C **Kyle Fuller**, CB **Xavien Howard**, RB **Shock Linwood**, OG **Blake Muir** and S **Orion Stewart** (not to mention 2014 Freshman All-Americans **Taylor Young** and **K.J. Smith**).

Baylor's veteran-laden squad has experience at all positions, and enters the season with new starters at just three positions: quarterback, middle linebacker and "Bear" nickelback. The 2015 Bears squad combines the nation's most potent offense (led NCAA in yards, 581.5, and scoring, 48.2 points, in 2014) with a deep, veteran defense (nine starters, 25 lettermen return).

"We know our guys know how to win at the highest level," Briles said. "We want to dominate how we prepare, and then dominate our opponents and dominate as individuals. That's what we want to do."

Baylor opens the season Sept. 4 at SMU, hosts six contests at beautiful riverside McLane Stadium and also plays its annual shootout vs. Texas Tech at AT&T Stadium on



TWO-TIME REIGNING BIG 12 CHAMPIONS

Oct. 3. Primetime TV games have already been identified as the Bears play at Kansas State Nov. 5 on Thursday night and at TCU on Friday after Thanksgiving (Nov. 27). But the road to the Big 12 title will once again go through Waco (Baylor has won 16 straight at home), and BU's home schedule is highlighted by visits from West Virginia (Oct. 17), Oklahoma (Nov. 14) and the regular-season finale vs. Texas on Dec. 5.

OFFENSE

There's a new play-caller, offensive coordinator **Kendal Briles** (who made his debut in his new position in the 2015 Cotton Bowl), and new signal-caller, fourth-year junior Russell (who has one career start and 15 career games played) – but most everything else returns as the nation's most explosive offense reloads for 2015.

The Bears, who have led the nation in total offense and scoring each of the past two seasons, return their entire starting offensive line from the bowl game, the entire backfield, and 10 of 13 receivers from 2014.

Baylor's **OFFENSIVE LINE**, the engine of "America's Top Offense," has for five straight seasons produced a 1,000-yard rusher and for four straight seasons powered a top-five ranked total offense unit.

The Baylor O-Line, under the tutelage of running game coordinator **Randy Clements**, has produced six NFL Draft picks over the last seven seasons and in 2015 returns six linemen with eight or more career starts.

The line is led by returning 2014 consensus All-American Drango (35 career starts). The venerable captain, fourth-year starter and two-time first-team All-Big 12 honoree is an Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award candidate at left tackle.

Right tackle will be manned by **Pat Colbert**, a senior with a mean streak with eight previous career starts. Reserves include sopho-

mores **Tanner Thrift** and **Ishmael Wilson** (a former transfer from Texas A&M).

Likely starters at guard are seniors **Blake Muir** (12 career starts) and **Jarell Broxton** (eight starts), while senior **Desmine Hilliard** (a dual-sport athlete with 18 career starts who throws for BU's track and field squad) will also vie for playing time.

Muir is a returning All-Big 12 honoree and former transfer who started 12 games at Baylor as a junior and 12 games at Hawai'i as a redshirt freshman in 2012.

Broxton is a talented second-year transfer from Lackawanna

College who started the final eight games of 2014. Briles refers to Broxton as "a stud" who is in position to take the next step and be dominant. Another transfer, **Rami Hammad** who arrived from Texas prior to 2014, is available at guard.

Anchoring the line is junior returning All-Big 12 honorable mention center **Kyle Fuller**, a

junior who started all 13 games in 2014 and coaches expect big things from. Listed as backup on the post-spring depth chart is redshirt freshman **Blake Blackmar**.

Line reserves include junior transfer **Dom Desouza**, sophomore **Sean Muir** and redshirt freshmen **Patrick Lawrence** and **Josh Pezel**.

The strength of the **BACKFIELD** lies in its youthful but experienced running back corps. The Bears return their top four tailbacks, led by 2014 first-team All-Big 12 rusher **Shock Linwood**. Linwood, an all-purpose back and Doak Walker candidate (2,133 career yards and 24 career TDs), ran for 1,252 yards and 16 TDs last year as a sophomore.

"He's just a machine," Briles said, "he's steady, he's a contributor, and he's a fierce competitor."

Behind Linwood are sophomore **Johnny Jefferson**, junior **Devin Chafin** and redshirt freshman **Terence Williams**.

Jefferson is a shifty, elusive back who ran for 524 yards and six TDs in his rookie season last year. Chafin is a powerful, hard-running back that Briles said can be dominating. He has totaled 678 yards and 12 TDs in two seasons of backup service while fighting through injuries. Williams, a tall, punishing runner, is ready to suit up after a redshirt season in 2014.

Taking over the reins at quarterback is Russell, who started one game last year in place of the departed Petty. The deceptively fast and athletic junior threw for 804 yards and eight TDs in eight games played in 2014.

"Our number one key is Seth, being predictable," Briles said. "His job is going to be to utilize his talents in a predictable environment, because he is a talented player and it's just got to be like breathing, you just do it."

Backing up Russell are sophomore **Chris Johnson**, an athletic dual-threat QB entering his third season in the system, and **Jarrett Stidham**, a true freshman phenom who enrolled in January and went through spring drills. Johnson took snaps in four games last season (4-4, 45 yards passing) as a redshirt freshman.

The spotlight on Baylor's offense shines brightest on its renowned **RECEIVING CORPS**, a highly productive unit that in the Briles system has churned out record-shattering results and produced NFL alumni.

Gone are All-American **Antwan Goodley** and All-Big 12 honoree **Levi Norwood**, but with 10 of 13 2014 receivers back, including the nation's only duo of returning 1,000-yard receivers and two talented redshirts, the 2015 version of "Wide Receiver U" will be as strong as ever.

Leading the way is All-American **Corey Coleman**, a tough, quick, fourth-year junior who amassed 64 catches, 1,119 yard and 11 TDs despite missing three games in 2014.

"Corey brings a toughness and attitude to not just to the offense, but this team," Briles said. "And he elevated his leadership and mental level this spring."

Also returning from a sensational Freshman All-America debut season is electrifying sophomore **KD Cannon**, who caught 58 passes for 1,030 yards and eight TDs in 2014.

"We know what KD and Corey can do," Briles said. "We are looking for others to step up."

Other veterans include **Jay Lee**, a steady senior who made 41 receptions for 633 yards and six TDs in 2014 who Briles expects to take a big step in 2015, and versatile junior **Lynx Hawthorne** who totaled 14-165-2 last year

and impressed the staff all spring, and sophomore **Quan Jones**.

The youth of the corps includes a trio that, along with Cannon, made up Baylor's highly decorated 2014 quartet of receiver signees: second-year sophomore **Davion Hall** and redshirt freshmen **Chris Platt** and **Ishmael Zamora**.

Hall, a former prep All-American, showed promise as a true freshman in 2014 with 15 receptions and one TD. Platt, a speedster who also runs track for BU, and Zamora, a sleeper who combines size and speed, will both see opportunities in their rookie seasons in 2015.

"Chris, Ishmael and Davion, all have to be ready anytime the ball is coming their way," Briles said. They have to be ready to make a play with it. When they get their opportunities they have to make them count."

True freshman **Blake Lynch** is an early enrollee who participated in spring drills.

The tight end position is stocked with veterans, led by junior **Tre'Von Armstead**, a 6-6 punishing former offensive lineman, and the much-publicized giant, senior **LaQuan McGowan**. McGowan is a 6-7, 410-pound former o-lineman who turned heads nationally in the Cotton Bowl with an 18-yard TD reception.

Senior **Gus Penning**, a third-year former transfer, second-year sophomore **Jordan Feuerbacher** and senior **Lee Bristow**, a former walk-on linebacker, provide depth at the position.

"We feel like we've got four or five guys that are bangers and ballers," Briles said of the backs and tight ends in the slot.

DEFENSE

The unheralded aspect of Baylor's back-to-back Big 12 title runs has been the Bears' defense. And the youthful 2013 and 2014 championship squads have matured into a veteran 2015 defense made up of nine returning starters and 25 returning lettermen.

"We feel going into 2015 that our defense needs to carry us," Briles said, "particularly early in the season until we can find out exactly how we are going to gel with Seth; and how our receivers fit together."

Gone are All-American and NFL Draftee **Bryce Hager** as well as nickelback **Collin Brence**, but the remainder of the 2014 squad returns.

"I see depth," defensive coordinator Phil Bennett said of his defense following spring drills. "We can play more players, we have more options; which is what we had two years ago when we were a top 20 pass defense."

The strength of Bennett's D is undoubtedly the **DEFENSIVE LINE**, a group loaded with talent that Briles said "there's none better."

The returning starting rotation, made up of senior All-American **Shawn Oakman**, a trio of All-Big 12 honorees in junior **Andrew Billings** and seniors **Beau Blackshear** and **Jamal**

Palmer, and 2014 Freshman All-American K.J. Smith, has combined for 128 career games, 340 tackles, 87.5 TFL and 33.5 sacks.

The line ranked seventh nationally in rushing yards-per-play allowed in 2014, giving up just 3.15 per-rush.

"I was saying a year ago that we were going to have the best team in all of America, and we have all those guys back and they're experienced," Briles said.

Oakman, a 6-9, 275-pound physical freak anchors one end of the line. The Bednarik, Bronko Nagurski, Rotary Lombardi and Ted Hendricks Awards candidate totaled 11 sacks and 19.5 tackles-for-loss in his first year as a starter in 2014.

On the other end, Palmer returns from an injury that shortened his 2014 season to five games (2.5 sacks). The dynamic senior had 11 tackles for loss and five sacks as a reserve in 2013 when he earned All-Big 12 honorable mention. Smith started the final eight games of 2014 as a redshirt freshman and finished with five sacks and 45 tackles.

Another promising option at end is former prep All-American Brian Nance, a sophomore who earned praise from the coaching staff for having a, "great spring." Redshirt freshmen Jamie Jacobs, Xavier Jones and Greg Roberts provide depth at the end position.

On the inside, physical beast Billings locks down the nose tackle position. The junior All-America candidate and record-breaking weight-lifter is coming off a consensus first-team All-Big 12 season as a sophomore in 2014 (11.5 TFL, two sacks).

Blackshear, a senior third-year starter at tackle and 2013 All-Big 12 selection, has 39 career games and 92 career tackles under his belt.

Reserves on the interior include junior Byron Bonds and redshirt freshmen Ira Lewis, Josh Malin and Andrew Morris.

The only two holes to fill on defense are in the **LINEBACKING CORPS**, where departures at middle linebacker and the hybrid "Bear" linebacker/safety position mean new starters in 2015.

The weakside and middle linebacker spots will be manned by what Bennett refers to as three players of starter quality in 2014. Freshman All-American Taylor Young, senior Grant Campbell and junior Aivion Edwards.

Young, a driven and powerful leader, was named 2014 Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year and 2015 Cotton Bowl Defensive MVP as a rookie. He totaled 92 tackles in eight starts at MLB as a redshirt freshman.

Campbell, a second-year former junior college transfer, earned praise all spring. "I want to see him be that guy play-in-and-play-out," Briles said. "He was physical."

Edwards started five games at the Mike position while battling injuries in 2014. Bennett considers the versatile veteran a third starter and said he can play either Will or Mike in 2015. Depth at linebacker will be provided by junior Kendall Ehrlich and sophomores

Raaquan Davis and Xavier Phillips.

At the nickelback "Bear", sophomore **Travon Blanchard** emerged as the starter following spring drills. The rangy third-year back made 31 tackles and one interception as a redshirt freshman in 2014.

"Travon is what we've been looking for, a guy that can run and is very athletic and mature," Briles said.

Also vying for snaps at the Bear will be **Pat Levels**, an athletic fourth-year junior, and redshirt freshman **Cordell Dorsey**.

The **SECONDARY** returns four starters and is loaded with veteran upper-classmen.

"I think we'll be better in the secondary," Bennett said. "We have some real good possibilities if we stay healthy and stay hungry."

Both starting safeties return in All-Big 12 junior **Orion Stewart** and senior third-year starter **Terrell Burt**.

Burt is a vocal, athletic back with seven interceptions in two seasons and the returning starter at down safety. Behind him, third-year junior **Taion Sells** (15 games, one interception) and sophomore **Alfred Pullom** (13 games, one interception) have shown lots of promise.

At cover safety, Burt is a tough, mature veteran with 39 career games played and 119 tackles. His backup, **Chance Waz**, is a talented sophomore who played 11 games as a true freshman in 2014.

All-Big 12 corner **Xavien Howard** is a returning starter as a junior after leading squad in interceptions (four) and breakups (13) in 2014.

The other cornerback spot will be a battle between juniors **Ryan Reid** and **Tion Wright**. Reid is a 12-game starter in 2014 who recorded 12 PBUs. Wright is in his second year since transferring from Moorpark College and impressed coaches with his play in the spring.

Reserves at corner include junior **Terrence Singleton** and redshirt freshmen **Jourdan Blake** and **Verkedric Vaughns**. Singleton is an athletic, fourth-year back and former prep QB.

"I think we have more guys capable of playing," Bennett said. "We're further along now, spring helped us solidify some depth."

SPECIAL TEAMS

Gone is four-year starting punter **Spencer Roth**, but back is record-setting place-kicker **Chris Callahan**.

Callahan is a third-year sophomore who broke the school's scoring record with 129 points kicking in 2014. He kicked the game-winning field goal with no time remaining in last season's epic 61-58 win over TCU.

The kickoff duties will continue to be handled by sophomore **Spencer Evans**.

Drew Galitz, a true freshman from Rowlett (Texas) High School, is slated to take over at punter for Roth, who left for the NFL.

At long snapper will be experienced senior **Jimmy Landes**, and junior Hawthorne is expected to assume holding responsibility.

Gone is four-year returner Norwood, and likely replacements include Coleman (punts) and Jefferson and Zamora (kickoffs).

- Baylor boasts the nation's only returning 1,000-yard receiving duo in 2015: **Corey Coleman** (64-1, 119-11) and **KD Cannon** (58-1, 1,030-8).
- WR **Corey Coleman** ranked seventh nationally with 111.9 receiving yards/game & 12th (led Big 12) with 11 TDs in 2014.
- DE **Shawn Oakman** ranked 10th nationally in TFL (1.5/gm) & 15th in sacks (.85/gm) in 2014.
- RB **Shock Linwood** ranked second in Big 12 in rushing yards (1,252) and TDs (16, 14th nationally) in 2014.
- OL **Spencer Drango** was named a 2014 consensus All-America, Big 12 Co-Offensive Lineman of the Year and Outland Trophy semifinalist.
- 3 starters (**Beau Blackshear**, **Andrew Billings** & **Orion Stewart**) are Waco natives.
- PK **Chris Callahan** has made 17 of his last 20 FGs, after starting his career 1-of-6.

BRILES' UNIQUE SYSTEM IS AMERICA'S TOP OFFENSE

Art Briles' unique, record-breaking offense has led the nation in total offense (581.5 ypg 2014, 618.8 ypg 2013) and scoring (48.2 ppg 2014, 52.4 ppg 2013) in each of the last two seasons. Baylor's offense is the only in the country to rank among the top-four in total offense each of the last four years [see listing below].

THE BRILES OFFENSE: A unique, up-tempo spread attack with origins in Bill Yeoman's 'Houston Veer' (perhaps most identifiable by wide splits of receivers and a power running game), Art Briles has honed his offensive system over the past four decades as a high school and collegiate coach; it's a balanced offense, not to be confused with more common pass-heavy spread attacks. The Briles offense is also in use at Bowling Green (head coach **Dino Babers**) and Tulsa (**Philip Montgomery**) under former Briles assistants.

#AMERICAS TOP OFFENSE BACK AND LOADED IN 2015

Baylor's powerful offensive machine, which has led the nation in total offense and scoring each of the past two seasons, returns its entire starting offensive line from the 2015 Cotton Bowl, its entire backfield and 10 of 13 receivers from 2014.

BAYLOR'S RETURN TO PROMINENCE UNDER BRILES

It's no secret that Art Briles has completely rebuilt Baylor's football program back to national prominence, but most impressive is how speedy and pronounced the transformation has been (Briles is third on the BU career wins list). The chart below shows the drastic improvement in Baylor's football fortunes in seven years under Briles compared to the previous 12 seasons in the Big 12 era.

BU's defensive impact has steadily improved under fifth-year D-coordinator **Phil Bennett**. Baylor's takeaways have remained constant from year-to-year, but the chart below shows the increase in sacks and tackles-for-loss during Baylor's back-to-back Big 12 championship seasons.

BAYLOR D-LINE: "SCARY GOOD"

Baylor's defensive line is loaded with talented veterans and features a five-man rotation that *Phil Steele* termed, "one of the best defensive lines in the country." The quintet, of which *ESPN* said, "has the potential to be scary good -- and also just plain scary," is made up of senior All-American **Shawn Oakman**, a trio of All-Big 12 honorees in junior **Andrew Billings** and seniors **Beau Blackshear** and **Jamal Palmer**, and 2014 Freshman All-American **K.J. Smith**, has combined for 128 career games, 340 tackles, 87.5 TFL and 33.5 sacks. The line ranked seventh nationally in rushing yards-per-play allowed in 2014, giving up just 3.15 per-rush.

NATION'S TOP RECEIVING DUO

Baylor's potent 1-2 receiving punch of junior All-American **Corey Coleman** and sophomore **KD Cannon** (2014 Freshman All-American) is the nation's only returning 1,000-yard receiving duo in 2015. Last season Coleman totaled 64 catches, 1,119 yards and 11 TDs in just 10 games (111.9 yards/game) and Cannon (described by *Sporting News* as "the next great receiver in the college game") had 58 for 1,030 and 8 TDs.

OAKMAN, "NATION'S MOST INTIMIDATING PLAYER"

Senior **Shawn Oakman**, a 2014 All-American and 6-9, 275-pound beast, headlines a stout front four and veteran Baylor defense. The aggressive defensive end has been labeled "the nation's most intimidating player" by *Sports Illustrated* and described as "nearly impossible to block off the edge without help" by *Sporting News*. In his first season as a starter in 2014, Oakman totaled a school-record 11 sacks and ranked 10th nationally in TFL with 1.5 per-game.

VETERAN O-LINE BACK TO PROTECT NEW QB

Baylor's offensive line returns six lineman with 8 or more career starts entering the 2015 season (**Spencer Drango** 35, **Desmine Hilliard** 18, **Kyle Fuller** 13, **Blake Muir** 12, **Jarell Broxton** 8, **Pat Colbert** 8). The line allowed just 1.54 sacks-per-game during its 2014 championship run [see chart below].

WIDE RECEIVER U

Art Briles' offense continues to attract and develop standout receivers that are producing eye-popping results. Over the last five years (2010-2014), Wide Receiver U has graduated eight receivers to the NFL, produced four All-Americans and 19 All-Big 12 honors and totaled five 1,000-yard seasons. Prominent alums include **Antwan Goodley** (Cowboys), **Josh Gordon** (Browns), **Tevin Reese** (Bengals), **Terrance Williams** (Cowboys) and **Kendall Wright** (Titans), and the current corps boasts All-American **Corey Coleman** and 2014 Freshman All-America **KD Cannon**.

THE NATION'S MOST BALANCED OFFENSE

Baylor has ranked among the nation's top 15 in both rushing yards and passing yards in three of the past four years. Additionally, Baylor has rushed on more than 54 percent of its plays over the last four seasons (yearly ratios below).

WORLD'S LARGEST TIGHT END

Oft-publicized **LaQuan McGowan**, who turned heads nationally with an 18-yard TD reception in the 2015 Cotton Bowl, is a senior 6-7, 410-pound offensive lineman-turned tight end who wears a size 20 shoe. McGowan, who is listed as a co-starter at TE, was limited in his blocking role in spring drills but will be unleashed on opposing defenses during the regular season.

OPPORTUNISTIC DEFENSE

Baylor's defense under coordinator **Phil Bennett** has demonstrated a knack for making big plays at key moments to contribute to the Bears' winning ways over the past four seasons. In four years under Bennett, Baylor's D has recorded at least one takeaway in 47 of 52 games - a total of 109 takeaways (66 interceptions, 43 fumbles recovered). Overall under Bennett, Baylor is 29-5 when recording two or more takeaways.

BAYLOR'S POWERFUL OFFENSE ALSO CRAZY FAST

In 2014, Baylor's up-tempo offense led the nation in plays/game (87.5), TD drives of one minute or less (24), TD drives of two minutes or less (41, tied with Oregon) and fewest seconds-per-play in the first half (18.0). The Bears also led the NCAA in TDs of 40 or more yards (19) and TD throws of 25 or more yards (24). In 2013, Baylor's offense led the nation in seconds-per-play (16.7), TD drives of one minute or less (29), TD drives of two minutes or less (60) and most plays of 40 yards or more (37). HEAD COACH ART BRILES

Art Briles, a 36-year veteran coach and mentor of young men, is in his eighth season at Baylor and coming off back-to-back Big 12 championship seasons in 2013 and 2014.

Briles, who has seen dozens of his protégés earn All-America honors and make their way to the NFL (including 2011 Heisman Trophy winner Robert Griffin III), owns an 89-62 record as a collegiate head coach and has led three teams to conference championships and nine teams to bowl games (both Houston and Baylor); including two BCS/New Year's Six contests.

He has received numerous honors for his coaching, including the 2013 Big 12 Coach of the Year and the 2006 Sportexe DI-A national Coach of the Year. Briles spent 12 seasons as a high school head coach, won 172 games and won four Texas state championships before moving to the college ranks.

Over the past four decades Briles has developed an explosive, innovative offensive scheme (a unique, up-tempo spread offense with origins in Bill Yeoman's 'Houston Veer', perhaps most identifiable by wide splits of receivers) that annually leads the nation in total offense and scoring. The Briles offense, a balanced attack that ranks nationally among the nation's top rush offenses and isn't to be confused with typical, pass-heavy spread attacks, is also utilized at Bowling Green (Dino Babers) and Tulsa (Philip Montgomery) under former assistants.

Briles is a proven developer of pro talent, evidenced by 43 former players who have dotted NFL rosters. His protégés include a pair of NFL Draft first-rounders in both the 2012 (second pick Griffin III and 20th pick WR Kendall Wright) and 2011 (21st pick DL Phil Taylor and 23rd pick OL Danny Watkins) drafts as well as the first lineman selected in 2009 (second overall pick OL Jason Smith), the first receiver selected in 2008 (33rd pick Donnie Avery of Houston) and the third QB selected in 2007 (36th pick Kevin Kolb of UH).

His ability to recruit and coach elite quarterbacks is illustrated by the highly successful collegiate passers Briles has mentored, including Petty (Baylor/Jets), Nick Florence (Baylor), Griffin III (Baylor/Redskins), Case Keenum (Houston/Texans), Kolb (Houston/Eagles) and Kliff Kingsbury (Texas Tech/Jets).

A native West Texan, Briles became Baylor's 25th head coach on Nov. 28, 2007, ushering in a new era and a new attitude to the storied Bears' football program. From his first game on the sidelines in Waco it was quickly evident that the Briles regime was underway at Baylor; from the innovative offense, to the reintroduction of a solid running game, to improved recruitment, the refusal to accept moral victories, and in short order – wins, top 25 rankings, bowl games and championships.

Briles earned 2013 Big 12 Coach of the Year honors from the league coaches (Chuck Neinas award) as well as the AP and Sporting News. He has finished as a finalist for national coach of the year multiple seasons, and in 2006 was named the Sportexe Division I-A National Coach of the Year at Houston.

He is a 2008 inductee in the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame, a 2014 inductee in the Texas High School Coaches Association Hall of Honor and a 2006 inductee in the Big Country Athletic Hall of Fame.

A major component of Briles' rebuilding at Baylor is the solid foundation laid by improved recruiting, primarily within Texas. The seven classes signed by his staffs since 2009 comprise the school's highest-ranked signing classes in the Big 12 era. A 2013 ranking by ESPN.com listed Briles third among the "Nation's top recruiting head coaches."

After rebuilding Baylor football to an elite national level, any question of whether Art Briles could sustain the Bears' program among the nation's football powers was erased in 2014 – as BU repeated as Big

12 champions and finished seventh nationally.

Behind the nation's top offense (again led FBS with an average of 581.5 total yards and 48.2 points) and with a remarkable home-field advantage (16 straight wins in Waco) in its new state-of-the-art on-campus riverfront McLane Stadium, Briles' Baylor squad powered to an 11-2 record, a second-straight Big 12 crown, came within a whisker of earning a berth in the inaugural College Football Playoff (fifth in final CFP rankings), earned a New Year's Day Six bowl berth in the Cotton Bowl and spent all but two weeks of the season ranked in the top 10.

Briles was recognized as a finalist for 2014 coach of the year honors by the Bobby Dodd Trophy and Eddie Robinson Award, and was named the 2014 Big 12 Coach of the Year by the Waco Tribune-Herald.

The Bears' back-to-back Big 12 championships is only the second such achievement in league history (also OU in 2006-08), and Baylor's consecutive New Year's Day bowl berths are a first in school history.

Briles mentored a league-high 10 players who received 2014 AP Big 12 honors, led by five All-Americans: linemen Spencer Drango (OT) and Shawn Oakman (DE), Bobby Bowden Award-winning QB Bryce Petty, breakout receiver Corey Coleman, and veteran linebacker Bryce Hager.

Baylor set a new school attendance record, and made headlines nationwide, in gorgeous new McLane Stadium. The Bears new home on the banks of the Brazos River averaged 46,710 fans in six home games in 2014.

Briles' restoration of Baylor's football program to among the national elite received an exclamation point in 2013 with a Big 12 Conference title and first-ever BCS bowl berth.

Powered by a record breaking offense (110 school records set or tied) and a veteran Top-30 nationally ranked defense, the 2013 Bears won a school-record 11 games, finished No. 13 nationally and played in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl as Big 12 champions (a then-school-record fourth consecutive bowl berth).

Baylor spent eight consecutive weeks ranked in the Top 10, and its high-octane offense shattered the NCAA record for points scored (681, 52.4/game) and led the nation in total offense at 618.8 yards-per-game. BU set all-time attendance marks (45,948 average, 51,728 single-game) in the final season at Floyd Casey Stadium in 2013.

The 2013 squad was led by five All-Americans (Ahmad Dixon, Antwan Goodley, Petty, Cyril Richardson and Spencer Roth) and an additional 14 players that earned All-Big 12 honors, including Maxwell and Doak Walker Award semifinalist Lache Seastrunk.

His successes earned Briles 2013 coach of the year honors from the Big 12 coaches (Chuck Neinas award) as well as the AP and Sporting News. He earned finalist honors from the Eddie Robinson, Paul "Bear" Bryant, Bobby Bowden and Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year awards as well as being named the 2013 AFCA Region 4 Coach of the Year.

Briles' program proved its solid foundation during the 2012 season, when despite the departure of Heisman Trophy-winner Griffin III and five NFL Draft picks from its record-breaking 2011 squad, the Bears finished 8-5, including a dominating 49-26 Holiday Bowl win over No. 17 UCLA – the school's first back-to-back bowl victories in 25 years.

The Bears finished second nationally in total offense (572.3 ypg), and boasted offensive standouts Florence (second in nation in total offense - 375.2 ypg), unanimous All-American and Biletnikoff Award finalist Terrance Williams (led the nation with 1,832 receiving yards) and All-American offensive lineman Richardson.

Briles' 2012 squad, which finished the season with four straight victories, made national headlines in

November, when Baylor stomped No. 1-ranked Kansas State 52-24 in Waco (the school's first-ever win over the nation's top-ranked team).

During a historic record-breaking 2011 season, Briles led Baylor to a then-school-record 10 wins and its highest final ranking (12th) since 1986, the school's first bowl victory in 19 years and coached the first Heisman Trophy winner in program history – Griffin III.

Briles' accomplishments were recognized when he was named a finalist for the 2011 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award. The Bears finished the 2011 season with a 10-3 record, including a memorable 67-56 Alamo Bowl win over Washington, and ranked 12th (coaches) and 13th (AP) nationally. Baylor's offense set or tied 108 school records and three Bears–national player of the year RG3 as well all-time leading receiver Wright and single-season rushing leader Terrance Ganaway–earned All-America honors.

The Bears finished 2011 on a six-game winning streak. In that streak, Baylor beat No. 5 Oklahoma for the first time in program history, defeated Texas for the second consecutive season for the first time since 1991-92, knocked off Texas Tech for the first time in Big 12 play and pulled off the program's largest comeback ever with a 21-point fourth quarter rally to win in overtime at Kansas.

Briles' powerful offense ranked No. 2 nationally in 2011, averaging 587.1 yards per game, and was the only offensive unit nationally to rank in the top 10 in both passing (fourth, 351.5 ypg) and rushing (10th, 235.6 ypg).

The Bears finished a perfect 7-0 at Floyd Casey Stadium, just the third perfect record in the stadium's history and a school record for home wins in a single season.

Briles' transformation of the Baylor football program took a major step in 2010, when he led the Bears to a 7-6 record and the school's first bowl game in 16 years. After a record-breaking season which saw Baylor spend multiple weeks ranked in the polls and break a record for Big 12 Conference victories, the Bears advanced to the 2010 Texas Bowl – the school's first bowl game since a 1994 trip to the Alamo Bowl. Baylor's accomplishments earned Briles the 2010 AFCA Region 4 Coach of the Year award.

Briles' Bears rolled to seven wins – the school's most since 1995 – behind a powerful offense that set or tied 55 school records (22 team and 33 individual), including total offensive yards (6,179), passing yards (3,649), average yards per rush (5.4) and scoring (405).

After a promising start, the 2009 season suffered injury setbacks in the season's first month, including the season-ending loss of superstar QB and face-of-the-program Griffin III in the third game (all told, eight different starters missed games in 2009 due to injury). The Bears remained competitive, but a season that began with a road win over ACC power Wake Forest and the team receiving votes in the AP Top 25 poll ended with a 4-8 record. The Bears notched a second impressive road victory in 2009, upsetting Missouri 40-32 in Columbia.

Briles' 2008 Bears squad finished with a 4-8 record, but six of eight defeats were at the hands of ranked opponents (four in top 10) and three losses came by a touchdown or less.

Highlights of Briles' first season at Baylor included the emergence of sensational true freshman QB Griffin III, the Big 12's top newcomer and freshman All-American, a rushing attack that ranked 21st nationally and third in the Big 12 with 195.8 yards per game (2,349 yards, most since 1981) and 29 TDs, and a memorable 41-21 home win over Texas A&M.

Baylor's 1.33 turnover margin ranked fourth nationally and linebacker Joe Pawelek ranked seventh

nationally in tackles (10.7) and interceptions (.50).

Briles came to Baylor after resurrecting the University of Houston football program in a five-year stretch from 2003 to 2007.

After inheriting a Houston program just two years removed from an 0-11 season, Briles won eight total games from 2000 to 2003, posted a 34-28 record with the Cougars and led them to four bowl games. He ranks as the program's third-winningest head coach behind College Football Hall of Famer Bill Yeoman (160 wins in 26 seasons) and Clyde Lee (37 victories in seven seasons).

Briles guided Houston to an 8-4 regular-season record and a Texas Bowl invitation in his final season (he did not coach the Cougars in the bowl game). Coupled with their 10-win 2006 campaign, the Cougars registered consecutive seasons of at least eight victories for the first time since the 1989 (nine) and 1990 (10) campaigns. The 2007 Cougars finished the season ranked fourth nationally in total offense (501.9 ypg) and made college football history by becoming the first program to produce a 300-yard receiver and a 200-yard rusher in the same game.

In 2006, Briles earned Conference USA and Sportex Division I-A National Coach of the Year honors after guiding Houston to a C-USA title, a Liberty Bowl appearance and the program's first 10-win season since 1990 with a final mark of 10-4.

The Cougars enjoyed the nation's seventh-best turnaround in 2006, a four-game improvement in the win column over their 6-6 mark in 2005. Houston's 2006 C-USA title, just five years removed from a winless 2001 campaign, marked only the fifth time in

the past 30 seasons that a I-A program went from winless to conference champions.

One of nine finalists for the 2006 Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year award, Briles' offense led Conference USA and ranked sixth nationally at 439.9 yards per game. Cougar quarterback Kolb was C-USA's consensus 2006 Offensive Player of the Year, and 13 UH student-athletes earned postseason honors from the media and 12 were honored by league coaches. Kolb ended his career ranked third in NCAA history for total offense and fourth in passing yards.

Briles' 2005 UH team finished 6-6 overall, led Conference USA in total offense and played in the Fort Worth Bowl, and his 2004 squad was 3-8.

His rookie season at UH saw the Cougars make school history; as they finished 7-6 and earned a berth in the 2003 Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl. He became just the second UH head coach to take Houston to a bowl game in his first season at the helm, joining Yeoman, his college coach. Briles' innovative offense produced a 1,000-yard rusher (Anthony Evans), a 1,000-yard receiver (Brandon Middleton) and a 3,000-yard passer (Kolb)—one of only five Division I-A teams to accomplish that feat.

Briles arrived to Houston from Texas Tech, where he spent three years (2000-02) as the Red Raiders' running backs coach. The Tech ground game flourished under Briles' direction, increasing its production every year and producing 2001 first-team All-Big 12 back Ricky Williams. The Red Raiders won seven or more games each season Briles was on Mike Leach's staff and went bowling every year.

Prior to moving into the collegiate coaching ranks at

Texas Tech, Briles spent 12 seasons (1988-99) as head coach and athletic director at Stephenville [Texas] High School. His Yellowjacket teams won four state championships, capturing back-to-back crowns in 1993 and 1994 and repeating that feat in 1998 and 1999.

Briles, a former Texas High School Coaches Association president, has spent his entire coaching career in the state of Texas. Following in his father's footsteps, Briles began his coaching career as an assistant at Sundown [Texas] High School in 1979 before moving to Sweetwater [Texas] High School as an assistant from 1980-83. He landed his first head coaching job at Hamlin [Texas] High School (1984-85), where he also served as athletic director.

From Hamlin, Briles went to Georgetown [Texas] High School as head coach and athletic director for two seasons (1986-87) before moving to Stephenville in 1988. While coaching in the prep ranks, Briles developed six Division I quarterbacks and had five signal callers throw for over 3,000 yards in a season.

A former wide receiver for the Cougars from 1974 to 1977, Briles was a member of Houston's 1976 squad that captured the Southwest Conference championship in its first season in the league. He later played in the 1977 Cotton Bowl against fifth-ranked Maryland, a game the Cougars won, 30-21.

He received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Texas Tech in 1979 and a Masters of Education degree from Abilene Christian in 1984.

Briles and his wife, Jan, have three children; Jancy; Kendal, who serves as offensive coordinator on his father's Baylor staff; and Staley Lebby, wife of Baylor assistant coach Jeff Lebby, and four grandchildren.

Bryce Petty and No. 10 Baylor had a nice housewarming party at their new riverfront campus stadium, even though the QB was not feeling his best. Petty threw for 161 yards and accounted for three TDs while playing the first half of the Bears' 45-0 victory over SMU.

Petty, the reigning Big 12 offensive player of the year, was held out in the second half because of an injury to his lower back.

Big 12 champion Baylor led 24-0 after the first quarter, including TD drives of six yards after an SMU fumble and four yards after Levi Norwood's 45-yard punt return.

SMU's three quarterbacks were sacked a combined nine times. The Mustangs (0-1) were held to 67 total yards.

Robert Griffin III was on hand for the Bears' first game on campus since 1935.

The Washington Redskins quarterback and Baylor's only Heisman Trophy winner took part in the statue dedication more than three hours before kickoff and was also on the field before the game, giving the invocation and taking part in the opening coin toss with former President George W. Bush.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 9 sacks tied a school record from a Sept. 17, 1983 game at UTEP.
- Baylor's last shutout was on Sept. 17, 2011, vs. Stephen F. Austin (48-0) and was the 165th shutout in Baylor history.
- The contest was Baylor's first shutout of an FBS-opponent since Sept. 23, 1995 (14-0 at NCST).
- Baylor gave up only 67 yards vs. SMU, its fewest since 1988 win over UNLV (50 yards).
- Petty broke RG3's 2011 program record for most consecutive games with a passing TD with 14.
- RB Shock Linwood scored the first touchdown in McLane Stadium history with a 4-yard rushing TD in the 1st quarter.
- Baylor held SMU to [-24] yards rushing, its fewest allowed since the school-record effort -36 vs. TTU in 1980.

Baylor backup quarterback Seth Russell threw for 438 yards and five touchdowns while playing only the first half, freshman KD Cannon caught three of those scores and No. 10 Baylor overwhelmed FCS team Northwestern State 70-6.

Cannon went streaking past the secondary for TD catches of 50, 81 and 42 yards in the first quarter for the Bears. He finished with six catches for 223 yards, the second-most in school history.

Senior QB Bryce Petty, the reigning Big 12 offensive player of the year, didn't play a week after cracking two small bones in his back on the first series of the season opener.

The Bears were also without several top receivers, but still won their 12th straight home game, scoring at least 69 points for the sixth time in that streak.

Northwestern State lost its 17th straight game to an FBS team.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's defense held opposing teams scoreless for the first 77:06 of game time at McLane Stadium before NSU's field goal with 12:54 left in the 2nd quarter.
- Baylor's 28 points in the 1st quarter tied the 4th-most in any quarter in program history.
- True freshman WR KD Cannon tied a school record with 3 TD catches in a game (all of which were in the 1st quarter), and his 223 receiving yards were 2nd-most in a game in Baylor history (and set the Baylor record for most in a half, with all recorded in the 1st half).
- Sophomore QB Seth Russell made his first career start and threw for 438 yards and 5 TDs in the 1st half, both Baylor records for a half. He sat out the 2nd half.
- Russell's 438 passing yards were 3rd-most in a game in BU history, and his 6 TDs accounted for tied the Baylor record, which had been accomplished 3 times before.

Bryce Petty threw four touchdown passes, leading No. 8 Baylor to a 63-21 victory on the road against Buffalo.

Petty went 23 of 34 for 416 yards through three quarters, and Shock Linwood had 98 yards rushing and two touchdowns for Baylor. Lynx Hawthorne and Jay Lee each caught two touchdowns passes.

It was Petty's first game since he cracked two small bones in his back during a season-opening 45-0 win against SMU.

The Bears scored on their first four possessions on their way to a 35-0 halftime lead. Baylor had more TDs (five) than Buffalo had first downs (four) in the first half.

The Bears finished with 669 yards of offense and 27 first downs. Their quick-strike attack was on track with six of nine scoring drives lasting less than two minutes.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 63 points tied the most in a road game in program history -- lost 70-63 at West Virginia in 2012 -- and tied 13th-most in any game in BU history.
- Baylor's 480 passing yards were the 3rd-most in a game in program history.
- Baylor had 3 different 100-yard receivers in the same game for the 2nd time in program history (2012 at West Virginia).
- Senior QB Bryce Petty threw for 416 yards, the 9th-most in a game in Baylor history and the 2nd-most in his career (430 at Kansas in 2013).
- True freshman WR KD Cannon caught an 89-yard TD pass from Petty in the 1st quarter, tying the 3rd-longest pass in program history.

Shock Linwood had three TDs rushing for the Bears, who started 4-0 in back-to-back seasons for the first time in 76 years.

Baylor's first game against a Power 5 school was a bit more difficult than its first three against weaker competition. But the Bears jumped ahead 35-7 late in the second quarter and led by at least 21 points for the entire second half.

The return of receivers **Corey Coleman** (hamstring) and **Antwan Goodley** (quadriceps) made Baylor's offense more explosive than ever. The pair combined for 18 catches, 268 yards and a touchdown.

Shock Linwood ran for 148 yards and the clinching touchdown and No. 7 Baylor overcame a rare off day by quarterback **Bryce Petty** and the nation's No. 1 offense to beat Texas 28-7.

With Petty misfiring, the Bears won with tough defense, two big plays on special teams and a power running game that wore down Texas in the second half.

Terrell Burt scored Baylor's first touchdown with a 62-yard return after a blocked field goal in the first quarter. A fake punt in the third set up Petty's touchdown pass to **Antwan Goodley**. Linwood put it away with a short touchdown run in the fourth.

Texas held Baylor to 390 total yards, but only narrowly avoided its first shutout at home since 1976. Longhorns quarterback Tyrone Swoopes had three turnovers, including a fumble at the Baylor 1 just before halftime.

Baylor was derided for its soft early season schedule, but the defending Big 12 champions improved to 20-2 since knocking off then-No. 2 Kansas State in 2012 to join Oklahoma as the league heavyweights again. The Bears also completely flipped a rivalry the Longhorns mostly dominated the last 100 years, winning four of the last five.

- Baylor held Texas to its lowest point total in the series since the Bears won 50-7 in Austin on Nov. 24, 1989.

Trevone Boykin tossed a sideline fade toward Josh Doctson that was broken up by **Ryan Reid** and Baylor took over with 1:11 left.

Some dominating running by **Shock Linwood** led the Bears to the TCU 11.

Callahan came on with 4 seconds left and booted through the winner, setting off a celebration that brought the bright-yellow clad Baylor student section pouring onto the field to celebrate with their team.

West Virginia sacked Baylor's **Bryce Petty** four times and limited the Bears to one touchdown after halftime. Petty finished 16 of 36 for 223 yards and two scores.

It was hardly the point-a-minute, yard-busting matchup of the past two years, when the winning team each time reached 70 points.

Baylor entered the game as the nation's most prolific offense but was held to 318 yards, 305 below its average and the lowest total of the season.

Shock Linwood scored Baylor's only touchdown of the second half on a 1-yard run with time winding down in the third quarter that tied the score at 27. Linwood, the Big 12's rushing leader, was limited to 69 yards on 21 carries.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 215 penalty yards were the most in school history, breaking the previous record of 157 yards set at Rice in 1976.
- Baylor's 215 penalty yards were also the most ever by a Big 12 Conference team, breaking the previous record of 183 by Texas Tech vs. Rice in 2007.
- Baylor lost for the first time in the Biles era when forcing 3 or more turnovers -- the Bears are now 17-1 in those games.

Bryce Petty had three touchdown passes, including two to **Corey Coleman**, and No. 12 Baylor scored on 11 straight possessions despite looking sluggish at times in a 60-14 victory over Kansas.

Baylor had to settle for field goals after two of three first-half fumbles by the Jayhawks deep in their territory, but still rolled up 669 yards in their 14th straight home victory in the 91st homecoming game.

Coleman had a career-high 167 yards receiving and TDs of 72 and 49 yards, the latter putting the Bears up 46-7 early in the third quarter.

Kansas had 0 yards rushing at halftime in its 31st straight loss away from home and 28th in a row in a true road game since winning at UTEP in 2009.

Devin Chafin had a career-high 112 yards rushing and two touchdowns, and Big 12 rushing leader **Shock Linwood** finished with 81 yards and a leaping score from the 1.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor and Kansas met for the 14th time -- the Bears now lead the all-time series 10-4, including a 7-0 mark in games played in Waco.

Corey Coleman set career highs of 15 catches and 224 yards to help No. 10 Baylor roll past No. 16 Oklahoma 48-14 in Norman.

It was the most receptions ever by a player against the Sooners. Coleman also caught a touchdown pass and ran for another score as the Bears maintained their conference and national title hopes.

Bryce Petty, who repeatedly said he was "ready for OU" after the win over Kansas the week before, proved it by completing 32 of 42 passes for 387 yards and a touchdown. It was Baylor's first road win in 12 tries against the Sooners, and the Bears' first road win against a ranked team since Art Briles took over as head coach in 2008.

Baylor has won three of the past four meetings with the Sooners after losing the first 20. The Bears defeated the Sooners 41-12 last year in Waco.

Baylor took a 3-0 lead, but Oklahoma responded with two TD drives. Baylor then scored the next 45 points.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor snapped a 37-game losing streak in road games against ranked opponents. The Bears' last win in those games was Nov. 2, 1991, when the Bears beat No. 24 Arkansas, 9-5. Today's starting quarterback Bryce Petty was 5 months old when that happened.
- Baylor also snapped an 18-game losing streak in the state of Oklahoma: BU's last previous win in Oklahoma was Sept. 2, 1995, a 37-5 victory at Tulsa.
- Baylor handed Oklahoma just its 7th loss in Norman during the Bob Stoops era (89-7).
- Baylor's 34-point victory was the largest by a visiting team in Norman during the Stoops-era. The only other double-digit victor was Notre Dame (17-point win) in 2012, and the 6 previous losses in the Stoops era came by a combined 36 points.

Bryce Petty threw for 210 yards and two touchdowns and playoff hopeful Baylor held on for a 48-46 victory over Texas Tech.

Shock Linwood ran for 158 yards and two touchdowns for the fifth-ranked Bears, who after their usual offensive shootout with Texas Tech set up a Big 12 title game the following week.

Petty was hurt midway through the third quarter after taking a high hit from linebacker Sam Eguavoen, who was penalized for a personal foul. Baylor officials called it a "mild concussion." Petty was back on the sideline before the end of the third quarter, still wearing his uniform but without his shoulder pads and helmet. Seth Russell took over for Petty, and six plays later threw a 27-yard touchdown pass to Levi Norwood to make it 42-17.

The teams traded field goals before Texas Tech scored 20 unanswered points, on three long touchdown passes by Patrick Mahomes. After DeAndre Washington turned a short pass into a 49-yard TD with 8:13 left, the Red Raiders were within 45-40 after a failed two-point try.

Baylor then went 56 yards on 13 plays for Chris Callahan's 36-yard field goal that proved to be the difference.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor and Texas Tech met for 73rd time and the series stands 36-36-1.
- BU and TTU played the 6th installment of the Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Shootout (4-1 at AT&T Stadium and 0-1 at Cotton Bowl) and BU has won the last 4 meetings to hold a 4-2 edge.
- Baylor won its 4th straight game vs. TTU for the first time since 1984-87 (4 in a row).
- The last time Baylor forced 4 turnovers in a game was at TCU, Nov. 30, 2013 (won 41-38).

Bryce Petty threw for 412 yards, Johnny Jefferson had two touchdown runs and fifth-ranked Baylor claimed a share of its second consecutive Big 12 title with a 38-27 win over ninth-ranked Kansas State.

Despite closing the season with five straight wins, the Bears were left out of the four-team playoff.

Petty completed 34 of 40 passes with a touchdown and an interception, a week after getting knocked out of the Bears' last game with a concussion.

Antwan Goodley had nine catches for 116 yards as Baylor won its 16th consecutive home game, matching Alabama for the nation's longest streak. The Bears are 6-0 in their new stadium even after scoring fewer than 45 points there for the first time.

Baylor improved to 8-0 in home games vs. AP Top 25 opponents since 2011.

- Baylor earned a share of the Big 12 championship for the second time ever and second straight year -- the first time BU has ever won a conference title in two straight years and the program's eighth all-time conference title (6 in Southwest Conference, 2 in Big 12).
