NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT MORTON SCHAPIRO



Morton Schapiro began his term as the 16th president of Northwestern University on September 1, 2009. He is a professor of economics in Northwestern's Judd A. and Marjorie Weinberg College of Arts and Sciences and also holds appointments in the J. L. Kellogg School of Management and the School of Education and Social Policy.

President Schapiro is among the nation's leading authorities on the economics of higher education, with particular

expertise in the area of college financing and affordability and on trends in educational costs and student aid. He has testified before US Senate and House committees on economic and educational issues and is widely quoted in the national media on those issues.

Previously President Schapiro was president of Williams College from 2000 to 2009. Earlier he had served as a member of the Williams College faculty from 1980 to 1991 as professor of economics and assistant provost. In 1991 he went to the University of Southern California, where he served as chair of the Department of Economics until 1994 and then as dean of the College of Letters, Arts and Sciences until 2000.




During his last two years as dean, he also served as the university's vice president for planning.

President Schapiro has written more than 100 articles and five books and has edited two others. He has received research grants and contracts from the National Science Foundation, the US Department of Education, the World Bank, the Spencer Foundation, the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, the College Board, the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, and other groups to study the economics of higher education and related topics. In 2010 he was elected a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

He received his bachelor's degree in economics from Hofstra University and his doctorate from the University of Pennsylvania.

President Schapiro and his wife Mimi have three children: Matt, Alissa and Rachel.

in collegiate athletics.

One of 10 children from a middle-class family and a native of the Portage Park neighborhood on the northwest side of Chicago, Phillips has proven to be the perfect fit to head up Northwestern's 19-sport program in the nation's No. 3 market. His deep Windy City roots and family orientation are an integral part of his core philosophy of providing student-athletes with a "world-class experience" that enables them to succeed academically, socially and athletically.

In June of 2012, Phillips was honored as the Under Armour Central Region Athletic Director of the Year. In addition, as a reflection of the respect he has earned from the industry and his peers, Phillips was selected 3rd Vice President of the National Association of Collegiate Director's of Athletics (NACDA) in June of 2011. He is slated to serve as 1st Vice President in 2013-14 before becoming the President of NACDA in 2014-15—a first for a Northwestern AD.

The 2011-12 academic year was Phillips' second as the Athletic Director Chair of the Big Ten Conference, representing the league's A.D.'s on the Executive Committee of the B1G Joint Group, while he simultaneously worked as a member of the Rose Bowl Management

Committee. He is also currently serving on the NCAA Awards, Benefits, Expenses and Financial Aid Cabinet, and as an athletic mentor in the NCAA Pathway Program.

Academically, Wildcat student-athletes have had banner years with Phillips at the helm. A school-record 206 Wildcats were named Academic All-Big Ten in 2011-12, marking the second-straight year NU has received more than 200 such awards. In the NCAA's most-recent Academic Progress Rating (APR) data, Northwestern's football program led both Division I FBS and FCS schools with a score of 997. Eight NU programs earned perfect 1,000 scores in the multi-year rate while an additional eight teams had perfect 1,000 totals for the 2010-11 data cycle. Wildcats student-athletes earned a combined

participated in the inaugural staff community service day at five different locations around Evanston. Northwestern also welcomed over 1,000 local school children to campus to tour athletic facilities and meet-and-greet student-athletes. Student-athletes are participating in the Undergraduate Leadership Program, receiving leadership coaching by the Center on Leadership Fellows, attended the APPLE Conference in 2011 and have been selected to attend the DERU Conference.

Phillips has pursued an aggressive and progressive plan to ensure success both on and off the field of play, embarking on a number of major projects at Northwestern. One of his first actions was to begin the implementation of a Department of Athletics and Recreation re-organization that was completed

in January of 2009. The athletic department's existing infrastructure was broken into three key areas: internal, external and student-athlete welfare.

In the external area in 2010, Northwestern launched the first wide-ranging marketing campaign in the history of the athletic department. The campaign, with the tagline "Chicago's Big Ten Team," aimed at building brand awareness and driving ticket sales over a multi-year time frame.

To raise awareness of Northwestern's brand in Chicagoland, Phillips moved a pair of Northwestern home events into the city of Chicago. In 2009, the Wildcats' baseball team defeated Notre Dame at U.S. Cellular Field, the home of the Chicago White Sox. In 2010, Phillips signed a deal for Northwestern to face Illinois at Wrigley Field on Nov. 20 in what was the first football game at the "Friendly Confines" since 1970 and the first college football game at the venue since 1938. Phillips has since solidified NU's relationship with the historic North Side

overall GPA of 3.19 for the 2011-12 academic year, the highest figure in school history.

Northwestern continues to be among the nation's leaders in community service under Phillips. During the 2011-12 academic year, all 486 Northwestern student-athletes participated in some form of community service, with the group totaling well over 5,000 combined hours for the fourth consecutive year. In June of 2012 that initiative stretched to department staff when more than 100

franchise, announcing in 2013 a reciprocal event and marketing agreement with the Cubs that will provide opportunities for numerous NU programs to stage competitions at the venue in coming years. Another coup for Phillips came in 2011 when he negotiated a contract to play a home-and-home series with Notre Dame beginning in 2014, marking the first time those two programs will meet since NU's historic win in South Bend in 1995.

Northwestern and Under Armour began a historic and unprecedented multi-year partnership in 2012 that designates Under Armour as the official outfitter of the university's athletic program. The partnership represents Under Armour's first outfitter agreement with an athletic program that competes in the Big Ten Conference. Under Armour, the leader in performance apparel, footwear and accessories, will outfit all of Northwestern's 19 men's and women's varsity athletic teams beginning with the 2012-13 season.

Northwestern's revenues are at an all-time high under Phillips.

NU's football season-ticket base is at its highest in 13 years after growing more than 60 percent over the last three seasons. During the 2011 campaign the Wildcats hosted the largest crowd in the history of Ryan Field in its current configuration, welcoming 47,330 on October 8 for a game against Michigan. Men's basketball season ticket sales are up 34 percent over the last three years, and Northwestern has posted the sixth-largest increase in the nation in average attendance over the last four seasons.

The department posted significant gains in average attendance across the board in 2011-12 relative to the 2010-11 campaign, including a 37 percent increase for women's basketball,

a 20 percent jump in wrestling, an increase of 26 percent in volleyball, a 66 percent rise for baseball and a 45 percent improvement for the women's lacrosse program which ranked second in the nation in attendance. In addition, Development has established positive trends in donor cultivation and engagement.

Along with the landmark Under Armour agreement, the department has signed major corporate sponsorship deals with Northwestern Memorial Hospital, BMO Harris Bank, Gatorade and Coca-Cola while transitioning to Learfield Sports as its multimedia rights holder in March of 2011 and re-branding the entity Northwestern Sports Properties (NSP). That group has tripled NU's corporate sponsorships in the last two years.

Phillips launched the first master facility plan study in Northwestern history in November of 2010 and, on Sept. 15, 2012, announced approval by the Board of Trustees of plans to build a major complex for athletic and recreational activities and a new parking structure on the north end of NU's main Evanston campus. The centerpiece of the complex will be an indoor multipurpose facility to provide room for major events, training and competition space for varsity programs and enhanced recreation areas that will affect all members of the Northwestern University community. In December, Phillips and President Schapiro announced an unprecedented series of lead gifts—together worth more than \$70 million—in support of the project.

Northwestern's Fitness & Recreation unit has grown as an integral part of the overall collegiate experience for many students, offering intramural sports as well as clubs and classes. The department services undergraduate and graduate students, faculty, staff and alumni across the Northwestern community, providing accessible, fun and innovative ways to live healthy and well. The 33 sport clubs served 1,052 undergraduate students during the 2011-12 academic year, while the intramural sport program had 9,494 participants during the campaign.

On the field, Northwestern has achieved historic success across the department. The football program has earned a bowl berth in five straight seasons—most recently recording a victory over Mississippi State in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl on Jan. 1, 2013—while women's lacrosse has won seven of the last nine NCAA Championships. Women's tennis has compiled a string of 14-straight years with a Big Ten title, and men's soccer captured Big Ten regular-season championships in both 2011 and 2012. In Phillips' time at Northwestern, women's lacrosse, softball, men's golf, women's fencing, men's soccer, women's tennis and wrestling all have won team or individual conference championships.

To sustain that success, Phillips has worked to solidify the leadership of each program, securing Pat Fitzgerald (football), Kelly Amonte Hiller (women's lacrosse) and Tim Lenahan (men's soccer) with contract extensions. In June of 2009, he inked Fitzgerald to a new seven-year deal, then extended that contract to 10 years in May of 2011—keeping one of the finest players in school history on the Wildcats' sideline through at least 2020. Amonte

Hiller took charge of the women's lacrosse program when it returned from club status in 2002 and has built NU into a dynasty with seven national championships. Lenahan has mentored his program to NCAA tourney appearances in seven of the last nine seasons, twice reaching the NCAA quarterfinals, and claimed the aforementioned Big Ten titles.

In addition, Phillips elevated a pair of young Northwestern assistants to head coaching positions, naming Jarod Schroeder the men's swimming and diving head coach in 2009 and NU graduate Drew Pariano the wrestling head coach in 2010.

He also recruited sought-after head coaches Tracey Fuchs (field hockey), Joe McKeown (women's basketball), Michael Moynihan (women's soccer) and Chris Collins (men's basketball) to Evanston. Fuchs had arguably the most successful playing career in the history of USA Field Hockey and has been referred to as the "Michael Jordan of field hockey." McKeown came to the Wildcats after 19 years as the head coach at The George Washington University, where he took his team to the postseason 17 times. Moynihan arrived at Northwestern in 2012 following a remarkable 15-year stint as the head coach at Milwaukee where he coached the Panthers to 13 Horizon League championships, including 12 in a row, and nine NCAA tournament appearances. At the time of his hiring, Collins was one of the most highly regarded assistant coaches in the country after 13 seasons on the bench next to one of the game's coaching legends, Duke's Mike



Krzyzewski, at Collins' alma mater. In addition to helping Krzyzewski win 356 of 428 games in his 13 seasons on staff, Collins also was an assistant during gold-medal runs for USA Basketball at the 2008 and 2012 Olympics before returning to his native Chicago to become the Wildcats head coach.

Individually, student-athletes have won the Tewaaraton Trophy in women's lacrosse (Hannah Nielsen, Shannon Smith), the Big Ten Wayne Duke Award (Mark Ison and Drew Ratner), the Hodge Trophy in wrestling (Jake Herbert) and the Big Ten Conference awards for male and female athletes of the year (Jake Herbert in 2009 and Shannon Smith in 2011, respectively). Since Phillips' arrival in 2008, 33 Wildcats have received first-team All-America honors, 30 have picked up conference Player, Coach or Freshman of the Year accolades and 14 have been named CoSIDA Academic All-Americans.

In June of 2009, Phillips was asked to serve on the NCAA Champions Forum panel, a group of football coaches and athletics directors making an effort to increase the hiring and awareness of minority football coaches. He is a member of the NACDA Executive Committee, the World Sport Chicago Board, the NCAA Fellows Leadership Development Program and previously served on Chicago's bid committee for the 2016 Olympic Games. Phillips currently instructs a course entitled "Comprehensive Perspectives for Leading a Sports Entity" in Northwestern's Kellogg School of Business and has previously lectured in the Northwestern School of Continuing Studies' Master's in Sports Administration program.

Prior to arriving in Evanston, Phillips served as Northern Illinois' athletic director for four years beginning in 2004. During that time, the Huskies had unprecedented athletic success and consistent academic achievements. On July 1, 2006, Phillips was promoted to associate vice president, in addition to his director of athletics title, after already being recognized by his peers in the Mid-American Conference with his selection to serve as chairman of the MAC Athletic Directors' Council. He was honored with the 2007 General Robert R. Neyland Outstanding Athletic Director of the Year award while at NIU, and was a member of the NCAA Women's Basketball committee during his time in the MAC.

Phillips was extraordinarily successful in fundraising and marketing at Northern Illinois. He spearheaded the fundraising and construction of the \$14-million Yordon Academic and Athletic Performance Center at NIU, the largest capital project in the athletic department's history, and led several successful fundraising campaigns for athletics. In addition, the Huskies opened an indoor practice facility for baseball, softball and men's and women's golf, and began construction in the spring of 2008 on a new soccer/track and field complex.

During Phillips' tenure in DeKalb, he was instrumental in scheduling high-profile football games against Michigan and Ohio State that resulted in national television appearances for NIU. He also negotiated playing the University of Iowa in 2007 at Soldier Field in Chicago as a home game at NIU, a game that sold out in less than a week. In addition, Phillips negotiated a multi-year radio rights agreement for WSCR-AM (The Score) in Chicago to carry football, men's basketball and a weekly NIU live radio show discussing all Huskie athletic programs. Phillips also negotiated a television deal with Comcast SportsNet Chicago to carry football games and a weekly show called Inside Huskie Sports.


A 1990 graduate of the University of Illinois, Phillips started his career as a manager and student assistant in Illinois' athletic department. He earned a master's degree in education at Arizona State University while serving as a restricted earnings basketball coach during a period in which the Sun Devils reached the postseason in five-straight years.

Phillips also holds a Ph.D. in educational administration from Tennessee, which he completed in the summer of 2007. Phillips served as an assistant athletics director with the Volunteers until 2000. He directed a \$12.4 million annual athletics giving program, and was directly responsible for identifying, cultivating and soliciting all major gifts and donations for the Volunteer athletic program. He helped originate the first-ever capital campaign for athletics at UT that raised more than \$50 million for endowments, facilities and programs. In addition, he supervised several athletic programs and a variety of other areas.

Phillips then moved to the University of Notre Dame in 2000, where he served as associate director of athletics and senior associate director of athletics for external affairs. During 2002-03, he helped launch the Rockne Heritage Fund, which became the first athletics annual fund that directly benefited student-athlete grant-in-aid scholarships. In addition, he managed the ticket office, various corporate sponsorships, athletic programs and a weekly Irish radio show.

At the same time, Phillips played an integral part in the funding of a new \$24-million, 96,000-square foot athletics facility. At Notre Dame, Phillips directed all phases of the athletics community relations program and helped develop new institutional and departmental advancement programs.

Phillips and his wife, Laura, have five children: Luke, Madeline, Meredith, John and James.

2012: WHAT A YEAR IT WAS

- The 2012 Northwestern Wildcats assured themselves a distinguished place in Northwestern Football history, continuing the program's rise to prominence under **Pat Fitzgerald** by achieving a slew of memorable accomplishments.
 - Few Wildcat fans will forget the joy of celebrating Northwestern's first bowl game victory since the 1949 Rose Bowl, which came when NU topped SEC foe Mississippi State, 34-20, in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl on New Year's Day in Jacksonville, Fla. The 'Cats, who were making their 11th all-time bowl appearance and fifth in a row since 2008, intercepted four passes and returned one for a touchdown to snap what was a nine-game losing streak in postseason play.
 - In doing so, Northwestern finished the 2012 campaign with a 10-3 mark, securing its second 10-win season of the modern era and first since its Rose Bowl season in 1995. The 2012 Wildcats held fourth-quarter leads in all 13 games they played.
 - The final national rankings reflected the Wildcats' tremendous season. NU earned the No. 16 ranking in the final *USA Today*/Coaches poll—the best ranking for a Big Ten team—and No. 17 in AP poll. It was the ninth time in program history the 'Cats have been ranked in a year-ending poll—the third time since 1948, and the first time since finishing the 1996 campaign ranked No. 15.
 - Northwestern's national respect came thanks in part to the quality of opponents it faced en route to a 10-3 season. By defeating Mississippi State in the Gator Bowl, NU became the first Big Ten team in the BCS era (dating to 1998) to beat two SEC opponents in the same season, having also knocked off Vanderbilt in regular-season action. In all, NU in 2012 defeated five teams that played in a bowl game (Syracuse, Vanderbilt, Michigan State, Minnesota and Mississippi State), three of which were bowl-game victors.
 - Northwestern's appearance in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl marked the final game for members of the winningest senior class in

school history. The group accounted for 40 victories in their five years on campus—four more than the previous record—and became the first class to reach postseason play all five years of their careers. In addition to leading NU to its first bowl victory in 64 years, the senior class also won 21 Big Ten games—including at least one victory over nine of the other 11 teams in the conference—and five victories vs. nationally ranked opponents.

WILDCATS HEAD TO CAL FOR 2013 OPENER

- The Wildcats are facing a BCS-conference opponent on the road in a season-opener for a fourth consecutive season and have gone 3-0 in such games over the previous three seasons. If history is any indication, the 2013 opener is likely to be an exciting one; NU's three victories in its last three season-openers have come by a combined seven points, with the Wildcats recording a game-ending defensive stand to clinch each win. Northwestern defeated Vanderbilt in the 2010 opener, 23-21, before holding off Boston College in 2011 (21-17) and rallying to defeat Syracuse in 2012, 42-41.
- Consequently, eighth-year head coach **Pat Fitzgerald** carries with him an undefeated record (7-0) in his career in season-openers. At Cal on Aug. 31, Fitzgerald will be coaching his first game since becoming the winningest head coach in Northwestern history, a position he claimed when he earned his 50th career win (50-39) with NU's landmark victory in the 2013 TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl. Northwestern has won 11 of its last 13 season-openers overall.
- Northwestern finished with a 3-2 mark on the road in 2012, securing a .500 or better road record for the fifth consecutive season. The 'Cats are 17-10 in enemy territory since the beginning of 2008, including a 12-8 road mark in Big Ten play during that stretch.

QUICK-HIT PREVIEWS

- Despite graduating 25 players as part of the winningest senior class in school history, Northwestern is expected to bring back a strong crew of veterans to its 2013 squad:

Offense:

The Wildcats return eight of 11 starters on the offensive side of the ball, including a pair of dynamic true seniors in running back and All-American punt returner **Venric Mark** and quarterback **Kain Colter**. A second-stringer in name only, junior **Trevor Siemian** also is back to rejoin Colter under center. NU returns 84.2 of its receiving production from 2012, 95.6 percent of its rushing yardage and 100 percent of its passing production.

Defense:

Defensive coordinator **Mike Hankwitz** also returns a wealth of experience on his side of the ball, with seven starters returning from a unit that ranked third in the Big Ten in rushing defense (127.6 yards allowed per game) and held opponents to 20 points or less in eight of 13 games. Senior defensive end **Tyler Scott**, who was NU's Defensive MVP in 2012 with a team-best 9.0 sacks, is joined by fellow honorable mention All-Big Ten performers **Chi Chi Ariguzo** (LB), **Damien Proby** (LB) and **Ibraheim Campbell** (SAF) in leading the NU defense into 2013.

Special Teams:

Fitzgerald can rest easy knowing that he returns all of his primary specialists, including 2012 Big Ten Co-Kicker of the Year **Jeff Budzien** and his 19-of-20 success rate on field goal attempts last season. Punter **Brandon Williams** and holder **Pat Hickey** return for their fourth and third years in their roles, respectively, while the All-American Mark will look to add to his reputation as one of the nation's most dangerous returnmen.

FAMILIAR FACES SURROUND FITZGERALD

In a profession that is known for its year-to-year turnover, **Pat Fitzgerald** has assembled an assistant coaching staff that is characterized instead by its continuity. Fitzgerald retained all nine of his assistant coaches for the second straight offseason, making Northwestern one of two FBS programs in the country to boast the same full-time coaching staff in three consecutive years entering the 2013 campaign (Minnesota is the other). In fact, all but one of Fitzgerald's assistants are in at least their fifth season with the Wildcats.

'CATS IN PRIMETIME: MUST-SEE TV

▪ Northwestern fans who enjoy watching the 'Cats play under the lights will be in luck in 2013, with NU slated to play in primetime in four of their first five outings this season. The season begins with a 7:30 p.m. PT (9:30 p.m. CT) kickoff between Northwestern and Cal in Berkeley (TV: ESPN2) before NU returns to Evanston to host Syracuse at 5 p.m. CT in its 2013 home-opener. The Wildcats then will be staying up late to face Western Michigan at 8 p.m. CT on Saturday, Sept. 21, and on Oct. 5 will host Ohio State—and an eager Homecoming fanbase—at 7 p.m. CT.

FITZGERALD, WILDCATS ANNOUNCE MEMBERS OF 2013 LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

▪ Northwestern began building the foundation for the 2013 campaign in February by announcing the 14 members of the 2013 Leadership Council. HEAD COACH PAT FITZGERALD

Already the second-longest tenured Big Ten head coach at the age of 38, Pat Fitzgerald's seven seasons at the helm of Northwestern have been spent building upon the tradition he helped establish as a Hall-of-Fame linebacker for the Wildcats in the mid-1990's. Characterized by his motivational skills, enthusiasm and passion for all things Northwestern, Fitzgerald has shaped Chicago's Big Ten Team into one that consistently achieves excellence in all three phases of the student-athlete experience: academics, athletics and community outreach.

Taking over as head coach in 2006 after the sudden passing of his friend and mentor, Randy Walker, Fitzgerald provided leadership and stability in a trying time and has continued Walker's legacy of producing winning football teams while preparing young men for long-term success in life.

Since 2008, Fitzgerald has guided the Wildcats to five consecutive bowl berths, most recently in 2012 when NU capped a tremendous 10-win season with a landmark victory over Mississippi State in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl. The 2012 'Cats, who played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the third time in five years, earned a No. 17 year-end ranking in the USA Today/Coaches Poll, the best positioning for any Big Ten team.

The last four senior classes to graduate from the Northwestern football program have set or tied the school record for most career wins by a five-year



senior class, with the 2012 group going out as the winningest NU senior class in history with 40 victories to its credit. Likewise, Fitzgerald's Gator Bowl victory on Jan. 1, 2013, marked the 50th of his career, officially making him the winningest head coach in Northwestern Football history.

Away from the gridiron, Fitzgerald's players have achieved at the highest levels in the classroom, last fall placing 34 players on the Academic All-Big Ten team and collecting top national honors in the AFCA Academic Achievement Award for the seventh time since 1998.

Additionally, Fitzgerald's program ranked first among all FBS programs in the recently released multi-year Academic Progress Rating (APR), posting a score of 995 out of a possible 1,000 in the measure of player retention and eligibility.

NU also goes to great lengths to make a difference in the community. Fitzgerald, his family and his players partake in countless charitable events, including NU's annual campus-wide Dance Marathon. 2009 graduate Eric Peterman received the National ARA Sportsmanship Award for his off-the-field efforts while a Wildcat also has been selected to the prestigious Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® in six of the last seven years (only 11 players from FBS football claim

the honor each season). Each year, the Wildcats impact their communities through weekly hospital and elementary school visits as well as volunteer efforts with Special Olympics, Misericordia and the NU chapter of Uplifting Athletes, among countless other organizations.



DAN AND SUSAN JONES FAMILY HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

PAT FITZGERALD

In addition to his January 2009 appointment to the Illinois Reform Commission, Fitzgerald was named to the AFCA's Ethics Committee, beginning his term in the fall of 2009. Fitzgerald also is dedicated to helping improve youth football safety as a member of USA Football's Tackle Advisory Committee, which works diligently to provide a safe experience for the nearly three million children who are playing the game of football. In 2012, Fitzgerald announced his involvement with the Positive Coaching Alliance, a national non-profit dedicated to fostering environments where youth and high school athletes can enjoy a positive, character-building youth sports experience.

As a player in 1995, Fitzgerald was the leader of a suffocating Wildcats defensive unit that led the nation in scoring defense and anchored NU's storybook run to the Big Ten championship and Rose Bowl. He capped the year by winning both the Nagurski and Bednarik Awards as the nation's top defensive player and also was the Big Ten, Chevrolet and Sports Illustrated Defensive Player of the Year. Fitzgerald accomplished all of this despite suffering a broken leg in the penultimate regular-season game.

Fitzgerald recovered from that injury and in 1996 he again led the Wildcats to a share of the Big Ten title. He repeated as recipient of the Nagurski and Bednarik Awards, becoming the first two-time winner of both honors and laying the groundwork for his selection in 2008 to the College Football Hall of Fame. A two-time first-team All-American, Fitzgerald started 23 career games and totaled 299 tackles, including 20 for loss. He also forced five fumbles and intercepted three passes.

Fitzgerald was inducted into Northwestern's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003 and five years later received the call informing him that he would earn enshrinement in the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend.

"I'm truly honored and humbled with this incredible honor," Fitzgerald said at the time of his induction. "This achievement speaks to the success of our teams that won Big Ten championships in 1995 and 1996. My teammates are as much a part of this as I am."

Prior to his return to Northwestern, Fitzgerald was a defensive graduate assistant at Maryland (1998) and Colorado (1999) before taking his first full-time position at Idaho in 2000.

In 2001, esteemed NU head coach Randy Walker brought Fitzgerald back to Evanston, hiring him to coach the defensive secondary and eventually tabbing him the 'Cats' recruiting coordinator. Named one of college football's top recruiters by SI.com in 2005, Fitzgerald mentored two-time All-Big Ten linebacker and former St. Louis Ram Tim McGarigle, the all-time leading tackler in NCAA history.

Fitzgerald remained an assistant coach before being named Northwestern's 29th head coach on July 7, 2006 under the most difficult of circumstances, succeeding Walker after his sudden passing on June 29, 2006. Fitzgerald remained the youngest head football coach among Football Bowl Subdivision schools until Lane Kiffin was hired by Tennessee on Dec. 1, 2008.

In May of 2011, NU Director of Athletics Jim Phillips announced that Fitzgerald and the school agreed to a new 10-year deal that will keep him on the Northwestern sidelines through 2020. The 10-year deal is unprecedented in Northwestern Athletics history.

"I'm humbled and appreciative of the commitment shown by Northwestern" said Fitzgerald. "With this support from our administration, our coaches and players expect to compete for championships."

The program has steadily gained momentum in the six years since Fitzgerald took over as head coach, starting with a challenging 4-8 campaign in 2006, when just weeks before the season began, Walker's death rocked the NU football program. In 2007, the Wildcats achieved bowl-eligibility with a 6-6 mark but did not play in a postseason game due to a lack of bowl slots for Big Ten teams. The 2007 Wildcats boasted a prolific offense that has become synonymous with NU teams of late, leading the Big Ten in regular-season total offense.

In 2008, a dramatically improved defense and strong special teams play led the 'Cats to a nine-win season and a berth in the Valero Alamo Bowl against Missouri, their first postseason appearance since taking on UCLA in the 2005 Sun Bowl. Northwestern touted the nation's fifth-most improved scoring defense and the Wildcats set a single-season school mark for rushing defense (126.4 ypg), breaking the mark that Fitzgerald and his teammates established in 1995. NU's 5-0 season start in 2008 was its best since the 1962

campaign, when the Wildcats were 6-0 and ranked No. 1 in the nation. For his efforts, Fitzgerald was named the 2008 Big Ten Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus, a semifinalist for the George Munger Coach of the Year Award and a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award.

In 2009, the Wildcats returned to a New Year's Day Bowl game, their first since Fitzgerald was a student-athlete playing Tennessee in the 1997 Citrus Bowl. Fitzgerald's 2009 club was, perhaps, one of the most resilient teams in recent memory, overcoming a number of injuries (especially on defense) and some difficult defeats, only to finish with a "November to remember." The Wildcats opened the month by knocking off unbeaten Iowa, which at the time was ranked No. 4 in the BCS. NU then went to Illinois and defeated its in-state rival before returning home to edge No. 16 (BCS) Wisconsin in the regular-season finale.

The strong finish made the Wildcats a "wanted" bowl team and they landed a berth in the Outback Bowl on Jan. 1. In that game, Northwestern played with the "heart of a Wildcat," overcoming a number of double-digit deficits only to fall 38-35 in overtime to Auburn. That game was widely recognized as the best bowl game of 2009-10, and one of the all-time most exciting postseason games.

In 2010, Northwestern raced to another 5-0 start before beating nationally ranked Iowa on Nov. 13 to move to 7-3 and climb back into the top-25. A season-ending injury to first-team All-Big Ten quarterback Dan Persa, however, slowed the 'Cats' ascent in the national rankings and NU closed the season with a 7-6 mark. Still, NU's third straight winning season under Fitzgerald was capped with yet another New Year's Day bowl berth, a bid to the inaugural TicketCity Bowl at the famed Cotton Bowl in Dallas.

Another strong finish to the schedule (four wins in their final five games) rendered the 2011 Wildcats bowl-eligible for a fifth straight year. The stretch was highlighted by a 28-25 upset of No. 9 Nebraska in Lincoln, which helped position NU for an eventual berth in the Meineke Car Care Bowl of Texas at Reliant Stadium, home of the NFL's Houston Texans.

A graduate of Orland Park's (Ill.) Carl Sandburg High School and a 2003 inductee to the Northwestern Athletics Hall of Fame, Fitzgerald resides in Northfield with his wife, Stacy, and three sons, Jack, born in November 2004, Ryan, born in September 2006, and Brendan, born in February 2009.



JERRY BROWN

21st Season
Assistant Head Coach
Defensive Backs Coach



Jerry Brown, the dean of the Wildcat coaching staff and a Northwestern alum, is in his 21st season with Northwestern. In January 2002, Brown was named assistant head coach. He also coaches the Wildcats' defensive backs after serving as the defensive coordinator from 1999 to 2001. Including his playing days, Brown has a hand in 137 wins at Northwestern, more than 27 percent of the school's all-time total.

In 2012, the Wildcats secondary was again a source of strength despite its relative youth. Sophomore safety Ibraheim Campbell excelled in his second year as a starter with 12 pass breakups, two forced fumbles



MIKE HANKWITZ

Sixth Season
Defensive Coordinator

A veteran of 27 bowl games and eight different BCS programs, Mike Hankwitz is in his sixth season as NU's defensive coordinator.

Last season, Hankwitz oversaw a defense that was vastly improved from a year ago, ranking No. 3 in the Big Ten in rushing defense and holding eight of NU's 13 opponents to 20 points or fewer. The 'Cats thrived at creating timely turnovers, with NU leading the Big Ten in turnover margin (+13) and tied for second in the nation in fumbles recovered (16).

Hankwitz' unit also made its mark with late-game stands in 2012, preventing possible go-ahead, fourth-quarter drives by its opponent

Mick McCall is in his sixth season as Northwestern's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He began his Wildcat tenure on Jan. 17, 2008.

McCall is coming off a 2012 season in which he utilized a pair of quarterbacks with contrasting styles, with both Kain Colter and Trevor Siemian taking charge of the offense throughout the season. Colter started 12 of 13 games and posted a passer efficiency rating of 129.3 while also running for 894 yards and a team-best 12 touchdowns. Siemian, meanwhile, was a lethal pocket passer and orchestrator of the

and two interceptions. Campbell earned consensus honorable mention All-Big Ten recognition.

The Wildcat secondary delivered a strong performance in NU's landmark victory in the Taxslayer.com Gator Bowl. Campbell recorded his fourth career interception on a sideline pass from Mississippi State quarterback Tyler Russell and VanHoose stepped in front of a dying quail of a pass for his third interception of his redshirt freshman season before returning it for 39 yards.

Brown's secondary was part of a Northwestern defense that recorded 13 total interceptions and helped NU lead the Big Ten in turnover margin for the season (+13).

against Syracuse, Vanderbilt, Boston College, Minnesota, Michigan State and Mississippi State. The road win over the Spartans also featured a pair of goalline stands to help preserve a 23-20 Wildcats victory.

After the season, five NU players from the defensive side of the ball were named honorable mention All-Big Ten, including all three starting linebackers.

two-minute offense, throwing for 1,312 yards and six touchdowns off the bench.

McCall also took advantage of one of the nation's most dynamic running backs, inserting Venric Mark as the team's opening-day starter and helping the junior become NU's first 1,000-yard rusher since 2006. Mark racked up eight 100-yard rushing games and 12 touchdowns, leading an NU rushing attack that ranked fourth in the Big Ten with 226.3 yards per game. McCall's offense produced 31.7 points per game and a pair of second-team All-Big Ten selections in Mark and offensive lineman Brian Mulroe.

Including Colter, McCall has mentored an All-Big Ten honoree at quarterback each of the last four years.

Randy Bates is in his eighth season directing Northwestern's linebackers unit and his 32nd year overall in the coaching profession. Bates assumed his current role at NU after Pat Fitzgerald was named the Wildcats' head coach in July, 2006.

Bates' unit was a strength of the Wildcats 'D' throughout last season, with the three starters—senior David Nwabuisi, junior Damien Proby and sophomore Chi Chi Ariguzo—ranking as the Wildcats' top three tacklers and all three garnering honorable mention All-Big Ten accolades.

Adam Cushing is in his 10th season on the Wildcat staff and his eighth as a full-time assistant. In February of 2009, he was promoted to offensive line coach after previously serving as the Wildcats' superbacks coach.

Cushing's unit lived up to the "Big 'Cats" moniker it adopted before the 2012 season began, consistently using its physicality, speed, stamina and experience to create opportunities for NU's playmakers. The Wildcats ranked fourth in the Big Ten in rushing yards per game and produced the program's first 1,000-yard rusher since 2006. The group

A second-year starter, Proby ranked as the team leader and was eighth in the Big Ten in tackles with 8.6 per game, while Nwabuisi and Ariguzo each accounted for numerous big plays throughout the year. Nwabuisi led NU with three interceptions—including one return for a touchdown—while Ariguzo topped the Big Ten with four fumble recoveries to go along with his team-best 10.5 tackles for loss.

The group was a key factor in Northwestern's ability to stifle the run in 2012, with the 'Cats ranking third in the Big Ten and in the top 20 nationally with 127.6 ground yards allowed per game. In all, Proby, Nwabuisi and Ariguzo combined for 22.5 TFLs, 13 pass breakups and six fumble recoveries.

paved the way for 31 rushing touchdowns—including 14 straight early in the season—and twice was asked to run-block 60 or more times in a game (67 vs. Illinois, 60 vs. Indiana).

NU also performed well in pass protection situations, allowing the fewest sacks in the Big Ten (16 in 13 games).

The group was led by a trio of seniors in left guard Brian Mulroe, left tackle Patrick Ward and right guard Neal Deiters, with Mulroe receiving second-team All-Big Ten honors from the media and Ward taking home his first career honorable mention all-conference laurel. Cushing also mentored Brandon Vitabile to a brilliant sophomore season at center and helped sophomore Jack Konopka make a smooth transition to tackle after a year spent at superback.

Veteran assistant coach Bob Heffner joined Northwestern in February of 2009 as its superbacks coach and has spent the last four seasons enhancing the position's role in the Wildcats offense.

Heffner's tutelage of NU's Drake Dunsmore over his first three years on staff represented a resounding success, culminating in Dunsmore being voted the inaugural winner of the Kwalick-Clark Big Ten Tight End of the Year Award in 2011. Dunsmore, who also was a consensus first-team All-Big Ten selection, became NU's career leader for receiving yards by a tight end and graduated with 1,567 yards on 143 catches.

A year later, Heffner's guidance ensured a smooth transition to Dunsmore's replacement, which came in the form of true freshman Dan Vitale. Vitale arrived at Northwestern with the possibility of playing multiple positions but found a home in Heffner's position room and soon was making major contributions on the field for NU. He went on to start 10 games and finish fifth on the team in both receptions (28) and receiving yards (288). An ESPN.com All-Rookie Team selection, Vitale came up especially big for the 'Cats in wins at Michigan State (nine catches, 110 yards) and in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl (seven catches, 82 yards).

Marty Long is entering his sixth season at the helm of Northwestern's defensive line after coming to the Wildcats prior to the 2008 campaign.

Overseeing one of NU's most veteran position groups in 2012, Long helped his front line consistently stifle opposing rushing attacks and disrupt action in the backfield. The 'Cats ranked third in the Big Ten with 127.6 rushing yards allowed per game—one yard shy of the school record Long's unit recorded in 2008. The defensive end tandem of Tyler Scott and Quentin Williams combined for 21.0 TFL's, 13.5 sacks

and five forced fumbles, while Williams provided the exclamation point on the year with his INT return for touchdown on the third play from scrimmage at the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl. Senior DT Brian Arnfelt contributed 6.0 TFLs to NU's cause in his best season as a 'Cat, and sophomore Sean McEvilly grew under Long's tutelage into a starting role next to Arnfelt.

For two seasons upon his arrival in Evanston, Long mentored Wildcats standout Corey Wootton, who ranked 18th nationally in sacks per game in 2008 and is now a regular contributor for the Chicago Bears.

Matt MacPherson is in his ninth season as the Wildcats running backs coach and, in February, 2011, added the title of recruiting coordinator to his responsibilities.

Northwestern's running attack in 2012 was nothing short of a revelation, with MacPherson mentoring junior Venric Mark to 1,366 rushing yards and NU's first 1,000-yard season by an individual since Tyrell Sutton in 2006. The explosive Mark averaged 6.2 yards per carry and scored 12 touchdowns on the ground en route to earning consensus second-team All-Big Ten accolades and being named a semifinalist for

the coveted Doak Walker Award.

MacPherson also guided Mike Trumpy to a successful return from a torn ACL suffered in October, 2011, with the physical Trumpy backing up Mark to the tune of 349 yards and 4.6 yards per attempt. Senior Tyris Jones also developed under MacPherson into a reliable short-yardage and pass-blocking back, collecting 143 yards after posting only 69 in his first three years on the field.

Collectively and along with the rushing efforts of QB Kain Colter, Northwestern ranked fourth in the Big Ten and 14th in the country with 225.5 ground yards per outing. NU ran for over 300 yards on three occasions—all three times against Big Ten defenses—including a season-best 394 yards on 58 carries against Indiana.

Dennis Springer is entering his third year as Northwestern's wide receivers coach after joining the program on Jan. 31, 2011. He came to NU after spending the previous three seasons at Indiana University, serving as the assistant head coach and running backs coach, as well as the Hoosiers' co-special teams coordinator.

In his first season in Evanston, Springer oversaw the continued growth of Jeremy Ebert into one of the most prolific wide receivers in the Big Ten. Ebert's 1,025 receiving yards in 2011 represent the first 1,000-yard season by a Wildcat pass-catcher since D'Wayne Bates in 1998 and

the fourth-highest single-season total in school history.

In year two, Springer continued to mentor a corps of wide receivers that was as young as it was deep and dynamic. Springer instilled a selfless attitude among the wideouts, allowing them to commit to blocking on the perimeter for the explosive running game led by Venric Mark and Kain Colter.

But the 'Cats also took plenty of shots down the field, with sophomores Tony Jones (29 receptions, 335 yards, four touchdowns) and Christian Jones (35 catches, 412 yards, two TDs) as the primary deep threats. Junior Rashad Lawrence ranked second with 34 catches, while the lone senior, Demetrius Fields, set the tone with nine catches in the season-opener and finished with 33 on the year.



With the win, head coach Pat Fitzgerald remained unbeaten in season-openers at the helm of the Wildcats, improving to 7-0. This is the third straight year in which the Wildcats have defeated a BCS-conference opponent on the road in their season-opener.

Forced to punt on its opening drive of the game, Northwestern gave Syracuse excellent field position for its first possession when a mistimed snap prevented NU from getting the kick away. The Wildcats defense responded to limit Syracuse to a field goal, a feat that Northwestern would repeat on SU's next trip into the red zone, keeping the Orange to a 6-0 advantage early on.

Those stops paid dividends for the Wildcats, who received a shot in the arm from Mark when he fielded a punt and found a seam on the right sideline, taking it 82 yards for NU's first touchdown of the season. It was the first punt return for a score since Marquice Cole recorded an 81-yard return to paydirt against Northern Illinois in 2005.

NU also benefited from two timely plays by linebacker Chi Chi Ariguzo, beginning when Ariguzo snagged a loose ball out of the air for an interception and set up NU's next touchdown with his return. In the third quarter, Ariguzo recovered a dropped screen pass that was deemed a lateral and alertly ran it 33 yards uncontested for his first career touchdown.





The Northwestern defense forced two fumbles, recovering two, including one in the closing minutes of the game. Trailing 16-13, Vanderbilt began its drive at its own 28-yard line and on the first play, quarterback Jordan Rodgers was sacked by Tyler Scott, forcing the fumble that was recovered by Dean Lowry. Scott finished the game with six tackles, one sack, two tackles for loss and a forced fumble. Chi Chi Ariguzo led the NU defense with 10 tackles, along with a sack and a team-best three TFLs.

NU entered the fourth quarter facing a 10-6 deficit but began its go-ahead drive at the start of the final period. A late hit against Vanderbilt moved the ball near the midfield and Northwestern marched down the field, ending the 11-play, 86-yard drive with Mark's 7-yard touchdown scamper to take its first lead of the game at 13-10.

Vanderbilt evened things up on its next drive, capping a nine-play 60-yard drive with a 26-yard field goal by Carey Spear.

On NU's next possession, the Wildcats drove all the way to the Vanderbilt 2-yard line, facing fourth-and-1 with about two minutes remaining. Electing for the field goal, Budzien put the Wildcats back on top 16-13.

Northwestern's defense quickly stopped Vanderbilt's last chance to go back on top as Scott forced a Rodgers fumble, giving the Wildcats the ball back at the Vanderbilt 20-yard line. With Colter back under center, NU had two negative rushes before he broke out for the 29-yard touchdown run sealing the game for the Wildcats.



Trevor Siemian as Colter finished 16-of-20 for 144 yards and Siemian was 14-of-20 for 123 yards. Colter also had 66 yards on the ground as the Wildcats accounted for 560 yards of total offense (293 rushing, 267 passing).

The NU defense limited BC to just 25 rushing yards as the Eagles had 316 yards of total offense. Chi Chi Ariguzo, the reigning Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week, led NU with 10 tackles.

Protecting a 15-10 lead entering the fourth quarter, Northwestern saw its lead shrink to two in the opening minutes of the period and was forced to punt for only the second time all game with just over three minutes remaining in the game. Punter Brandon Williams planted his kick at the BC 1-yard line, leaving the Eagles needing a long drive to find the go-ahead score. Instead, the Wildcats defense forced a three-and-out, getting the ball back with 2:35 to play.

Northwestern stuck to the ground game it had established long ago, feeding the ball to Mike Trumy and watching the NU junior break off a 27-yard game-clinching touchdown run three plays later. It was Northwestern's 100th and final offensive play from scrimmage, the most by the Wildcats since running 115 plays in the 2010 Outback Bowl.

Northwestern finished 12-of-19 on third-down situations while Boston College was just 2-of-11, allowing NU to hold the ball for nearly 36 of the game's 60 minutes.



Northwestern completed the nonconference portion of its schedule with a perfect 4-0 mark by knocking off South Dakota, 38-7, at Ryan Field on Sept. 22. The Wildcats did most of their damage on offense with the ground game, posting five rushing touchdowns and finishing with 277 yards on the ground.

The five rushing scores were the most by a Northwestern team since Sept. 5, 2009, against Towson. Junior Venric Mark went over 100 yards on the ground for the second time this season, racking up 117 yards to go along with a career-best three touchdowns. Northwestern has now had an individual reach the 100-yard rushing plateau in three straight games, the longest such streak for NU since early in the 2007 season.

Northwestern quarterbacks supported the cause by completing 12-of-15 passing attempts for 131 yards, keeping NU without an interception for the fourth time in four games this season.

A 47-yard rush by Mark on the second play from scrimmage set the tone for the Wildcats, putting Northwestern down to the South Dakota 26-yard line. Mark would have the honor of finishing off the drive seven plays later with a 3-yard dive into the end zone for his second rushing score of the year.

After a quick three-and-out by the Coyotes, Northwestern again found itself within scoring range thanks to a 42-yard catch-and-run from Trevor Siemian to Tony Jones. On the next play, Siemian handed off to senior Tyris Jones for a 5-yard rush to put the Wildcats ahead by two touchdowns midway through the period.

South Dakota moved the ball as far as the NU 29-yard line on its next possession, but turned the ball over on downs after a fourth-and-15 stop by the Wildcats defense. Two possessions later, Northwestern took over with good field position after a short 17-yard punt by South Dakota. A dynamic 24-yard scamper by Kain Colter brought NU inside Coyote territory, and once again Mark moved the pile from six yards out to put the hosts ahead, 21-0.

NU regained possession after an errant snap by the Coyotes was recovered by Brian Arnfelt, Arnfelt's first fumble recovery this year to go along with two forced fumbles. Siemian directed the NU offense for the 28 yards to the end zone, ultimately handing off to Mark for his third score of the day.

Northwestern's fifth touchdown of the afternoon came on NU's opening drive of the second half when sophomore Trevon Green broke off a career-long 33-yard run up the middle of the line, capping a quick 71-yard Wildcats drive.



NORTHWESTERN 44 INDIANA 29

Northwestern compiled a school-record 704 yards of total offense as the Wildcats defeated Indiana 44-29 at Ryan Field in the Big Ten opener for both teams. The yardage total topped the 674 yards amassed in a 51-48 victory over Wisconsin on Oct. 8, 2005.

Junior Kain Colter performed double duty at quarterback and wide receiver for the first time this season and put up gaudy numbers at both positions. Colter racked up 90 receiving yards in the first half alone and finished with nine receptions for 131 yards, while also rushing 14 times for 161 yards—an 11.5 yards-per-carry average—and found the end zone four times on the ground.

Junior running back Venric Mark also surpassed 100 yards on the ground for the third time in four games, setting career bests with 139 yards on 29 carries. It marks the first time since Nov. 22, 2003, against Illinois that the Wildcats have had two 100-yard rushers in the same game (Jason Wright and Noah Herron).

Trevor Siemian spent much of the game under center for NU and set career highs with 308 yards passing,

completing 22 of 32 attempts in his first career start. Place-kicker Jeff Budzien had yet another stellar game, remaining perfect on field goals this season (11-for-11) by converting 44, 34 and 29-yard attempts.

Northwestern sped to a 20-0 halftime lead thanks to a pair of Colter touchdown runs and two Budzien field goals and soon made it 27-0 when the 'Cats marched down the field on their first drive of the second half.

Indiana found its stride at that point, getting on the board with a 20-yard rush by Stephen Houston and getting a fortuitous fumble recovery at the end of a long rush by Mark. Indiana punched it in with a 35-yard scoring strike from Nate Sudfeld to Kofi Hughes, narrowing its deficit to 27-14.

A stellar seven-play, 75-yard drive by the Wildcats put some distance back between NU and IU, with Mark continuing the theme of the day on offense by plunging in from one yard out to make it 34-14. The 20-point lead was short-lived, however, as Indiana's Tevin Coleman returned Northwestern's kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown, keeping IU in shouting distance with 4:29 left in the third. The Hoosiers would eventually pull to within eight, 37-29, following a TD and two-point conversion, but the NU defense forced a three-and-out to give Colter the chance to put the game away with his school-record-tying fourth TD of the afternoon.



For the second-straight meeting in Happy Valley, Northwestern staked itself to a double-digit lead against Penn State only to see the Nittany Lions storm back for a victory, this time handing NU its first loss of 2012 with a 39-28 decision.

Penn State held possession of the ball for all but six offensive plays in the first quarter but managed to come away with only three points. The Nittany Lions converted a pair of fourth-down opportunities and ultimately set up a 21-yard field goal by Sam Ficken to take the lead.

Northwestern, meanwhile, began their first four offensive drives on their own 1, 21, 15 and 8-yard line, respectively, and were forced into three-and-outs each time. Penn State added to its lead after beginning its drive at NU's 40-yard line and eventually punching in a 1-yard touchdown rush by Zach Zwinak with 9:34 left before halftime.

Northwestern was the beneficiary of a Penn State miscue following its next series, when a Wildcats punt was dropped by the PSU receiver. Redshirt freshman

Nick VanHoose was right there to scoop up the loose ball, giving NU possession at the hosts' 17-yard line. Three plays later, Venric Mark took an option pitch and covered the two yards to the end zone for NU's first score of the day and its 14th straight rushing TD dating to its week-two matchup with Vanderbilt.

Later in the half, Trevor Siemian found Tony Jones across the middle of the end zone, threading the needle and giving Jones the chance to make a great grab and secure a 14-10 NU lead at the intermission. Penn State regained the lead with a 12-play drive on its first chance of the second half, getting in the end zone with an 8-yard pass from Matt McGloin to Allen Robinson. NU roared right back on its next possession, with Siemian and Mark keying a 71-yard touchdown drive. The series was completed when Colter executed the zone read to perfection and darted 10 yards around the left end to put Northwestern ahead, 21-17.

After a defensive stand by NU, Mark did what he does best when he fielded a deep Penn State punt, exploded through the first line of coverage and took it 75 yards to the house. The score put NU ahead 28-17 and made Mark only the second Wildcat in history to notch two punt returns in the same season, joining Tom Worthington in 1949.

Penn State controlled the fourth quarter, however, scoring the game's final 22 points to steal a 39-28 victory from the Wildcats.

run up the middle by MarQueis Gray on the first play of the second quarter.

After a three-and-out by the Wildcats, Northwestern's defense came up big on Minnesota's ensuing first-down play when senior DL Quentin Williams batted down a pass that was then intercepted by David Nwabuisi, Nwabuisi's second career pick. Two plays later, Mark went straight up the middle untouched for a career-long run of 48 yards and his second touchdown of the afternoon, putting the Wildcats in front by a 21-10 count.

The score remained the same when Northwestern received the kickoff at the start of the second half, but the Wildcats were forced to punt and saw their lead shrink to eight following Jordan Wettstein's second field goal of the day for the Gophers. It was the only score by either team in the third quarter, as the steady rain kept the ball on the ground and the clock running with few interruptions.

The teams continued to trade punts in the early going of the fourth quarter, with the driving rain hindering both offenses. When Minnesota got the ball back at midfield for one final drive with 1:17 left on the clock, Tyler Scott stepped up with a huge sack and forced fumble to finish off the victory.

Mark finished the game with a career-best 181 yards on the ground, giving him 791 for the season, good for a 113.0 yards per game average.





Bell for a 37-yard TD and a 10-7 Nebraska lead.

Two drives later, Northwestern took over on the 50-yard line and moved the chains with a fourth-and-1 pickup on a Colter QB sneak. Mark then converted a key third-and-5 play by moving the pile for seven yards, and on the next play Siemian dropped back and found Tony Jones down the sideline for a 26-yard TD completion.

Northwestern forced a Nebraska punt to open the second half and, after getting the ball back, saw Venric Mark break off an 80-yard touchdown run to put the 'Cats in front, 21-10.

Late in the third quarter, Martinez recorded the only other score of the period on a 3-yard touchdown rush, but the Wildcats stopped the ensuing two-point conversion, keeping Northwestern ahead, 21-16.

The Wildcats regained a double-digit lead when Mike Trumpy capped an 11-play drive by plunging in from three yards out with 8:31 left, extending the hosts' advantage to 28-16.

However, Nebraska responded with an 80-yard drive capped by an eight-yard pass from Martinez to Taariq Allen. Northwestern was unable to pick up a first down on the ensuing drive and the Huskers got the decisive score with just over two minutes left when Martinez and Ben Cotton teamed up on a 7-yard scoring pass to give Nebraska its first lead since midway through the second quarter.



Led by a rushing attack that churned out 349 yards and a defense that kept Iowa out of the end zone until the final minute of the third quarter, Northwestern pleased its 2012 Homecoming crowd with a 28-17 victory over the Hawkeyes at Ryan Field. The win over the Hawkeyes is NU's sixth in its last eight meetings with its conference and divisional rivals.

Quarterback Kain Colter was a thorn in the side of Iowa all afternoon, rushing for a career-best 166 yards and three touchdowns while also throwing a 47-yard TD pass and finishing with 80 yards through the air.

Junior RB Venric Mark recorded a milestone on the afternoon, rushing for 162 yards to go over 1,000 ground yards for the season. It marks the 15th 1,000-yard rushing season in NU football history and the first since Tyrell Sutton ran for exactly 1,000 in 2006. It's also the second time this season that Mark and Colter each topped 100 yards in the same game, a feat that before this season had not been achieved by the 'Cats since 2003.

Defensively, Northwestern was led by a stellar effort by senior linebacker David Nwabuisi, who recorded personal-bests of 11 solo and 18 total tackles.

A pair of Colter rushing touchdowns in the first half allowed the 'Cats to bring a 14-3 lead into the locker room, and NU seized momentum once again early in the third quarter. After stopping the Hawkeyes on the opening drive of the half, NU's Tyris Jones came free to block Iowa's punt attempt, forcing the ball out of bounds at the Hawkeye 4-yard line. Colter punched it in on the ensuing first down, extending the hosts' lead to 18 points.

The advantage grew to 28-3 on NU's next offensive possession when Colter dropped back and found Christian Jones behind his defender, connecting with the sophomore for a 47-yard touchdown strike.

After Iowa scored to make it 28-10, the Wildcats seemed poised to put the game away before a fumbled snap in the red zone gave the ball back to the Hawkeyes. Iowa would score to pull within 11 points, but NU's defense returned to the stifling play it demonstrated throughout the game to clinch Northwestern's seventh win of the year.

Northwestern took the lead midway through the fourth quarter and made a late interception, but a Michigan Hail Mary and game-tying field goal sent the game to overtime, where the Wolverines came out on top, 38-31.

The game marked the first overtime contest for the Wildcats since the 2010 Outback Bowl and was the first overtime loss in program history for NU in Big Ten play (Northwestern previously was 7-0 in such games).

Northwestern was led on offense by running back Venric Mark's seventh 100-yard rushing game of the season and a combined 14-of-21 passing effort with three touchdowns by quarterbacks Kain Colter and Trevor Siemian. Mark racked up 260 all-purpose yards.

NU compiled 248 rushing yards and 431 total yards on a Michigan defense that came into the game ranked No. 7 nationally in total defense.

Northwestern marched down the field and scored on its opening possession of the game—the first Michigan opponent to do so in 2012—thanks to a 3-yard Mark scoring run. Michigan rallied to seize a 14-7 lead late in the second, but the Siemian entered the game with 1:53 to go before halftime and quickly engineered an NU scoring drive. The final strike was a perfect 19-yard delivery to redshirt freshman Cameron Dickerson, who made a nice catch at the pylon for his first career touchdown.

The Wildcats then regained the lead on the first drive of the second half when Colter found superback Dan Vitale alone down the right sideline on a 23-yard touchdown pass. A Jeff Budzien field goal from 34 yards out extended the NU lead to 24-14, but Michigan narrowed its deficit to three entering the fourth on a 28-yard pass from Devin Gardner to Fitz Toussaint.

After Michigan found a go-ahead score midway through the fourth, NU responded when Siemian again came in to finish off a drive started by Colter, finding Michigan native Tony Jones in the end zone from 15 yards to out to put NU in front, 31-28. Demetrius Dugar then intercepted Gardner on Michigan's next series, but NU was forced to punt it back to the hosts with less than one minute to play.

Michigan's Hail Mary prayers were answered on a 53-yard pass to Roy Roundtree to set up a short, game-tying field goal, and the Wolverines won it in OT on a 1-yard Gardner rush.

Northwestern's defense forced four turnovers and made nine total pass breakups at Michigan State to help the Wildcats secure a bruising 23-20 Legends Division road win over the Spartans.

The victory is the first for Northwestern against Michigan State since the 2007 campaign and allows NU to claim a .500 or better record away from Ryan Field for the fifth straight season (3-2 in 2012).

NU's four turnovers came via two fumbles and two interceptions, and were its most since forcing that number in back-to-back games during the 2010 season against Illinois State and at Rice.

Aside from a brief spell early in the third quarter, the game was a defensive struggle that saw NU twice keep the hosts off the scoreboard with stops inside its own 1-yard line. Offensively, NU quarterbacks Kain Colter and Trevor Siemian each completed 13 passes for a combined total of 246 yards. Their prime target was true freshman superback Dan Vitale, who obliterated his previous career highs with nine catches for 110 yards, making him

the first NU superback to top 100 receiving yards since Drake Dunsmore on Oct. 29, 2011.

Junior Jeff Budzien accounted for the game-winning points with his fourth-quarter field goal, one of three on the day for the Lou Groza Award semifinalist. Budzien is now 15-of-16 on field goal tries this year and 4-of-5 from 40 yards or longer.

Leading 6-5 at halftime, Northwestern struck first on the third play of the second half when linebacker David Nwabuisi intercepted a wobbly Andrew Maxwell pass and returned it 43 yards for a defensive touchdown. The hosts answered with a touchdown of their own before Kain Colter hit superback Tim Riley for a 6-yard touchdown score midway through the third, Riley's third career catch and his second TD.

Michigan State knotted the score at 20 with 9:22 remaining on a second Maxwell scoring toss, but Northwestern quickly responded when Siemian fired a 41-yard pass to Vitale to land the Wildcats in field goal range. Budzien's 27-yarder with 7:30 to play broke the tie, and from there it was up to the NU defense. Safety Jared Carpenter recorded his first career interception, Drew Smith notched a key sack to end another MSU drive, and the NU secondary posted four straight pass breakups on Sparty's last-chance drive to secure the win.



After Illinois scored the first points of the day, Northwestern responded with a field goal before promptly causing its first turnover of the day on an Illini kickoff return. Colter gave NU a 10-7 lead with his rushing score and senior David Nwabuisi set up the Wildcats' next TD with his interception and 40-yard return to the Illinois 9-yard line. Colter found Tony Jones on a crossing pattern in the back of the end zone for Jones' fourth touchdown of 2012.

Illinois managed to pull within three, 17-14, before NU reeled off 33 unanswered points beginning with Mark's 3-yard scoring rush. Another Budzien field goal gave NU a 27-14 advantage at the intermission, a lead that grew following a 75-yard scoring drive to open the second half.

The NU defense kept Illinois at bay with back-to-back interceptions, the first of which came courtesy of sophomore Ibraheim Campbell, who returned it 40 yards to the Illinois 24. On the next play, NU dug into its playbook and drew up a surprise pass by Colter to offensive tackle Paul Jorgensen, who hauled in the toss down the seam and opened the floodgates on their rivals.



When Otto Graham graduated from Waukegan, (Ill.) High School in 1938, it was safe to say that he did not envision one day becoming a member of college football's Hall of Fame, let alone the NFL's. In fact, he did not even come to Northwestern to be a football player. Otto Graham originally attended Northwestern on a basketball scholarship. It was only after Northwestern football coach Pappy Waldorf watched one of Graham's freshman intramural football games that Otto got his chance. In one of the greatest coaching decisions in Northwestern football history, Waldorf invited Graham to try out for the football team. The rest of Graham's story is written in the record books.

Nicknamed "Automatic Otto" for his precision passing, Graham broke every existing Big Ten passing record during his tenure (1941-1943). He was a two-time All-America and won the Big Ten Most Valuable Player Award. He still holds the Northwestern record for most points (27) scored in a single game. As a senior, he averaged 38 yards per punt, four yards per carry rushing, and converted on seven extra points. In addition, Graham won eight letters in three sports at NU (football, basketball, and baseball) and is one of two Northwestern athletes ever to earn All-America status in two sports (football and basketball).

After leaving Northwestern, Otto was a commissioned officer in the United States Navy Air Corps and served for two years in World War II. After serving his country,



he played professional football with the Cleveland Browns. With the Browns, Graham passed for 23,584 yards and 174 touchdowns in his career and led them to four-straight America Football League titles. After merging with the NFL in 1950, he played in six-straight title game appearances with Cleveland.

Graham retired from professional football after Cleveland's 1955 championship season.

Graham will forever be synonymous with triple-threat football—rushing, passing, and kicking. In 1956, he was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. In 1965,

Graham was inducted into pro football's Hall of Fame. He was named Northwestern football's greatest player ever in the Big Ten's 75th anniversary year—all because Coach Waldorf was impressed at a freshman intramural football game and decided to give a kid named Otto a try-out.

Otto Graham passed away during the 2003 season. In memory of the legend, the Wildcats donned "Otto" decals on their helmets during the Motor City Bowl.





COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

They range from Paddy Driscoll, a halfback for the 'Cats from 1915-16, to Pat Fitzgerald, a two-time All-American, Chuck Bednarik and Bronko Nagurski award winner, who was NU's most recent inductee in 2008. 

1949 ROSE BOWL



GAME SUMMARY

Northwestern's first bowl appearance came on Jan. 1, 1949, when the Wildcats—considered by many to be the surprise team of the season—knocked off California in the 1949 Rose Bowl, 20-14.

The Wildcats got on the scoreboard first when left halfback Frank Aschenbrenner burst through the right side for a 73-yard touchdown, at the time the longest run from scrimmage in Rose Bowl history. Jim Farrar's extra-point made the lead 7-0. On Cal's next play, All-American back Jackie Jensen scampered 67 yards over the left end to tie the game at 7-7. The score remained deadlocked until midway through the second quarter when Art Murakowski capped a 78-yard drive

with a one-yard plunge into the end zone for a 13-7 lead. The touchdown was marred by controversy as Murakowski fumbled the ball in the end zone, but the officials ruled it had crossed the goal line first.

Early in the third quarter, California lost Jensen to a back injury, and many felt the Wildcats would roll through the remainder of the game. This was not the case as the Bears converted a Wildcat fumble into a 56-yard touchdown drive and a 14-13 lead heading into the fourth quarter. With the clock winding down, the Wildcats had the ball at their own 12-yard line and seemingly needed a miracle to win. Early in the drive, NU came up with its only pass completion of the game, an Aschenbrenner to Donald Stonesifer connection which put Northwestern on the California 45-yard line. Two plays later, on a direct snap from center, right halfback Ed Tunnicliff reaped the benefits of excellent blocking and raced 43 yards down the sidelines to give NU a 19-14 lead. Farrar's extra-point increased the Wildcat lead to six at 20-14 with 2:59 remaining.

The Bears gave it one final shot, but Loran "Pee Wee" Day intercepted the ball at the five-yard-line inside the final minute. Two keepers by NU quarterback Don Burson ran out the clock and the Wildcats brought home the roses.



GAME SUMMARY

The 1995 Wildcat team was the college football story of the season, shocking the experts in capturing the team's first winning season since 1971, and first bowl game appearance since the 1949 Rose Bowl.

USC scored first in the opening minutes of the game, but NU quickly evened the score when Darnell Autry capped off a 68-yard scoring drive with a three-yard touchdown run. The Trojan offense attacked in the second quarter, scoring on two touchdowns and a field goal. Brian Gowins kicked a 29-yard field goal to cap a drive that began when Tim Scharf forced a USC fumble with 12 seconds remaining in the half, cutting the gap to 24-10.

In the third quarter, Gowins started NU's scoring bonanza with a 28-yard field goal. The Wildcats then completed an on-side kick, which Josh Barnes scooped up. Three minutes later, Autry scored on a nine-yard run to narrow the gap to 24-19. USC struck back with a touchdown midway through the quarter, but the 'Cats answered with Schnur's one-yard TD plunge. NU took the lead for the first time early in the fourth when Autry ran two yards for his third touchdown of the game. USC regained the lead for good with a field goal on the next possession and then converted a rare Schnur interception into a touchdown. The Wildcats gave it one last effort late in the game. Gowins' 48-yard field goal attempt with 35 seconds left had the distance, but hit the left upright and bounced out.

Steve Schnur had a career-best day, connecting on 23-of-39 passes for 336 yards with one rushing touchdown.



GAME SUMMARY

Northwestern defied the odds again in 1996, capturing its second-consecutive Big Ten Championship and the third January 1 bowl game in school history. The Wildcats traveled to Orlando, Fla., to take on the ninth-ranked Tennessee Volunteers in the 1997 CompUSA Florida Citrus Bowl.

Despite rallying from a 21-0 first quarter deficit to tie the score, Peyton Manning and Tennessee were too much for Northwestern as the Volunteers posted a 48-28 victory.

Manning threw two TDs and ran for another as the Vols built a 21-0 lead with 2:00 left in the first quarter. Northwestern hung tough, though, and it paid off as Darnell Autry cut

the lead to 21-7 on a two-yard run midway through the second quarter. Steve Schnur then hooked up with Brian Musso, a little over four minutes later, on a 22-yard scoring strike to cut the lead to seven.

Almost immediately, NU got the ball back as Tim Scharf jarred the ball loose from the runner and Mike Nelson recovered for the Wildcats. Autry then broke free on a 28-yard scoring scamper to knot the score at 21-21.

The Volunteers went back up by seven and 30 seconds later, added a field goal as time expired to go up, 31-21, at half. On the third play of the second half, Tennessee intercepted a Schnur pass and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown and a 38-21 lead. NU would add one more score on a 22-yard TD pass from Schnur to D'Wayne Bates, but it wasn't enough.

Schnur threw for 228 yards and two scores. Barry Gardner led the way on defense with 10 tackles.



GAME SUMMARY

When the 2000 college football season began, the idea of Northwestern and Nebraska meeting in a bowl game was nearly laughable. After all, the Wildcats were coming off a 3-8 season in 1999, while the Cornhuskers began the season ranked No. 1 in the country.

Yet on December 30, the two teams with 'N' on the helmet stood toe-to-toe on the astroturf housed by the Alamodome in San Antonio.

Northwestern gave the Huskers fits in the early part of the game, and even held a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter. However, it was all Nebraska from that point on, as the Huskers outscored the 'Cats 31-7 before halftime and then tacked on 28 unanswered points in the second stanza for the win.

Nebraska drew first blood with a 15-yard touchdown run by Dan Alexander just 2:11 into the contest before Northwestern got on the board with a 44-yard Tim Long field goal three minutes later. In the second quarter, the Wildcats briefly took the lead when Zak Kustok found Teddy Johnson in the corner of the end zone for a 10-yard TD reception.

The lead lasted all of 20 seconds. Nebraska stormed back, as QB Eric Crouch scampered 50 yards for a touchdown, starting a 24-point explosion. Down 31-10, Northwestern briefly revived itself when All-American running back Damien Anderson broke off a 69-yard touchdown run with just 1:10 left before halftime. The Huskers took the momentum right back, however, as Crouch hit Bobby Newcombe with a 58-yard TD pass to give Nebraska a 38-17 halftime lead.

Anderson finished the game with 149 yards on 18 carries to lead NU.



GAME SUMMARY

In what turned out to be one of the more exciting bowl games of the 2003 season, Bowling Green and quarterback Josh Harris got the final word with Northwestern and Jason Wright. Harris and Wright turned in two of the more impressive postseason performances and shared the game's MVP honors. The Wildcats led for three-plus quarters until Harris fired an 11-yard TD pass with 11:32 remaining in the game, which gave BGSU a 21-17 advantage.

NU countered, however, thanks to an 88-yard kickoff return by Wright. Noah Herron, who tallied two touchdowns, scored on a 2-yard scamper with 10:01 left to put the 'Cats back in front, 24-21. But Harris and

the Falcons had one more scoring drive left in them, and NU was unable to muster an offensive threat on its final possession. Wright finished with a bowl and school-record 336 all-purpose yards. He totaled 237 rushing yards, also a bowl mark.

Harris completed 38-of-50 passes for 386 yards—all Motor City Bowl marks. NU's secondary helped control the Falcons early, picking off three BGSU passes.

Luis Castillo, named the bowl's UAW Lineman of the Game, had eight tackles (five solos). Northwestern ran for a bowl-record 357 yards. Herron added 80 yards on 12 carries.

GAME SUMMARY

Despite returning two interceptions for touchdowns and winning the turnover battle 4-3, Northwestern fell 50-38 to No. 17 UCLA in the 72nd annual Sun Bowl held in El Paso, Texas.

NU jumped to an early 22-0 first-quarter lead when Kevin Mims and Nick Roach each returned UCLA quarterback Drew Olson interceptions for touchdowns. The two defensive touchdowns followed a Joel Howells' 33 yard field goal and sandwiched a 19-yard Mark Philmore reverse for a touchdown. Northwestern's defense picked off Olson three times in the first quarter alone, equaling the number of interceptions Olson threw in his first 11 games combined.

The Bruins, however, came storming back from the 22-0 deficit, scoring 36 unanswered points for a 36-22 lead. Amado Villarreal booted a 31-yard field goal at the end of the third quarter to halt the UCLA scoring string.

The Wildcats mounted a furious comeback. A Brett Basanez touchdown pass to Philmore cut the score to 36-31 with 2:29 left in the game. Then, UCLA's Brandon Breazzell recovered NU's onside kick and returned it for a touchdown. The Wildcats came charging back, scoring on Shaun Herbert's 5-yard TD catch with 24 seconds left, trimming the UCLA lead to 43-38. Then the unthinkable happened. Breazzell returned another onside kick for a score to ice the contest with 18 seconds left.

Despite the disheartening defeat, Northwestern set a Sun Bowl record with 584 yards of offense, with 448 coming courtesy of Brett Basanez.



GAME SUMMARY

C.J. Bachér tied a Valero Alamo Bowl record with three touchdowns passes and threw for more than 300 yards, but No. 21 Missouri kicked a game-tying field goal late in the fourth quarter before defeating No. 23 Northwestern in overtime, 30-23.

In a game against former Heisman finalist Chase Daniel, Bachér won the battle of the QB's. The fifth-year senior completed 27-of-43 passes for 304 yards and three scores. Miz-zou's offense came into the game averaging almost 500 yards per game, but was held to under 300 yards in regulation.

Eric Peterman opened the scoring with a 35-yard scoring reception in the first quarter. Rasheed Ward took a season-long 46-yard

catch into the end zone to begin the second half before Ross Lane gave the Wildcats a 23-20 advantage with an acrobatic 23-yard TD grab late in the third quarter. Ward finished the game with a career-best 101 receiving yards on seven catches.

Senior Tyrell Sutton came back from a wrist injury in the eighth game of the year to record his 16th-career 100-yard rushing game. He finished with 114 yards on 29 carries, adding 29 yards on five catches.

Northwestern held its 23-20 lead until late in the fourth quarter when Missouri's Jeff Wolfert made his third field goal of the contest. He had another chance to end the game in regulation, but his 44-yard effort as time expired sailed wide right. The Tigers scored a TD on their opening possession of overtime before keeping the Wildcats out of the end zone to secure the victory.



GAME SUMMARY

Senior Mike Kafka broke an Outback Bowl record with a school-record 532 passing yards, throwing for four scores and running for another to lead a furious Northwestern comeback to force overtime, but the Wildcats ultimately fell to Auburn, 38-35.

With NU trailing by 14 and three minutes to play, Kafka scrambled for a 2-yard score to draw the Wildcats within eight, 35-27, after the extra point was blocked. On the ensuing Auburn possession, Brad Phillips forced a fumble recovered by Sherrick McManis, setting up a Kafka to Sidney Stewart 18-yard strike with 1:15 to go. A tricky 2-point conversion pass from Andrew Brewer to Brendan Mitchell tied the game.

A fumble on the ensuing kick gave NU the ball back again, but a field goal attempt went wide to force overtime. After Auburn kicked a field goal on their possession, Northwestern first attempted one of its own, but it clanged off the right upright. Auburn drew a roughing the kicker penalty to give NU another shot, however. A fake field goal on fourth-and-goal from the 2 was not successful, ending the game.

Kafka recovered from five interceptions in the game to set NCAA records for total plays by an individual (98) and total plays by a team (115). He hit Brewer for two scoring strikes and also found Drake Dunsmore in the flat before Dunsmore broke several tackles on a 66-yard catch-and-run touchdown scamper.

Brewer finished with 133 yards receiving while Dunsmore had 120. Zeke Markshausen caught 12 passes while Stewart caught 10.

GAME SUMMARY

Trailing 31-9 midway through the third quarter, Northwestern staged a furious rally at the inaugural TicketCity Bowl, pulling within one touchdown before falling to Texas Tech, 45-38.

Texas Tech held a 10-0 lead after the first before NU got on the board in the second with a 15-play, 78-yard drive capped by a Colter one-yard rush. The PAT failed, making it 10-6 before TTU pushed its lead to 24-6 at the half.

The third quarter was a wild one on the scoreboard, with both teams combining for 32 points. NU forced a fumble on the opening kickoff of the second half, converting the turnover into an 18-yard Stefan Demos field goal, but Texas Tech got an 86-yard touchdown run on the next play from scrimmage to make the score 31-9 with 11:05 left in the third. Kain Colter scored on the ensuing drive on a 15-yard rush before he found Josh Rooks on a two-point conversion pass to make it 31-17. After Texas Tech scored another touchdown, Northwestern recovered an onside kick attempt and needed just two plays to punch it in on a four-yard Evan Watkins' rush, making the score 38-24 entering the fourth.

NU scored on its third-straight drive when Watkins found Demetrius Fields for an 18-yard touchdown on fourth-and-four, cutting the deficit to 38-31 with 10:33 left to play. Texas Tech kept punching, extending its lead back to 45-31 with 7:13 left during a drive that saw Hunter Bates, NU's leading tackler with 11 at that point, carted off the field with a major leg injury.

Jordan Mabin kept the 'Cats alive with an 39-yard interception return for a touchdown to make the score 45-38 with 5:37 left, but Texas Tech all but ran out the clock on its next drive to secure the win.

2011 MEINEKE CAR CARE BOWL OF TEXAS



GAME SUMMARY

Appearing in a bowl game for a fourth straight year, Northwestern came out on the short end of 33-22 outcome against Texas A&M in the Meineke Car Care Bowl of Texas. NU scored the first touchdown of the game but TAMU ran off 27 straight points to take command.

In the final game of his NU career, quarterback Dan Persa established himself as Division I's (FBS or FCS) all-time record-holder in completion percentage. Persa wraps up his tenure at 72.7 percent (460-of-633), besting the previous NCAA record of 70.4 as set by Hawaii's Colt Brennan.

Senior safety Brian Peters came up with his 12th career interception in the game, giving him sole possession of third place on NU's all-time list, with three of those coming in bowl games.

Against the Aggies, Persa threw for 213 yards, but the Wildcats were held in check by a stout A&M defense that collected eight sacks on the day. NU gained a 7-3 lead early in the second quarter when Houston native Venric Mark scored his first career rushing touchdown on a pitch from Persa. That score capped a 13-play drive that ate up nearly five minutes off the clock. Texas A&M, however, then dominated the game's next 25 minutes, running off 27 unanswered points to take a 30-7 lead with 5:59 remaining in the third quarter.

The Wildcats responded and scored back-to-back touchdowns to cut the TAMU lead to eight, 30-22. But A&M then converted a third-and-13 deep in its own territory before gaining another first on a circus catch that set up a field goal and put the game on ice, 33-22, with 30 seconds to play.

Northwestern jumped out to a fast 13-0 lead at the 2013 TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl and rode an NU-bowl-record four interceptions to a 34-20 victory over Mississippi State and its first 10-win season since 1995. The Gator Bowl win also gives Fitzgerald his 50th as NU's head coach, making him Northwestern's all-time leader in victories by himself.

The Wildcats' four interceptions matched the program's previous bowl best set in the 1949 Rose Bowl, which Northwestern won over California. Mississippi State QB Tyler Russell, who was responsible for all four interceptions, had thrown only six picks in the Bulldogs' 12 regular season games this year.

With a game-high 10 tackles and a near interception late in the game, Jared Carpenter was named the 2013 Gator Bowl MVP.

Offensively, quarterback and Florida native Trevor Siemian finished 12-of-20 passing for 120 yards—including several clutch third-down conversions—and one rushing touchdown. Among his most popular targets on

the day was freshman superback Dan Vitale, who led the 'Cats with seven catches for 82 yards.

As they have all season, the Wildcats started fast when, on the third play from scrimmage, senior DL Quentin Williams dropped into coverage and intercepted Mississippi State's Tyler Russell. Williams went untouched 24 yards on the return for his first career touchdown and a quick 7-0 Northwestern advantage.

The Bulldogs regrouped on their next drive and moved inside the Wildcats red zone, but the NU defense answered the bell again when safety Ibraheim Campbell stepped in front of a Russell pass on the sideline for his fourth career interception.

Northwestern brought a 13-10 lead into the locker room but found itself in a tied game early in the third. Siemian led a quick six-play, 76-yard TD drive to restore an NU lead, then scored on a 4-yard TD rush of his own to put the 'Cats ahead by 14. MSU would pull with one score early in the fourth, but cornerback Nick VanHoose helped ice the win with an interception and long return to set up Mark's 12th rushing TD of the year and a bowl-clinching score.


