NOTING THE PACK

GETTING IT DOEREN



DAVE DOEREN WON BACK-TO-BACK MAC CHAMPIONSHIPS AT NORTHERN ILLINOIS.

At 41, Wolfpack head coach Dave Doeren is the youngest head coach in the Atlantic Coast Conference. But in the past two seasons, he's posted numbers that no other league coach can match.

In fact, with his 23-4 record as a head coach, he trails only Alabama's Nick Saban in victories since the beginning of the 2011 season among active coaches. The 2012 Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award finalist, who has never lost a home game as a head coach, is tied with four other coaches with that victory tally.

There will competition at many positions when State opens its first fall camp with Dave Doeren at the helm of the program. One of the most visible will be at the quarterback spot. Two scholarship players competed for the spot during spring

drills, but two more will be in the mix when fall camp opens in August.

That position has been in pretty good hands for the Wolfpack over the past five seasons, as Russell Wilson (now with the Seattle Seahawks) held the job down from 2008-10 and Mike Glennon, who was drafted by the Tampa Bay Bucs in April, was the starter in 2011 and 2012.

Sophomore Manny Stocker and redshirt junior Pete Thomas, who sat out last season after transferring from Colorado State, have very different reputations. Stocker is known as a read quarterback and Thomas is more of a traditional pocket passer. Thomas finished spring practice ahead in the QB race.

Stocker saw action in five games as Glennon's backup last season, attempting just two passes and rushing the ball six times. He showed flashes of his running ability in the Pack's win over Wake Forest, carrying the ball three times for 32 yards.

Thomas certainly has more experience, as he started two seasons for the Rams. Known for his strong arm, he threw for 4,269 yards and 18 touchdowns, while completing 63.5 percent of his passes.

In fall camp, those two should compete with two newcomers - one true freshman and one graduate student. Signee Bryant Shirreffs accounted for 7,677 yards of offense and 90 touchdowns in his three years as a starter in high school. Brandon Mitchell, who earned his degree from Arkansas, will spend his last year of eligibility at State. The Amite, La., native played in 21 games for the Razorbacks.

Junior Jacoby Brissett practiced with the team this spring but will not be eligible to compete this fall after transferring from Florida in January.

NO ROAMING CHARGES

The Wolfpack won't have to wander very far from its home den during the 2013 football season, as NC State will play eight games in Carter-Finley Stadium and two others in the state of North Carolina. The Pack won't have to play a game outside of its home state until Oct. 26, when the squad heads to Florida State.


The only other game played outside North Carolina will be the Boston College contest on Nov. 16.

RUNNING IS BACK


Although half of last year's starters are no longer on the Wolfpack squad, the Pack does return 86 percent of its rushing total from a year ago. Leading rusher Shadrach Thornton, whose 694 yards led the team last year and ranked fourth in the ACC, is back for his sophomore campaign. Tony Creecy, who ranked second on the squad with 476 rushing yards, also returns.

If the stats of the teams that the Pack's offensive coaches led last season are any indication, NC State needs all the returning rushing yards it can get. Dave Doeren's Northern Illinois squad rushed for 3,335 yards in 2012, while offensive coordinator Matt Canada ran the Wisconsin offense that tallied 3,309 yards a year ago. Every member of the current Wolfpack offensive staff hailed from one of those two programs with the exception of Des Kitchings - who coached for the Pack in 2012.



Three former Wolfpack linebackers are playing a role on the Dave Doeren's inaugural NC State staff. Clayton White, a three-year starter for the Pack from 1998-2000, now serves as the safeties coach and co-special teams coordinator for his alma mater. White, who went on to play in the NFL for three seasons, has also coached on the staffs at Western Carolina, Western Michigan, Stanford, Western Kentucky and Connecticut.

Dantonio "Thunder Dan" Burnette, has returned to State as an assistant strength

and conditioning coach after spending a season on the staff at Pitt. Burnette, a 2002 All-ACC performer, is tied for second in career tackles in the Wolfpack record book with 476 and holds the school record with seven recovered fumbles.

Also working in the weight room is Sterling Lucas, who served as a team captain last season and is now a graduate assistant on Jason Veltkamp's strength and conditioning staff. Lucas suffered what many believed would be a career-ending injury in 2011, but defied the odds to come back and start every game last season.

I've been a co-coordinator, a recruiting coordinator, a head coach at a mid-major and now I'm standing here in the ACC and I'm jacked up about it."

Dave Doeren, Dec. 2, 2012

When Dave Doeren was first introduced as head football coach to Wolfpack Nation at a press conference on Dec. 2, 2012, his opening statement concisely told the story of who he is and what he stands for - providing an accurate snapshot of Dave Doeren the football coach and Dave Doeren the man. In those few short sentences, he displayed the attributes that made him NC State's first choice when it came time to find the 34th coach in program history: his experience, his work ethic and his passion.

A VARIETY OF EXPERIENCES

As he stated on that December afternoon, the 41-year-old Doeren has packed a lifetime's worth of coaching experience into just 19 years. He comes to NC State after leading the program at Northern Illinois to its most successful two years in program history. His first Husky squad won the school's first Mid-American Conference Championship since 1983 and tied the school record with 11 wins. His second version repeated as league champions and set a new school record by posting 12 victories for the season and earning a trip to the Orange Bowl - the first BCS berth ever for a MAC school. Doeren was a finalist for several national coach of the year awards following the 2012 campaign.

Under Doeren's leadership, NIU boasted the nation's longest conference winning streak with 17 straight victories over MAC opponents. The Huskies never lost a home game during his tenure in DeKalb, winning a dozen home contests in the past two seasons to extend the nation's longest home winning streak to 21 games.

During his two years at NIU, eight players earned all-conference accolades, and one of his quarterbacks won the MAC's Vern Smith Leadership Award - given to the league's MVP - each season. The Huskies' Academic Progress Rate (APR) ranked among the top five nationally as well.

Northern Illinois was the only school in the nation to have a player win the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Award in both 2011 and 2012. Additionally, Northern Illinois joined Duke, Penn State and Nebraska as one of only four schools in the country to place four players on the 2012 Capital One Academic All-District Team for its region.

The Shawnee Mission, Kansas, native posted a 23-4 overall record with a 17-1 mark against MAC opponents during his time at NIU. His prolific offense scored 40 points or more 16 times in 27 games. In 2012 alone, the program averaged 40.8 points per game during the regular season and ranked in the Top 15 nationally in fourth down conversions (2nd), rushing offense (9th), scoring offense (10th), 3rd down conversions (15th), and total offense (15th).

Prior to his stint in DeKalb, Doeren spent five seasons in the Big Ten at Wisconsin, where he served as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. During Doeren's time in Madison, the Badgers posted a 49-15 overall mark and played in the Champs Sports Bowl twice, the Outback Bowl, the Capital One Bowl and the Rose Bowl.

For his first two seasons in Madison, he served as co-defensive coordinator/recruiting coordinator/linebackers coach and in 2008, was named the primary defensive coordinator. His UW defenses were consistently ranked in the top 25 in NCAA defensive categories. In 2010, Wisconsin ranked 20th in total defense and in the top 30 in both rushing and scoring defense. In 2009, the Badgers led the Big Ten and ranked fifth in the country in rushing defense, holding each of their last 10 opponents to less than 100 yards rushing - the longest streak in school history. Wisconsin led the nation in pass efficiency defense in 2006 and was the No. 2 scoring defense in the country.

His pupils at Wisconsin included National Football League linebackers Jonathan

Casillas of the New Orleans Saints and DeAndre Levy, the Detroit Lions' middle linebacker. Badgers' linebacker Chris Borland earned 2009 Big Ten Defensive Freshman of the Year honors.

Doeren arrived at Wisconsin after four seasons (2002-05) at the University of Kansas, where he served as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator for three seasons before being promoted to co-defensive coordinator under head coach Mark Mangino. The Jayhawks led the Big 12 and ranked No. 3 nationally in rushing defense and No. 11 nationally in total defense in 2005.

During Doeren's time at Kansas, the Jayhawks ended a seven-year bowl drought, earning bids to the 2003 Tangerine Bowl and the 2005 Ft. Worth Bowl. The opponent in that first bowl appearance was a Philip Rivers-led NC State team. At his introductory press conference at NC State, Doeren recalled how the passion of the Wolfpack fan base made an impression on him then that he never forgot, 10 years before he was named the Pack's head coach.

He coached Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year Nick Reid, who was also a third-team All-American, and four of his players won academic all-conference honors.

In 2000 and 2001, Doeren coached the secondary at NCAA Division I-AA (now Football Championship Subdivision) powerhouse Montana, also serving as the Grizzlies' recruiting coordinator for one year.

Montana advanced to the the I-AA national championship game in 2000, losing by two points, but returned to win the national title the following season. The Grizzlies posted a 28-3 record and won two Big Sky Conference championships in his two years with the program and he coached five All-Americans, four All-Big Sky performers and two league defensive MVPs.

"Lined the fields and driven the bus"

Doeren grew up right outside of Kansas City, where he was a big fan of the Royals' George Brett and the Chiefs' Dino Hackett. He also grew up watching his grandfather, Thomas Glennon, coach high school basketball and track. He loved the respect his grandfather commanded from his players, even after he retired from coaching.

When he left for college at Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa, his goals were to play football, earn a pre-med degree, go to med school and become an orthopedic doctor. He accomplished the first two.

He lettered at tight end for the Bulldogs, catching 19 catches for 237 yards for his career. He majored in pre-medical biology, earning Academic All-America honors as a senior. He took the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT). His plans for the future changed, however, during the summer between his junior and senior

years when his former coach at Bishop Miege High School asked him to lead seven-on-seven drills.

"It was the most fun three hours of my life," he remembered. "I knew from that moment I was going to be a coach. I didn't know how long it would take, but I knew it was what I wanted to do."

Doeren has pursued that goal with a relentlessness that has never wavered. Instead of heading to med school, he landed his first coaching job in 1994, right there in Kansas at Shawnee Mission High School.

His collegiate coaching career began just a year later, when he was named an assistant coach at Drake, leading the linebackers from 1995-97 before adding defensive coordinator chores in 1997. He had one of his players earn All-Pioneer League honors two of his three years on his alma mater's staff.

Doeren got his first taste of a bowl experience as a defensive graduate assistant at the University of Southern California when the Trojans played in the 1998 Sun Bowl. The Trojans led the nation in interceptions that year with 24, while the 1999 squad led the nation in turnover margin. Doeren earned a Master's degree in educational leadership from USC.

"I'm fired up about it"

Anyone who watched Northern Illinois' double-overtime victory over Kent State in the 2012 MAC Championship game on Nov. 30, 2012, saw a head coach on the Husky sideline who was all in. On Friday night, he led his squad to that 44-37 victory, celebrated with his team as it received the league championship trophy and then boarded a bus for the all-night ride back from Detroit to DeKalb.

Just a couple of hours later, Wolfpack Director of Athletics Debbie Yow was waiting to talk to him about becoming the Wolfpack's next head coach. By Sunday

afternoon, he was decked out in Wolfpack gear, with all of his attention turned to his new squad as he watched the team's first bowl practice in Raleigh and began to assess recruiting needs.

"It was a crazy 48 hours for us," he recalled. "We were in a double-overtime game and then woke up with a great opportunity."

While his former team was celebrating its unprecedented bid to the Orange Bowl, Doeren was standing in front of the NC State media, talking about why he had no regrets.

"I had a great job," Doeren, the youngest football coach in the ACC, said. "I wasn't going to leave for a place that wasn't special and I felt that way about NC State."

In his first few weeks as the leader of the Pack, Doeren recruited and hired a staff, audited several practices, called every prospect who had already committed to

NC State and met with his returning players. His new staff was relentless on the recruiting trail, bringing in a class that fit the program's needs under his new system.

When Doeren met with his new team on the day he was introduced to the NC State community, he told them, "You didn't pick me, I picked you. I love what I do and I'm all in."

He also told his new charges to expect to his other great passion around the program frequently: his family. Doeren met his wife Sara while he was coaching at Drake and she was a nursing student. The couple has three sons: Jacob (14), Luke (11) and Connor (7).

Canada's quarterbacks at Indiana (Ben Chappell, Kellen Lewis and Blake Powers) hold the top three spots in single season touchdowns, yards, completions, attempts and completion percentage. 









At NC State: A two-time All-American, Roman Gabriel starred at quarterback for NC State in the early 1960s and finished his career holding virtually every Wolfpack passing record. An academic All-American, Gabriel saw his jersey retired and presented to him by Governor Terry Sanford on Jan. 20, 1962 at halftime of an NC State-Maryland basketball game in Reynolds Coliseum. A first-round draft pick by the Los Angeles Rams, he went on to a distinguished professional career.

In the Professional Ranks:

Gabriel played 15 seasons in the NFL, splitting time with the Los Angeles Rams (1962-72) and the Philadelphia Eagles (1973-77). He was named the NFL's Most Valuable Player in 1969 and earned Pro Bowl spots in 1967, 1968, 1969 and 1970. He was the MVP of the 1970 Pro Bowl. He ranked as the Rams' all-time passing leader with 22,223 yards and 154 touchdowns (1,705 com./3,313 att.) and threw for 7,221 yards and 45 touchdowns (661 com./1,185 att.) with the Eagles. In 1973, he led the NFL with 3,219 yards and 23 touchdown passes. He still holds the Rams' career records for: touchdown passes (154), passing yards (22,223), passes attempted (3,313), and passes completed (1,705). Gabriel was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1989.

At NC State: Jim Ritcher is one of three Atlantic Coast Conference players to win the Outland Trophy, awarded annually to the nation's premier lineman. A two-time consensus All-American, Ritcher won the award as a Wolfpack senior in 1979, when he literally cleared the way for NC State to win the ACC Championship. Still an active member of the Wolfpack family, Ritcher, whose sons John and Harrison both played for NC State, thrived in the NFL for 16 years, playing in four Super Bowls with the Buffalo Bills. Ritcher's No. 51 was retired on Feb. 8, 1987. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1998.

In the Professional Ranks: A first-round draft choice in 1980, Ritcher went on to play 16 seasons in the NFL, splitting time with the Buffalo Bills (1980-93) and the Atlanta Falcons (1994-95). An All-Pro choice in 1986, 1988, and 1990, Ritcher played in the 1992 and 1993 Pro Bowls. He also played in four Super Bowls with Buffalo and played in more games than any other Buffalo Bill (225). He was inducted into the Buffalo Hall of Fame in 2005 and was the recipient of the Gerald R. Ford Legends Award in 2009.

At NC State: Scoring all 29 of NC State's points, Dick Christy earned the Wolfpack its first Atlantic Coast Conference Championship in a 29-26 win in the Pack's season-finale at South Carolina on Nov. 23, 1957. Christy earned first team All-America recognition from the Associated Press and United Press International for his efforts that season. He ended his career in '57 holding 14 NC State records and four ACC records. Nearly 40 years later, Christy's jersey was retired on Nov. 8, 1997 in a game against Maryland. He died in a car accident in 1965 and was named to the ACC's Silver Anniversary Team in 1978.

In the Professional Ranks: Christy played five seasons in the NFL, splitting time with the Pittsburgh Steelers (1958), Boston Patriots (1960) and the New York Titans (1961-63). He was selected to play in the 1962 AFL All-Star game and led the AFL and NFL in punt returns in 1961 and 1962 with 21.3 and 16.7 yards per return, respectively. In 1962, he was named his team's MVP, when he led the squad in rushing, punt returns and kickoff returns.

At NC State: Ted Brown is inarguably the greatest running back to play for NC State, if not in the Atlantic Coast Conference. A native of High Point, N.C., Brown rushed for a school and ACC record 4,602 yards from 1975-78. He scored 51 touchdowns during his career, which stood as the top mark in ACC history until 2005. His jersey was retired during pregame ceremonies prior to his final home game on Nov. 18, 1978 against Duke. He was a first-round draft pick of the Minnesota Vikings where he enjoyed an all-star career.

In the Professional Ranks:

Brown starred for eight seasons in the NFL as a member of the Minnesota Vikings squad from 1979-86. He scored 53 career touchdowns (40 rushing and 13 receiving), the fifth-best mark in Viking history. His 4,546 career rushing yards ranks third in the history of that franchise.

At NC State: Torry Holt was a human highlight film for NC State from 1995-98, and culminated his career by being named a consensus All-American. Holt rewrote the Wolfpack record books, setting single game, single season and career records in almost every passing category. He also set an ACC record with 3,379 reception yards for his career. The two-time All-ACC performer was named the ACC Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year following his senior campaign, and was also a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award, honoring the nation's top wide receiver. His jersey was retired on Jan. 16, 1999 during halftime ceremonies of the final NC State-UNC basketball contest that was played in Reynolds Coliseum.

In the Professional Ranks: Holt was a first-round draft pick of the Saint Louis Rams in 1999, the sixth selection overall, and made the Pro Bowl seven times. He won a Super Bowl ring during his rookie campaign, and in the process set Super Bowl rookie records with seven catches and 109 receiving yards. He was the first player in NFL history to record five straight seasons with 1,300 receiving yards, and he was the fifth-fastest in NFL history to 5,000 yards and fourth-fastest to 500 career receptions. Holt played with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2009 and the New England Patriots in 2010 before announcing his retirement. He now serves as an analyst for the NFL Network.

At NC State: Dennis Byrd was a dominating presence for the Wolfpack's famed "White Shoes" defense, competing on the defensive line for NC State from 1965-67. An adept pass rusher who combined size, agility, strength and a desire for hitting, Byrd was the Pack's first consensus All-American, earning honors in 1967. He was also the first three-time All-ACC player in league history, earning accolades all three years that he lettered. As a junior, he led the voting for All-ACC lineman and after his senior campaign, participated in four college all-star games. Byrd, who passed away in July of 2010, was inducted into the National Football Foundation's Hall of Fame in December of that year.

In the Professional Ranks: Byrd was a first-round draft pick of the Boston Patriots of the American Football League in 1968.

At NC State: A consensus All-American guard, Bill Yoest lettered for the Wolfpack from 1970-73 and was the recipient of the 1973 Jacobs Blocking Trophy. A Pittsburgh native, Yoest won All-America honors from the Associated Press, UPI, Football Writers, Football Coaches, NEA and Walter Camp that season. Yoest was selected for two postseason all-star games, the '74 Hula Bowl and the East-West Shrine Game, in which he was elected co-captain of the East squad. His No. 63 was retired at halftime of the North Carolina game, Sept. 27, 2003.

In the Professional Ranks: Yoest played a short stint with the Orlando Blazers of the World Football League and then returned to Raleigh, where he started a financial services business.

At NC State: The 2003 ACC Player of the Year, Philip Rivers started all 51 games at quarterback for the Wolfpack over his four years, an NCAA record. Rivers rewrote the record books for both NC State and the ACC in every passing and total offense category. Rivers ended up the second-leading passer in NCAA history with 13,494 career passing yards and 13,582 career yards of total offense and finished tied for fifth in NCAA history with 95 career TD passes. The Athens, Ala., native capped off his marvelous career with a stellar senior season in which Rivers led the nation with a 72.0 completion percentage and 170.49 pass efficiency rating. Rivers became the first QB in ACC history and only the seventh in NCAA history to throw for 3,000 yards in three different seasons. The MVP of the 2003 Tangerine Bowl with his fifth 400-yard passing day of the year, Rivers was also named the MVP of the Senior Bowl. His jersey, number 17, was retired before his final home game, Nov. 22, 2003.

In the Professional Ranks: A first-round draft choice, Rivers was selected by the New York Giants with the fourth pick of the 2004 NFL Draft and was traded to the San Diego Chargers minutes later. He has been selected to the Pro Bowl four times.

A Campbell, Ohio, native, Sabol became the Pack's starting center as a sophomore in 1933. The 6-0, 190-pounder played every snap in eight of State College's nine contests that season, sitting out just one quarter: the final period in a rout of Catawba. He was a three-time All-Southern Conference selection (1933-35) during his career.

At 220 pounds, Elmer Costa was touted as the heaviest player on the Wolfpack squad in the late 40s. A two-time All-Southern Conference honoree, he helped the Pack earn a huge upset versus Maryland in 1950 in NC State's first televised game. He was named the AP's National Lineman of the Week for that performance.

DICK CHRISTY, HB



1957 - Associated Press (1st); UPI (1st)

Dick Christy starred on the freshman squad in 1954, advancing to the varsity the following year. At 5-10, 190 pounds, he led the team in rushing with 602 yards that season, and then ran for 589 yards, threw for 123 yards and returned kickoffs and touchdowns in 1956. He will always be remembered for scoring all 29 points in NC State's ACC Title-clinching 29-26 win over South Carolina in 1957. He was named the ACC Player of the Year and ACC Athlete of the Year as a senior.



At 6-4, 200 pounds, Roman Gabriel began his collegiate career as a star in the defensive secondary as well as being the Wolfpack signal caller. The Wilmington, N.C., native was tabbed as the National Sophomore Back of the Year by The Saturday Evening Post and Playboy prior to his sophomore campaign. He didn't disappoint, leading the NCAA in completion percentage with a school record .604 in 1959. He threw for a then-school record 2,951 yards passing for his career, including 19 touchdowns. He ranked eighth nationally in total offense in 1960 and 14th during his senior campaign. He was named the ACC Player of the Year in 1960 and 1961 and was a 1960 Academic All-American. He went on to a spectacular professional career, earning four trips to the Pro Bowl and being named the NFL's MVP in 1969.

After redshirting in 1971, he regained his starter's position and was an All-ACC honoree as a junior. In addition to being named a consensus All-American in 1973, he also won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy for the ACC.

**STAN FRITTS, FB**

1974 - Associated Press (2nd)

An Oak Ridge, Tenn., native, Stan Fritts tallied an ACC record 42 touchdowns during his career at State, despite his 6-0, 165 pound frame. He also set what was then a school rushing record with 2,542 yards. He was an All-ACC performer as a sophomore and senior and was a 1973 Academic All-American.



DR. RANDY WOODSON

Dr. Randy Woodson is the 14th chancellor of North Carolina State University. A nationally recognized leader in bridging the gap between vision and action, he has led the development and implementation of the university's strategic plan to improve student success, faculty excellence, and engagement and economic development. In addition to this transformative plan, Woodson has led a strategic realignment to mold the university for greater efficiency and effectiveness in the face of decreasing resources. His reputation for consensus-building has given voice to a diverse university community, creating opportunities for multi-disciplinary collaboration and unifying university constituents to focus on enhancing student success and the value of an NC State degree. These shifts will continue to guide the university as it unites and adapts a cherished tradition with the constantly evolving landscape of higher education.

During his tenure Woodson has overseen the largest private

of Arkansas and a M.S. and Ph.D. in Plant Physiology from Cornell University. He joined the Purdue faculty in 1985 as an assistant professor in the Department of Horticulture. His research has covered topics such as plant genetics, molecular biology, biotechnology and sustainable bioproducts development, spanning the gap between the detailed science of plant physiology and the practical application of this knowledge in the field of horticulture. His research has been



gift in university history. Through the creation of the Faculty Excellence Fund Woodson has inspired inventive faculty research rewarding creativity and entrepreneurship. Under his leadership, NC State remains the 3rd best value among public universities in the U.S. and, according to a Wall Street Journal study, ranks 19th overall by recruiters for nearly 500 public and private corporations, non-profits and federal agencies across the nation.

Woodson arrived at NC State from Purdue University, where he served as executive vice president for academic affairs and provost. He took on the role of provost in 2008, after serving nearly four years as the Glenn W. Sample Dean of Agriculture. Prior to that, Woodson was the associate dean of agriculture and director of the Office of Agricultural Research Programs at Purdue from 1998 to 2004.

Woodson's career has been shaped by the land-grant university system, receiving a B.S. in Horticulture from the University

When Deborah A. Yow was hired to be NC State's director of athletics on June 25, 2010, her goal was to make the department she inherited one of the best in the nation.

In three short years, she has taken many steps to accomplish that goal. She has re-engineered and transformed the department, from revamping the department's coaching and administrative personnel; to increasing its annual budget by nearly two-thirds, significantly increasing revenues from all sources; to upgrading the school's athletic facilities.

Through her leadership, the Wolfpack's program of 23 varsity sports has made remarkable improvement in its national standing in the NACDA Director's Cup, a measure of competitive accomplishments for all NCAA varsity sports. From 2010-12, the school made the biggest single jump of any ACC school in the 20-year history of the rankings, improving from No. 89 to No. 37. In 2013, NC State moved up No. 34, as a record 18 sports were represented in postseason play.

All eight of NC State's spring teams qualified for postseason play in 2013, with baseball hosting an NCAA Super Regional for the first time ever and advancing to the College World Series and softball winning the ACC championship and participating in an NCAA Regional for just the third time in school history.

NC State was one of only three NCAA institutions in the nation to have its football team go to a bowl game, its men's basketball team go to the NCAA Championship and its baseball team go to the College World Series. A record number of student-athletes graduated in the spring of 2012 and NC State had more than 100 ACC All-Academic honorees the last two years.

The Wolfpack clearly has embraced Yow's comprehensive and energized vision for the future of the department, which has rallied under its trademark motto: "Wolfpack Unlimited: Refuse To Accept the Status Quo."

Yow's expectations are clear and concise:

- Every sport with a full complement of scholarships should be among the nation's top 25, working towards the top 10 and competing for conference and national championships.
- Every student-athlete should be provided the opportunity and resources to be as successful in the classroom as on the field of competition.
- Every alumnus and supporter should be treated as a valued customer, with dedicated service from athletics department personnel.

In her first three years on the job, Yow has made significant changes to the structure, branding and outcomes of the athletics department.

She has hired eight new head coaches: men's basketball coach Mark Gottfried, men's soccer coach Kelly Findley, women's soccer coach Tim Santoro, men's and women's swimming coach Braden Holloway (a former NC State swimmer), wrestling coach Pat Popolizio, softball coach Shawn Rychcik, football coach Dave Doeren and most recently women's basketball coach Wes Moore.

These new coaches are beginning to accomplish extraordinary things in recruiting and in NCAA competition. Gottfried has led the men's basketball program two NCAA Championships in his first two seasons, including a Sweet Sixteen appearance. Holloway was named the 2013 ACC Coach of the Year after leading the men's swimming team to a No. 15 finish at the NCAA championship, its highest since 1978-79, and the team was named the national "Breakout Team of the Season" in the prestigious College Swimming and Diving Honors Program. Rychcik, in his first season, guided the Wolfpack softball team to the ACC title and an NCAA regional championship game appearance. Popolizio signed the No. 4 recruiting class nationally in his first season.

She also brought in nationally renowned Bob Alejo to serve as the director of the strength and conditioning programs for all student-athletes.

Senior administration has been geared to oversee the implementation of her vision for the Wolfpack's future success. She has also helped change the face of NC State athletics with overall improvements and upgrades to administrative and competitive facilities on campus.

The department has established Wolfpack Sports Properties in a new working agreement for multi-media rights with Learfield Communications and Capital Broadcasting Co.; a department-

wide apparel agreement with Adidas Sports; and a new Five-Year Strategic Plan. She also led in the creation of the comprehensive NC State Athletics Hall of Fame, which inducted 10 members in its inaugural class in 2012 and added another 10 members for 2013.

Yow has made it clear to her coaches and staff they will be provided with the resources they need to be competitive at the highest level of college athletics. She has also made clear her expectations for excellence in all 23 varsity programs at the institution.

Yow knows the importance of her position, leading the gateway department of the largest university in North Carolina. The ACC's first female athletics director also knows NC State's reputation as a pioneering program that first established basketball as a dominant sport in the South, was the first to integrate varsity athletics in the Atlantic Coast Conference and was the first public school in the state to dedicate full resources to women's athletics.

Hardly unfamiliar to Wolfpack fans, the native of Gibsonville, N.C., has been deeply connected to NC State since her youth, when her parents Hilton and Lib Yow introduced their three daughters and one son to college athletics. At the time, that meant legendary basketball coach Everett Case's fast-breaking style that dominated the early days of ACC basketball.

Later, she watched her older sister, Kay, become the first full-time women's coach in the state of North Carolina, when she was hired by then-athletics director Willis Casey to coach NC State's first three women's sports: basketball, volleyball and softball. Her first all-star, and the first women's All-American in NC State history, was the youngest of the Yow sisters, Susan.

Yow served as a high school coach at Burlington's Williams High School and Gibsonville's Eastern Guilford High before becoming the women's basketball coach at the University of Kentucky. She also served as the head coach at Oral Roberts University and the University of Florida, before switching career paths to become an administrator, at both Florida and UNC Greensboro. In 1990, she was named the athletics director at Saint Louis, where she hired Charlie Spoonhour as men's basketball coach. In his first season, Spoonhour was named ESPN National Coach of the Year.

She moved to the University of Maryland in 1994 and in 2000 selected Ralph Friedgen as football coach. Friedgen was named consensus National Coach of the Year in 2001 after leading the Terps to the ACC championship and an appearance in the Orange Bowl. In 2002, she brought in Brenda Frese, the 2002 Big Ten and AP National Coach of the Year, to guide the Terrapin women's basketball program. In 2006, Frese led Maryland to the NCAA championship.

Under her leadership, Maryland's 27 varsity programs won a remarkable 20 national championships and consistently graduated student-athletes, including an all-time high federal graduation rate of 80 percent. In 2009, the NCAA News named Maryland as one of the Top 10 athletics programs in the nation.

At NC State, Yow oversees a department with 23 sports that includes approximately 185 full-time staff and 525 student-athletes.

Yow has served as president of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and the national Division I-A Athletic Directors Association. She is a member of the National Football Foundation board of directors, as well as the USA Football board of directors and has served on the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Academic Enhancement Committee, as well as having represented the ACC on the NCAA Management Council.

Both Street and Smith's Sports Business Journal and the Chronicle of Higher Education have cited Yow as being one of the 20 most influential people in college athletics. She was selected to serve on the President's U.S. Department of Education Commission on Opportunities in Athletics to review the status of Federal Title IX regulations. She earlier served as the chair of the Atlantic Coast Conference Committee on Television, which is charged with overseeing the league's TV contracts and other related broadcast issues.

Like her older sister, Yow has been inducted into the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame.

Yow has written numerous articles and books on athletics management and human behavior. She holds a bachelor's degree from Elon University and a master's degree from Liberty University. She also has been awarded honorary doctorates for professional achievement from Elon, Liberty and the United States Sports Academy. She is married to Dr. William W. Bowden.



One of the landmarks of North Carolina's capital city, Carter-Finley Stadium has gained a national reputation as being one of the toughest places to play. In the past three seasons, NC State has lost just three games on its home field, a testament to the rabid fans who look forward year-round to seeing their Wolfpack play.

In its 48th year of existence, Carter-Finley Stadium boasts 57,583 permanent seats and is surrounded by acres convenient parking. The south end zone is the home of the 103,254 square-foot Murphy Center, which is unequalled in its design for the training and preparation of athletes.

The Wolfpack squad practices just a stone's throw away at the Dail Practice Complex. This area covers seven acres and boasts three full fields, a training room, restrooms and a video/coaching tower.

The A.E. Finley Fieldhouse in the north end zone houses two spacious, state-of-the-art locker rooms that can be divided into smaller locker rooms when NC State plays host to high school championship games. There are also halftime locker room areas for the cheerleaders, the dance team, game referees and coaches.

Rising above the fieldhouse is the 100'x40' HD scoreboard.

C. RICHARD VAUGHN TOWERS

Vaughn Towers dominates the skyline around Carter-Finley Stadium as it rises above the west stands. The 117,000 square-foot structure, which stretches from endzone to endzone, includes four levels, 51 private luxury suites and 955 club seats, as well as a University Suite for the Chancellor. The state-of-the-art facility also includes accommodations for the media, with 112 press seats.

The facility is named for Richard Vaughn, a resident of Mount Airy, who graduated from NC State with a degree in nuclear engineering.


WAYNE T. DAY FAMILY FIELD:

Named for Wolfpack alumnus Wayne T. Day in 2002, the playing surface at Carter-Finley Stadium was reconstructed in 2009. The new playing surface is built to USGA specifications for a golf green. The USGA specification has an elaborate drainage system and a 10" rootzone mix that is 90% sand and 10% peat. The field has Tifway 419 hybrid bermudagrass from Sandhills turf farm in North Carolina. The irrigation system consists of 6 "big gun" sprinklers that spray over 200 gallons per minute. The water source is well water that is contained in tanks

THE
WENDELL H. MURPHY
FOOTBALL CENTER



The 103,254-square-foot Wendell H. Murphy Center houses every aspect of Wolfpack football, from sports medicine, to equipment, to strength training, to academics. As functional as it is aesthetically pleasing, the Murphy Center is definitely the Wolfpack's den.

The Murphy Center (known as "The Murph" to the Wolfpack players) is among the largest operations facilities in the country devoted solely to football. Visitors enter the building through Gant Plaza, where the 28' "Wolfpack Turf" statue and fountain stands proudly. The center is open year round during the week from 8am-5pm for visitors, with tours available by contacting the athletic department in advance.

Visitors to the Murphy Center can experience the rich heritage of Wolfpack Football in the Finley Hall of Champions. This multimedia complex highlights NC State's football tradition with photos, artifacts and interactive exhibits. Fans can watch video highlights in the Woolard Theater and younger Wolfpackers can have fun

in the Junior Wolfpack Zone.

From the lobby, double doors open into the massive Gunter Family strength training facility, which runs the entire length of the building and covers 15,000 square-feet. The facility houses a track, a nutrition center, a large turf room and over 15 tons of weights.

The third floor of the Murphy Center houses a large dining room and a players' lounge that overlooks Wayne Day Family Field. The lounge contains couches, pool tables, ping-pong tables, wide-screen TVs and video games for the Wolfpack players to enjoy during breaks.

A large team meeting room and meeting rooms for each position are also on the third floor. Each room is equipped with the latest video playback equipment for reviewing film and breaking down an athlete's performance. That level also houses offices for the Wolfpack's academic advisors, as well as a large study room with computers in the Kirkland Academic Suite.

On the fourth floor, the coaches' offices, a large staff conference room, offensive and defensive meeting rooms, a television studio and the video production offices can be found.

The heartbeat of the Murphy Center is on the bottom floor. The beautiful locker room stretches the length of the building on one side of the hall, boasting 114 custom wood lockers, bathrooms, showers, a stereo and TVs. The other side of the hall is home to the equipment room and the state-of-the-art sports medicine facility, which covers 6,000 square feet and includes an aquatics area with three pools.

The building is named for Wendell H. Murphy, a lifelong supporter of both athletic and academic initiatives at NC State. A member of the NC State Board of Trustees, Murphy was awarded the prestigious Watauga Medal in 1999, the school's highest award given for outstanding and distinguished service.

WOLFPACK TURF:

Former Wolfpack football player and master sculptor Dick Idol, created the "Wolfpack Turf" monument, which rises from the plaza in front of the Murphy Center. The statue is made up of six wolves, each two-times life size, standing on a 21-foot stone mountain.

Each wolf on the sculpture has a name which represents one of the characteristics of a wolf and of a Wolfpack football player: Confidence, Passion, Spirit, Courage, Pride and Strength.

PRACTICE

NC State football practices are closed to the media, but a limited portion of practice will be open to photographers. Players are available following practice on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings if their academic schedules allow and Coach Doeren is available following Tuesday and Thursday practices. Please check with the athletic communications staff to determine what time practice will conclude.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

Monday Media Conference

Coach Doeren will play host to a weekly media conference on Mondays at 1 p.m. in the Murphy Center Media Room. Two Wolfpack players (one offense, one defense) will follow Doeren in the media room.

The media conference may also be accessed by appropriate media outlets via teleconference. Please call the Media Relations Office to obtain the number.

Post-Practice Interviews

Interviews will be conducted only after all practice and conditioning work is completed. Players are available following practice on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, and Coach Doeren is available on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Assistant coaches are available all three days as well.

Postgame Interviews

Following a brief cooling-off period, Coach Doeren and 2-3 players will be brought to the Murphy Center Media Room.

Requests for players will be collected in the press box, midway through the fourth quarter. A representative from the Athletics Communications staff will also collect requests from the on-field media near the end of the game. Those players will be brought to the media room following the press conference.

INJURY REPORTS

If a player is injured during the course of a game, an announcement will be made in the press box regarding the type of injury and if the player is expected to return to the game.

The Athletics Communications office will send out an updated injury report on Thursday mornings 90 minutes following the conclusion of practice for conference games only. There will be no other updates on injuries during the week.

GAME DAY SERVICES

Press Box: The NC State press box is located in Vaughn Towers on the west side of Carter-Finley Stadium.

Press Parking: Press parking is located in the Fairgrounds Lot, closest to Gate B.

Media Services: Complete individual and team statistics, running play-by-play and post-game coaches' quotes and notes are provided for all working media. Complete game books will also be delivered to the postgame interview area. A pregame meal is also available for the media approximately 90 minutes before kickoff.

Photographers: Phones line and wireless access for filing are available in Vaughn Towers and on field level in the north endzone media room.

To gain field access, photographers must also wear a vest. Vests may be signed for 90 minutes prior to kickoff in the media area of Vaughn Towers. In accordance with NCAA and Atlantic Coast Conference rules, photographers will not be allowed between the 25-yard lines. Only WORKING photographers will be allowed on the field during the game. A media relations representative will be on-field at all times to assist the photographers with needs they may have.





NC State Athletics

- ✓ NC State is one of just three schools to have its football team qualify for a bowl game, its men's basketball team advance to the NCAA Tournament and its baseball team go to the College World Series.
- ✓ 131 Wolfpack student-athletes have been named to their respective academic all-conference team in the past two years.
- ✓ The Wolfpack scored a record 633.6 points in the 2012-13 national Directors' Cup competition. A school record 17 of 23 Wolfpack programs scored points in that measurement of all-sport success and the final ranking of 34th was the second highest in school history. That ranking is 55 spots higher than it was three years ago.
- ✓ Three NC State student-athletes were awarded ACC postgraduate scholarships in 2013 while another earned the Honorary Award. In the history of this program, NC State boasts the highest number of these honorees among league schools.
- ✓ 110 State student-athletes graduated in the 2012-2013 academic year.
- ✓ 315 student-athletes were named scholar-athletes on campus (3.0 GPA or higher) in 2012-2013.
