

BRIAN PATTERSON SPORTS PERFORMANCE CENTER



An exciting new chapter in the storied history of Rice Stadium and Rice Athletics is now taking shape in the north end zone of the historic facility with the construction of the Brian Patterson Sports Performance Center.

The fully-funded \$31.5 million project includes a 60,000-square-foot, two-story structure that will house a weight room, a home team locker room, coaching and staff offices, an auditorium, a football team lounge and areas for training and sports medicine that include hydrotherapy, plunge pools and exam rooms. The weight room and sports medicine areas will be available to student-athletes from all sports at Rice.

The new building will have a glass wall on the side facing the football field that offers a view of the weight rooms on the ground and second floors. The other three sides will be made of brick that complements the color of the brick on the rest of the stadium. White columns supporting the roof will be similar to the columns in other parts of the stadium. A concrete ramp will provide access to the football field.

The tarp-covered concrete area by the north end zone will be torn down to make room for the building. Part of the \$31.5 million cost includes a \$500,000 project to relocate electrical switchgear in that area; storm and sewer lines will be rerouted.

The architect for the project is HKS, which built the Cowboys stadium in Arlington, Texas, and the Colts stadium in Indianapolis. Anslow Bryant is the general contractor.



DAVID BAILIFF HEAD COACH NINTH SEASON

David Bailiff embarks upon his ninth season at Rice facing challenges that none of his predecessors experienced, challenges which are the byproduct of delivering an unparalleled standard of success on the field and in the classroom.

In eight seasons on South Main, Bailiff has built a program that has become one of the most consistent in Conference USA. The Owls enter 2015 with the longest active bowl streak (three, which is also the longest in school history) and have produced the most wins in school history over a two (18) and three (25) year period. Rice's 18-9 mark from 2013-14 is also the second best of any FBS program in Texas. He has led the Owls to two of the three 10-win seasons in school history and has won eight or more games three times, matching Jess Neely for the most at Rice.

Rice's 30-3 win over Fresno State in the Hawai'i Bowl was its third bowl championship in four games for Bailiff, joining wins in the 2008 Texas Bowl and 2012 Armed Forces Bowl.

Bailiff has twice been honored by his peers as C-USA Coach of the Year (2008 & 2013) and after leading the Owls to their first outright conference championship in 56 years in 2013, he joined Art Briles (Baylor), Mark Dantonio (Michigan State), Gus Malzahn (Auburn) and David Shaw

(Stanford) as finalists the Bear Bryant Coach of the Year award. He was also honored by the San Antonio Express News as its Co-Sportsman of the Year.

While reaching new heights on the field, Bailiff's teams continue to excel in the classroom while also making a profound impact on the Houston community. For the second time in a four year span, the Owls were honored by the American Football Coaches Association with its Academic Achievement Award, having posted a 100 percent graduation rate. Rice has led Conference USA football teams in GPA in five of his eight seasons.

He was honored with the Greater Houston Football Coaches Association's John Kelley Distinguished Service Award and by the Conference USA Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) Coaches Choice Award winner for 2011-12. He was also cited by the Houston Press as "Houston's Best Sports Role Model" in its 2013 Best of Houston edition.

Bailiff's staff has made the state of Texas a priority in recruiting, solidifying relationships with high school coaches throughout the state and the result has shown itself both in the team success and in the number of players reaching the NFL.

The Owls have eight players taken in the NFL Draft during Bailiff's tenure, matching the output of the previous 22 years prior to his arrival and they have had at least one player drafted in five consecutive drafts, the longest streak since a five seasons from 1979-83. A total of six players from his first five recruiting classes have been selected.

In the 2014 NFL Draft, Phillip Gaines became the second Bailiff product in as many years to be taken in the first three rounds when he was selected by Kansas City in third round.

His efforts in Texas have also seen the Owls increase their walk-on

program. Most recently, the walk-on program produced 2014 co-captain Matt Simonette as well as standout defensive end and Academic All-American Brian Nordstrom.

He has also made good on his promise to keep the Owls active in community work, as the Owls have been tireless in their efforts with local schools as well as reaching out to Rice's diverse student population through an annual International Students' Clinic each August. In July of 2009, Bailiff accepted an invitation to join with four other college football coaches on a goodwill tour to visit military personnel stationed in Afghanistan and again honored our troops in 2011 by participating as a driver in the "Crossing of America" tour. The Owls also are regular participants in efforts to send care packages to members of the armed forces deployed overseas.

The Rice football team was honored by the Texas Association of Partners in Education with their TAPE's Crystal Award for the program the Owls conducted in 2007 with the students at Arizona Fleming Elementary School in Houston. The Owls support of Big Brothers helped Rice Athletics be honored in 2012 as one of the Houston chapter's Community Partners of the Year.

In 2008, the Owls endured a series of challenges as well as the aftermath of Hurricane Ike and produced the first 10-win season for Rice since 1949 and the Owls' first victory in a bowl game since their memorable win over Alabama in the 1954 Cotton Bowl. For his efforts, Bailiff was honored by his conference peers with his first Conference USA Coach of the Year honor.

Bailiff came to Rice after three seasons as the head coach at Texas State University in San Marcos where he posted a 21-15 record while leading the Bobcats to their first Southland Conference championship

and the semifinals of the NCAA Division 1-AA playoffs in 2005.

He produced a total of 14 All Southland Conference first team selections, and 13 players who were named to the academic all-conference squad in his last two years.

The 2005 season was truly a magical one. The Bobcats went 9-2 during the regular season and earned the school's first berth in the Division I-AA playoffs.

In their first game, the Bobcats stormed back from a 35-16 deficit against Division I-AA national power Georgia Southern to score 34 unanswered points and beat the Eagles 50-35. The Cats then defeated Cal Poly 14-7 to move on to the national semifinals. Only a 40-37 overtime loss to Northern Iowa stood between Texas State and an appearance in the Division I-AA title game.

Bailiff was named the American Football Coaches Association's Region 5 Coach of the Year and finished third in the voting for the Eddie Robinson Award presented annually to the top coach in Division I-AA. Prior to being named Texas State head coach, Bailiff spent three seasons on the staff at TCU. He served as the Horned Frogs' defensive coordinator in both 2002 and 2003 while working with the team's defensive linemen.

The 2003 Horned Frogs posted an 11-2 record and were ranked 25th in the final Associated Press writer's poll and 24th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Bailiff was part of a staff which built a tradition on defense at TCU. During his three seasons in Fort Worth, the Horned Frogs were ranked 24th, 1st and 38th in the country in total defense and 10th, first and ninth against the run.

In 2002, TCU allowed just 240.2 yards of total offense per game which led the country. The Horned Frogs surrendered an average 64.8 yards on the ground. During the year, the Frogs held Tulane to a school-record -53 yards rushing. TCU also ranked second in the country in pass efficiency defense, al-

lowing opponents to complete less than 39 percent of their passes.

Six TCU defensive players earned all-conference accolades in 2002 including Conference USA Defensive Player of the year and Second-Team All-American LaMarcus MacDonald.

While at TCU, the Horned Frogs played in a bowl game every season - the galleryfurniture.com Bowl (2001), AXA Liberty Bowl (2002) and the Plains Capital Fort Worth Bowl (2003).

He began his coaching career as the defensive line coach at New Braunfels High School (1982-84). He went into private business from 1984-88 before returning to the coaching ranks as a defensive graduate assistant coach at Texas State in 1988. He was elevated to the Bobcats' defensive line coach in 1989.

Bailiff left Texas State in 1992 for an assistant coaching position at New Mexico. He returned to Texas State in 1997 as defensive coordinator and added assistant head coach responsibilities to his role in 1999.

It was in 1999 that Bailiff was selected the NCAA Division I-AA Assistant Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association. While at TCU, Bailiff was also honored as the Top Assistant Football Coach by the All-American Football Foundation following the Horned Frogs' 2002 season.

As a player, Bailiff was named All-Lone Star Conference as well as All-America honorable mention while playing at Texas State from 1977-80. He served as a team captain in 1980 and was named honorable mention to the Lone Star Team of the Decade.

Bailiff is married to the former Angie Daniels of Versailles, Mo. He has a daughter, Brooke and the couple has twin 19-year-old sons, Grayson and Gregory.

DARRELL PATTERSON

ASST. HEAD COACH/RUN GAME COORD. LINEBACKERS NINTH SEASON

Darrell Patterson is back for his ninth season at Rice University and his fourth as Assistant Head Coach. After coaching the running backs during his first three seasons, he enters his sixth year of coaching the Owl's linebackers, his fifth as Special Teams Coordinator and his second as Run Game Coordinator.

Patterson enters the 2015 campaign with perhaps his deepest lineup of linebackers, highlighted by junior Alex Lyons, who led the team in tackles in his first year as a starter in 2014. He is joined by senior Nick Elder at the top of the depth chart heading into fall camp, and the pair are bolstered by underclassmen Emanuel Ellerbee, Tabari McGaskey and Nick Uretsky.

Senior James Farrimond returns once again to handle the Owls punting chores while the placekicking job will be settled during fall camp with the arrival of freshman Jack Fox to compete with Taylor Knopf, Anthony Price and Farrimond, who led the kickers with 49 points on eight field goals and 25 PATs in his first career action handling kicks.

In his five seasons overseeing the Owls special teams, Patterson has produced one All-American (punter Kyle Martins) and one fresh-

man All-American (kick returner Mario Hull) in addition to the most productive kicker in school history, Chris Boswell who departed with all the school records for field goals and kick scoring. While working with the Owls' running backs in 2009, Patterson coached Charles Ross to an All C-USA freshman team effort. Both Boswell (Houston) and All C-USA deep snapper Trevor Gillette (Jacksonville) signed free agent contracts with the NFL in the spring of 2014.

In addition to his coaching duties, Patterson also continues to spearhead Rice's recruiting efforts in Canada, where he had a playing career in the CFL for seven seasons (1984-90). The Owls have signed a total of eight Canadians in the past seven years, including All C-USA offensive tackle Scott Mitchell and All C-USA tight end Luke Willson. Two of those signees (Willson and Christian Covington) were drafted into the NFL. In 2015, Canadian product Peter Godber is slated to move into the starting spot at right guard.

Patterson joined the Rice coaching staff on February 20, 2007 after two seasons coaching the linebackers at Stanford University.

Patterson's collegiate playing experience took place at Texas Christian University, where he was a standout linebacker from 1979-82. He is a member of the TCU Hall of Fame and remains the school's all-time leader in tackles (544), unassisted tackles (286), and assisted tackles (258).

He was selected in the sixth round of the 1983 NFL Draft by the New York Giants, but made his way to the Canadian Football League (CFL) for a seven-year career-playing for the Winnipeg Blue Bombers from 1984-88 and the Hamilton Tiger Cats from 1988-90. Patterson won a Grey Cup championship with Winnipeg in 1984 and was on the

runner-up team with Hamilton in 1989.

Following his playing days, Patterson began his coaching career as an intern for the British Columbia Lions in 1991. His coaching career has, since then, led him to Akron (1992-94), Temple (1995-96), Kentucky (1997-00), Arkansas State (2001), Baylor (2002), Southern Methodist (2003-04), and Stanford (2005-07). He also had a coaching stint with Ottawa of the CFL in 1995 as the defensive line and special teams coach.

While coaching at Southern Methodist, Baylor, and Arkansas State, Patterson coached the linebackers. At Baylor, he coached linebacker John Garrett, who went on to sign an NFL free agent contract. Patterson coached defensive tackle Larry Chester during his two seasons at Temple. Chester went on to sign an NFL contract with the Indianapolis Colts.

During his four seasons at Kentucky, Patterson was part of a staff that advanced to two bowl games: the 1998 Outback Bowl versus Penn State and the 1999 Music City Bowl against Syracuse. While at Kentucky, Patterson coached safeties Willie Gary and Anthony Wajda to All-SEC honors, as well as Freshman All-America David Jackson. Patterson graduated with a bachelor's degree in Human Relations from TCU in 1984.

He and his wife, Julie, whom he met while playing professionally in Canada, have three children together: a son, Michael, who was a three-year letterman and 2012 Rice graduate, and two daughters, Monika and Meghan, who are both currently undergraduates at Rice. Meghan is a walk-on member of the Rice volleyball team in 2015.



LARRY EDMONDSON CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR QUARTERBACKS SEVENTH SEASON

Larry Edmondson enters his seventh year with the Owls and his second as Co-Offensive Coordinator with Billy Lynch, while continuing to coach the Rice quarterbacks (fifth year). Edmondson joined the Rice staff on January 30, 2009 as the Owls' wide receiver coach.

Edmondson heads into 2015 with an experienced starter in senior Driphus Jackson, who capped a memorable first year at the helm by being named the Owls Most Outstanding Player in the 2014 Hawai'i Bowl. Jackson finished his first season as the starting quarterback by throwing for the third-most touchdowns in school history and finishing third nationally by averaging 14.9 yards per completion. He will be backed up by strong-armed junior Tyler Stehling and sophomore Nate German.

Edmondson is entering his 27th year of college coaching, including 14 years of coaching wide receivers. He was the wide receivers coach at SMU from 2004 to 2007, Auburn in 1997-98, Mississippi State in 1996, LSU from 1991-94 and at Southern Miss from 1988-90. He has also served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at

SMU (2002-03) and Louisiana-Lafayette (1999-2001).

While at SMU, Edmondson guided Bobby Chase to All-C-USA honors in 2005 and Emmanuel Sanders to All-Conference and freshman All-America honors in 2006. As the offensive coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette, he constructed an offense that set six school records in 2001 and was credited with the development of sophomore quarterback Jon Van Cleave, who led the Sun Belt Conference in passing yards per game.

In addition to coaching wide receivers at Auburn, Edmondson also oversaw the Tigers recruiting efforts. Auburn won the 1997 SEC West Division championship and went on to defeat Clemson in the 1998 Peach Bowl.

A 1983 graduate of Texas A&M where he lettered as a tight end and was a teammate of former Houston Texans head coach Gary Kubiak, Edmondson began his coaching career as a graduate assistant with the Aggies from 1984 to 1986. He served as a GA at Arizona in 1987 before joining Curly Hallman's staff at Southern Miss as wide receivers coach in 1988.

In his first year at USM, the Golden Eagles went 10-2 including a 38-18 win over UTEP in the Independence Bowl. Southern Miss opened the 1990 season with a win over Florida State and played in the All-American Bowl that year, and also posted wins over both Alabama and Auburn during his time there.

Married (Cara) with two children, son Sean, who works as a graduate assistant for the Owls, and daughter Taylor.



BILLY LYNCH **CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR** **WIDE RECEIVERS** **FIFTH SEASON**

Billy Lynch enters his second year as Co-Offensive Coordinator and his fifth coaching Owls' wide receivers. Lynch shares offensive oversight with quarterbacks coach Larry Edmondson.

In his first four seasons, Lynch developed a productive unit of wideouts, including a pair of 2014 graduates in Jordan Taylor and Mario Hull who signed free agent NFL contracts and a third, 2013 graduate Donte Moore, who was in Dallas' rookie camp this past spring.

Taylor completed his career as the Owls ranked second in receiving yards (2,585) and receiving touchdowns (20) and third in receptions (175) while Hull moved into the Owls season top 10 by catching a team-leading eight scoring tosses in 2014.

This season, Lynch will be looking to have senior Dennis Parks pick up where he left off in the Hawai'i Bowl, when he topped 100 yards for the first time in his career. He is the leading active receiver on the squad with 65 career catches for 1,009 yards and five touchdowns. He will be joined in the rotation by junior Zach Wright (25/299/3) and sophomore James Mayden, who showed a flair for the explosive play by averaging 32.7 yards on his seven catches as a true freshman.

Rice's drive to the 2013 C-USA Championship was highlighted by the big play production of Taylor and Parks. Three of Taylor's eight touchdown receptions were from 60 yards out or longer, including a 75-yard bomb from Taylor McHargue that

set a C-USA Championship game record. Parks led the team by averaging 17.5 yards per catch while finishing second to Taylor in catches and receiving yards.

Taylor emerged as a vital component of the Owls 2012 air attack, punctuated by his record-setting effort in the Armed Forces Bowl. He set a Rice bowl game record with 153 yards and three touchdowns on nine receptions to earn Rice MVP honors in the game. Lynch also guided the transition of Sam McGuffie from running back to receiver and the senior responded with 54 receptions and five touchdowns.

Lynch joined the Rice coaching staff on Feb. 22, 2011 after six seasons at Indiana where he developed some of the most productive receivers in Hoosiers' history.

In 2010 his top three receivers, Damarlo Belcher (78/832/4), Terrance Turner (67/681/3) and Doss (63/706/7 touchdowns) topped 60 catches and 700 yards and the unit set a school record with 3,446 total yards.

In 2009, Tandon Doss became Lynch's second All-Big Ten receiver as he earned first team honors (media) and second team recognition from the league's coaches.

As sophomores in 2009, Doss and Belcher became the first duo in IU history to each collect 60-plus receptions and 700-plus yards in a season. Their 138 combined catches rank first in Hoosier lore and 1,732 yards sit second.

Doss finished second in the Big Ten in yards per game (80.2) and third in the league and tied for 22nd nationally in catches per game (6.64). He closed out the year second on IU's single-season receptions list and fifth in the school's single-season yardage rankings.

The 2008 corps, led by Ray Fisher and Andrew Means, saw four receivers reach 25 receptions and post over 275 yards. It also featured one of the top true freshman duos in IU history - Belcher and Doss.

Fisher and Means, who signed a professional baseball contract with the Cincinnati Reds in 2008, became the 13th and 14th Hoosiers, respectively, to go over

100 career receptions and 1,000 career yards, joining Hardy as wideouts under Lynch to enter the elite club.

Belcher (25/337/2) and Doss (14/186/1) combined for the second-highest receiving yardage total by a true freshman duo in school history.

The 2007 season saw Lynch's wide receivers re-write the IU record books, as they recorded a school-record 3,073 yards. Hardy, who was selected in the second round (41st pick) by the Buffalo Bills, set new school marks with 16 receiving TDs and 79 catches. He finished his career as the school's all-time receiving yardage (2,740), receptions (191) and receiving touchdowns (36) leader. Hardy was a semi-finalist for the Biletnikoff Award, named All-America by five publications and selected first team All-Big Ten.

The 2006 Hoosiers finished third in the Big Ten in receiving yards per game. Hardy was second team All-Big Ten (51/722/10).

In 2005, Lynch tutored Hardy to one of the most prolific debut seasons IU has seen at wide receiver. Hardy finished with 61 receptions (fourth in school history), 10 touchdowns (tied for third all-time) and 893 yards (seventh all-time). In addition, his five 100-yard games were tied for the second most in a season in school history.

One of five assistant coaches that came from Miami (Ohio) University to Indiana, Lynch was the RedHawks' tight ends coach in 2004 and offensive graduate assistant in 2002-03. During his tenure in Oxford, Lynch assisted with a potent offense that led the nation at 43.0 points per game in 2003.

He spent his undergraduate years as a wide receiver and three-year letter winner at Ball State University, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in education in 2002. He led the Cardinals with 40 receptions his senior year. He also lettered three years in basketball, including the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons for then-BSU head coach and current Indiana assistant basketball coach Tim Buckley.

Billy and his wife, Carla, have four children, daughter Lindsey (9), and sons, Max (7), Ryan (6) and Michael (2).

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

CORNERBACKS

FIFTH SEASON

Chris Thurmond enters his fourth season as Rice's Defensive Coordinator and his fifth year overall coaching the Owls' cornerbacks.

In an era of astronomical passing numbers that have sent defensive averages spiraling, Thurmond's defenses have been a major factor in the Owls surge to the 2013 Conference USA Championship, three consecutive bowl berths for the first time in school history as well as the best win totals in school history over the past three seasons.

After a stretch of eight seasons when opponents averaged 465 yards per game, Rice has fashioned back-to-back years in which it has held opponents under 400 yards per game. The Owls allowed 385.5 in 2014 after finishing with 364.1 in 2013 for an average of 375 yards per game. They finished 30th in the country in total defense in 2013, their highest finish since 1994 when they finished 25th.

They have held 11 opponents to under 20 points over the past two years after holding just 13 teams to that figure in the previous combined nine years. Their average of 24.2 points per game was a drop of nearly nine from 2011 and the best by the Owls since 1991 (23.7).

The 2015 Owls were one of the nation's best in 4th down defense, holding opponents to a 25% success rate (5/20) and ranked 21st by holding opposing passers to a quarterback rating of 148.7.

This past spring, Bryce Callahan was signed by the Chicago Bears, joining

2014 draftee Phillip Gaines (3rd round/ Kansas City) as the latest in a long line of corners who have elevated their play under his direction. Thurmond saw Gaines finish second in the country in pass breakups as a junior and enter his senior year as the preseason defensive player of the year in the conference.

Thurmond originally joined the staff on Feb. 22, 2011, after spending the previous three seasons at Kentucky. In his first year with the Owls, Thurmond guided his younger corners through the challenge of early-than-expected playing time due to injuries to the veterans. At the end of the season, Callahan had earned Freshman All-America and Conference USA All Freshman honors after picking off six passes to lead the nation and defending 15 passes.

In his three seasons at Kentucky, the Wildcats advanced to bowl games each season -Liberty Bowl (2008), Music City Bowl (2009) and the BBVA CompassBowl (2010).

Thurmond had student-athletes go on to sign National Football League contracts two straight seasons. Kentucky cornerback Trevard Lindley earned second-team All-America honors in 2008 and established a UK career record for pass breakups. Despite being sidelined for much of his senior season in 2009, Lindley repeated All-SEC honors in 2009 and was drafted by the NFL's Philadelphia Eagles.

Defensive backs coached or recruited by Thurmond have been a part of three Super Bowl championship teams. Both Anthony Madison (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Roman Harper (New Orleans Saints), who Thurmond recruited to the University of Alabama, were members of Super Bowl XLIII and XLIV championship teams in 2009 and 2010, respectively. Thurmond also coached Green Bay Packer Charlie Peprah, who was part of the Super Bowl XLV championship team in 2011.

Between stints at Alabama (2001-02) and Kentucky (2008-10), Thurmond coached five seasons in the state of Texas. Highlighted by a trip to the Cotton Bowl following the 2004 season, he was the cornerbacks coach at Texas A&M from 2003-05.

He coached cornerbacks and was the recruiting coordinator for two seasons at the University of Houston (2006-07). He helped the Cougars advance to the 2006

Liberty Bowl and in 2007 was the interim head coach for UH when the team played in the Texas Bowl after head coach Art Briles became the coach at Baylor.

While at Houston, he coached cornerback Willie Gaston who was a second-team All-Conference USA selection and went on to play for the Baltimore Ravens.

During his two seasons coaching the cornerbacks at Alabama, the Crimson Tide won the 2001 Independence Bowl. The 2002 Alabama team led the SEC and ranked third nationally in total defense, posting the best record in the SEC Western Division. Eight Alabama players he either coached or recruited signed National Football League contracts.

Thurmond has also worked at Tulsa (1983-91, 1994), East Carolina (1992-93), Texas Christian (1995, 1998-2000) and Oklahoma (1996-97), coaching the cornerbacks or entire secondary unit during each of the stints.

During his second term at TCU, Thurmond helped guide the Horned Frogs to the 2000 Western Athletic Conference co-championship. TCU led the nation in scoring defense and total defense while ranking third in pass efficiency defense.

While at Tulsa in 1991, the Golden Hurricane ranked among the nation's leaders in pass defense efficiency. Tulsa capped the season with a win in the Freedom Bowl.

Thurmond has coached in 15 bowl games during his career and has coached or recruited numerous athletes who have gone on to play in the NFL including Gaines, Madison, Harper, Peprah, Lindley and Mark Anderson (Houston Texans).

A native of Sand Springs, Okla., Thurmond graduated from the University of Tulsa in 1975. He spent seven years as a high school coach in Oklahoma including head coach at his alma mater, Charles Page High School, before entering the college ranks. In 2015 he was inducted into Sand Springs Athletic Hall of Fame.

Thurmond's wife Paula and daughter Paige live in Little Rock, Ark.



LARRY HOEFER SAFETIES FOURTH SEASON

Texas native and longtime defensive coach Larry Hoefer is in his fourth year of coaching the talented group of Rice safeties. He joined David Bailiff's staff on February 6, 2012.

Hoefer's safeties have played a major role in the Owls defensive improvements that have sparked the Owls success over the past three years as the Owls have gone to three consecutive bowls, posted the most wins over that stretch in school history and captured the 2013 Conference USA title.

As a group, the Owls defensive backfield has picked off 25 passes over the last two years, while breaking up a total of 121 passes. They have held opponents to under 220 yards per game and opposing passers had an efficiency rating of 126.5. In 2015 he will debut a younger group of safeties after the graduation of stalwarts Julius White, Jaylon Finner, Malcolm Hill and Gabe Baker, but a group that saw extensive playing time in 2015 to prepare for their starting opportunity this season.

In Hoefer's first year on South Main, the Owls safety corps overcame the loss of two-year starter Corey Frazier at the start of the season as Paul Porras put together his best season and Julius White stepped into the void and finish third on the team in tackles. Porras led the Owls with 93 tackles while he and White shared the team lead with a pair of interceptions. The Owls safeties combined with the cornerbacks to hold opponents to only 21 touchdown passes, the fewest since 2005.

A veteran of 37 years of coaching, Hoefer came to Rice after eight seasons at Baylor where he coached both the safeties (2003-07) and linebackers (2008-10). Hoefer, who came to Baylor in 2003 with Guy Morriss from Kentucky, served as Baylor's defensive coordinator and safeties coach in 2007. He coached at least one All-Big 12 performer every year.

In his first year at Baylor, Hoefer coached the Bears' leading tackler in Maurice Lane, who had 129 stops at free safety en route to honorable mention All-Big 12 honors, and Derrick Cash, the team's fourth-leading tackler as a strong safety. Another pupil, weak safety Willie Andrews, led the team in interceptions and was third on the squad in tackles.

In 2004, Andrews earned first-team All-Big 12 honors as a safety from the Dallas Morning News and as a return specialist from the league's coaches, while Lane garnered first-team all-conference recognition from the San Antonio Express-News. Lane again paced the squad in tackles, while Andrews again ranked third in tackles and had a team-high three sacks.

Lane led the Bears in tackles for the third consecutive year in 2005 en route to first-team All-Big 12 honors from both The Associated Press and the Dallas Morning News. Andrews earned first-team All-Big 12 recognition from the league's coaches as a safety and was later selected in the seventh round of the 2006 NFL Draft.

In 2006, strong safety Maurice Linguist and free safety Dwain Crawford both earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors from the league's coaches. Jordan Lake was a consensus second-team All-Big 12 selection as a free safety in 2007 after leading the Bears with 120 total tackles.

In 2008 Hoefer coached linebacker Joe Pawelek, who ranked seventh nationally in both tackles (10.7 per game) and interceptions (0.5 per game) - the only player nationally ranked in the top 10 of both categories. Pawelek was named an All-American and consensus All-Big 12 player.

Hoefer spent two seasons as safeties coach on Morriss' Kentucky staff before making the move to Waco. He went to UK from Texas-El Paso, where he was defen-

sive coordinator and linebackers coach for the 2000 season. The Miners posted an 8-3 regular season record, were WAC co-champions and played in the Humanitarian Bowl. The bowl game marked Hoefer's sixth as a coach, in addition to four at Texas Tech and one (1988) during his previous stint at UTEP.

Using an eight-man front under Hoefer's guidance, UTEP reduced its rushing yards allowed from 208.2 yards per game in 1999 to 153.8 ypg in the 2000 season. UTEP held five of its league opponents under 100 yards rushing. The Miners also ranked 19th nationally in pass efficiency defense.

Hoefer worked for coach Spike Dykes at Texas Tech from 1994-99, where he coached the outside linebackers. Tech was bowl-eligible every season and played in the Cotton, Copper, Alamo and Independence bowls during Hoefer's tenure. Among his pupils were Marcus Coleman, a first-team All-American in 1995 and Ty Ardoine, each of whom played in the NFL. Hoefer also coached All-Big 12 picks Robert Johnson and Jody Brown. Tech ranked first in the nation for takeaways over a five-year period from 1993-97.

Hoefer had multiple responsibilities as an assistant at Missouri from 1989-93, working his way up from receivers coach to defensive coordinator and assistant head coach. His first term at UTEP, from 1982-88, was capped by a 10-win season and a berth in the 1988 Independence Bowl.

A native of Abilene, Texas, Hoefer stayed in his hometown and played defensive back at McMurry University, graduating in 1973. He was team captain and earned the squad's MVP honor.

Hoefer's first coaching stop was at Tarleton State from 1974-75 as a graduate assistant working with the defensive backs. He went on to coach at Big Spring (Texas) High School in 1976 and Abilene (Texas) High from 1977-80. Hoefer coached at West Texas State in 1981 before joining the UTEP staff for the first time.

Hoefer and his wife, Kathy, have three children and seven grandchildren.



MICHAEL SLATER DEFENSIVE LINE FOURTH SEASON

Michael Slater returns for his fourth season of coaching the Rice defensive line.

In his first three seasons, Slater has seen his defensive front become a disruptive force that has been instrumental in the Owls unprecedented success, overcoming multiple challenges thanks to the ability of his reserves to step into productive roles.

This past April, Slater saw Christian Covington selected by the Houston Texans, becoming the third Owls defensive line product to be drafted in his combined tenure on South Main. As a GA at Rice from 2009-11, Slater mentored future pros Cheta Ozougwu and Scott Solomon. In addition, 2014 senior Zach Patt earned an invitation to the Arizona Cardinals rookie camp.

In 2015, Slater welcomes back All C-USA Freshman selection Graysen Schantz in addition to Stuart Mouchantaf, who combined with Covington in 2013 on the interior before he was forced to sit out last season while recuperating from an injury. Those two are joined by senior Ross Winship as the most experienced members of the front wall.

Slater's front wall led the charge in 2014 as Rice set a school record with 39 sacks, and Patt set a single-game mark with five vs. FIU. In his first three seasons at the helm of the Rice defensive front, Slater's group has combined for 72 of the Owls 87 sacks, forced 19 fumbles and recovered 10.

No stranger to the Rice campus, Slater served for three seasons at Rice as a defensive graduate assistant, earning a Master's of Liberal Studies degree during his tenure while working with the defensive line. After his graduation in the spring of 2011, Slater spent one season as the Defensive Line coach at Angelo State before returning to Rice.

Slater coached at the high school level in the Houston area for 12 years, first at Alief Hastings for five seasons and most recently at Alief Taylor for seven years. He coached the defensive line and also coordinated special teams. As the defensive line coach at Taylor, he coached future Owl and Chicago Bear Cheta Ozougwu.

He began his coaching career while attending Southwest Texas State (now Texas State), where he served as a student assistant coach in 1993 before graduating with a degree in Agriculture/Animal Science.

Slater has one son, Kyle.



DAVID SLOAN TIGHT ENDS RECRUITING COORDINATOR SIXTH SEASON

Former All-Pro tight end David Sloan enters his fourth season of coaching the Owls tight ends in 2014, continuing to build the brand of the position inside the Rice offensive attack.

In 2014, Sloan was forced to shuffle his lineup as returning starter Connor Cella was lost to an injury. However thanks to solid contributions by Cole Hunt and Robby Wells in Cella's absence in addition to Cella's return to health as well as the incorporation of Luke Turner into the several offensive sets, Sloan heads into 2015 with multiple options.

While Sloan was juggling his lineup in 2014, one of his two tight ends to be drafted in 2013 continued to make a name for himself in 2014.

Luke Willson, who joined with Vance McDonald to allow Rice to match Stanford as the only schools to produce a pair of tight end draft picks in 2013, helped spark Seattle to a return trip to the Super Bowl. He caught a game-winning touchdown in the final minute vs. Carolina and then a game-tying, two-point conversion from

Russell Wilson during the Seahawks comeback playoff win over Green Bay.

Willson became the sixth Owl to win a Super Bowl ring, starting for Seattle in Super Bowl XLVIII and catching a pair of passes for 17 yards against Denver. Willson met McDonald in the NFC title game. McDonald was taken in the second round (55th overall) by the 49ers, the highest draft selection for Rice since Bert Emanuel (a former teammate of Sloan's) in 1994.

McDonald, who saw his 2014 playing time with San Francisco limited by an injury, finished his career ranked in the Owls top ten in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and became the first Owl since ND Kalu in 1996 to be invited to play in the Senior Bowl. Willson was a four-year starter who was drafted by the Toronto Argos of the CFL prior to his senior year and was a standout in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl.

Sloan is in his sixth season overall at Rice, having come to campus as a graduate assistant and also serving in a quality control position. When Sloan joined the Owls in 2010, he reunited with Rice head coach David Bailiff, who was on the staff at the University of New Mexico in 1993 when Sloan signed with the Lobos out of junior college.

A two-time Academic All-Conference selection while playing basketball at Fresno City College from 1990-91, Sloan made the jump to football in the fall of 1992.

He caught the eye of Bailiff after catching 13 passes for 254 yards and 4 touchdowns. He signed with New Mexico and earned All-WAC Honorable Mention as a junior in 1993. He improved on that effort as a senior, earning first-Team All-WAC honors and was named one of the Lobos' team co-captains after catching 24 receptions for 320 yards and 1 touchdown during his senior campaign.

After his senior year, he played in the Blue Gray All-Star Game, Senior Bowl and participated in NFL Scouting combine in Indianapolis.

Sloan was selected in the third round of the 1995 by the Detroit Lions and became a starter midway through his rookie season and the Lions won seven straight to earn a playoff spot. He enjoyed his best season in 1999, when he earned a spot in the Pro Bowl after catching 47 passes for 591 yards and four touchdowns as the Lions again reached the playoffs. Sloan started for the NFC in the 2000 Pro Bowl and was named as an alternate in 2001. He led the Lions with seven touchdown passes in 2001. He was signed by New Orleans in 2002 and retired after the 2003 season. He finished his NFL career with 199 receptions, for 2251 yards and 17 touchdowns including seven catches for 100 yards and two touchdowns in three playoff games.

He has two daughters: Trinity (11) and Bentley (9).



ANTHONY STEWARD

RUNNING BACKS SECOND SEASON

A.J. Steward was promoted to running backs coach on March 7, 2014 after spending the previous two seasons as an offensive graduate assistant.

In his first year at Rice, Steward saw underclassmen Jowan Davis and Darik Dillard step into the void created by the departed Charles Ross, rushing for a combined 1,608 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Steward originally joined the staff prior to the 2012 season as a GA after graduating from the University of Kansas with a BSE in Health and Physical Education.

Steward was a four-year letterman at Kansas. Originally recruited as a quarterback, Steward found his first playing time as a wide receiver before switching to tight end. He was a member of the 2008 Orange Bowl Championship team, earning the Otto Schnellbacher Scout Team Player of the Year as a quarterback, as well as the 2008 Insight Bowl champions.

He was a four-time member of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll.

Steward and wife Virginia make their home in Houston.



RONNIE VINKLAREK OFFENSIVE LINE SEVENTH SEASON

Ronnie Vinklarek enters his seventh season of coaching the Rice offensive line, having joined the Owls' football staff on February 28, 2009.

Vinklarek faces a rebuilding effort in 2015 after seeing three seniors who started all 13 games in 2014 graduate, but his efforts will be anchored by seniors Caleb Williams (39 career starts) and consensus preseason All C-USA pick Andrew Reue (26 starts). Sophomore Peter Godber is slated to step into one starting spot at guard after playing in 12 games as a reserve as a redshirt freshman. Junior Spencer Stanley emerged from the spring as the leading contender to replace Matt Simonette at center, while redshirt freshman Calvin Anderson head the depth chart at left tackle.

Two of Vinklarek's three graduating 2014 seniors, Ian Gray (Bears) and Nico Carlson (Cowboys), found their way into NFL rookie camps this past spring.

Vinklarek is no stranger to the Houston area or Conference USA. He coached the linemen at the University of Houston from 1988-

93 and at SMU from 2004-07. He also coached at the high school level in Houston, coaching the defensive line at Spring Branch High School in 1983 and was the offensive coordinator at Clear Lake High School 1994 in a district championship season and at Conroe High School in 1996.

While at Houston, he mentored the offensive line that protected Andre Ware during his Heisman Trophy winning season (1989) and was selected to coach in the 1990 Blue-Gray Game after helping UH to a 10-1 season. He originally came to Houston as a graduate assistant under former Houston Oilers and Washington Redskins head coach Jack Pardee and was promoted to full-time assistant in 1990.

Vinklarek coached in the NFL for three seasons. He broke into the league in 2000 with the Tennessee Titans as their defensive quality control, linebackers and special teams coach. He moved on to the Buffalo Bills in 2001 and coached their offensive line for two seasons. In 2002 the Bills offensive line paved the way for a 4,359-yard passer in Drew Bledsoe, a 1,439-yard rusher in Travis Henry and two 1,200-yard-plus receivers in Eric Moulds and Peerless Price.

Prior to joining the Owls, he coached the offensive line for the Edmonton Eskimos of the CFL. He broke into the coaching ranks as the seventh and eighth grade coach at Hill Country Middle School after graduating from Southwest Texas in 1981. From 1983 to 1984, was the defensive line coach for Spring Branch High School in Houston before becoming the defensive coordinator at Marble Falls (Tex-

as) High School from 1984-86.

He also served as offensive line coach at Oklahoma State (1998 & 1999), Valdosta State (1997), Middle Tennessee State (2003) as well as with the CFL's Birmingham Barracudas (1995).

A Flatonia, Texas, native, Vinklarek is married to the former Marianne Britz. The couple has two sons, Trevor and Trent.



SAM BENNETT **OFFENSIVE GRADUATE ASSISTANT** **SECOND SEASON**

Sam Bennett is in his second year with the Owls and serves as a graduate assistant on offense.

Bennett joined the Owls after working in private business for one year. He coached football, basketball and track at Scoggins Middle School in Frisco for one year after graduating from Texas Tech in December of 2010.

The son of former SMU head coach and current Baylor defensive coordinator Phil Bennett, Sam Bennett was a two-year letterman at SMU as a deep snapper, earning All C-USA Freshman honors in 2006.

He graduated from Highland Park High School where he was a starter on the Scots' 15-0 state championship squad. He played on the offensive line, blocking for future Detroit Lions quarterback Matthew Stafford as well as handling the deep snapping chores.

Bennett is single and lives in Houston.



SEAN EDMONDSON **DEFENSIVE GRADUATE ASSISTANT** **FOURTH SEASON**

Sean Edmondson is in his third year with the Owls and serves as a graduate assistant on defense.

Edmondson joined the Owls immediately after graduating from Texas State in 2012. He was a quality control coach in his first year before switching to a defensive GA in 2013.

He was a two-year letterman as a wide receiver at Allen High School and walked on at SMU. He transferred to Texas State where he served as a volunteer coach while completing his degree, majoring in Geography and minoring in Political Science.

The son of Owls' quarterback coach and co-offensive coordinator Larry Edmonson, Sean Edmondson and new wife Maddie make their home in Houston.



JOE JOHNSON **OFFENSIVE GRADUATE ASSISTANT** **THIRD SEASON**

Joe Johnson joined the Rice Football staff as a quality control coach in August of 2013 and became an offensive graduate assistant in the spring of 2014.

Originally from Plano, Johnson played in high school at Plano West and then moved on the University of North Texas where he was a four-year letterman and a four-year starter at center under Todd Dodge and Dan McCarney. He was named to the 2008 Sun Belt All-Freshman team and was the Mean Green Offensive Lineman of the Year. He was voted as one of the Mean Green team captains in 2011.

A member of the Sun Belt Conference Honor Roll, he graduated in 2011 with a degree in Sociology and a minor in marketing and management.

DEFENSIVE GRADUATE ASSISTANT SECOND SEASON

Frank Okam joined the Rice staff in the spring of 2014 as a defensive graduate assistant after completing his career in the NFL.

Okam was a four-year letterman at defensive tackle at Texas, where he earned All-America and All Big 12 honors. ASSISTANT ATHLETIC DIRECTOR/ ATHLETIC COMMUNICATIONS

TENTH SEASON

A veteran of 30 years on the Houston sports scene, Chuck Pool heads into his 10th year at the head of the Owls' publicity efforts.

He assumed his duties on August 23, 2006 when he became the third person to hold the Sports Information Director title at Rice, following Bill Whitmore (1950-84) and Bill Cousins (1984-2006). Pool guides athletic communications and publicity efforts for the Owls while serving as the primary contact for football as well as men's and women's tennis.

Pool and his staff were honored this past year by the Football Writers' Association of America as one of their Super 11 Sports Information staffs.

In his time at Rice, he has coordinated the Owls' efforts to move their media information away from printed materials as well as developing a broader overall reach through sport-specific Facebook and Twitter initiatives with a heavy emphasis on video.

In 2011, he oversaw the redesign and relaunch of Riceowls.com while also writing and co-producing a five-part documentary on the 100th season of Rice Football. In 2010, he assumed administrative responsibility of the Owls' video productions and oversaw the creative aspects of *Owls Insider*, a half-hour show on Fox Sports Houston. That same year he was responsible for the expansion of OwlVision's baseball webcast production as well as the first-ever webcast of the C-USA outdoor track and field championship.

In 2006, his publicity efforts enabled a previously unknown sophomore wide receiver, Jarett Dillard, to become one of three finalists for the Biletnikoff Award finalist. In 2008 Dillard became Rice's first Football Writers All American in 50 years.

He served as Media Coordinator for the 2010 and 2015 NCAA Men's South Basketball Regionals at in Houston. He was Local Media Coordinator for the 2011 Men's Final Four and will reprise that role in 2016.

Pool, 57, joined the Owls after spending the previous four years running his own public relations company, Laysan Communications, which specialized in proactive sports-related public and media relations. His primary clients included the Rotary Lombardi Award, which honors the top linemen in college football, and the Roger Clemens Award, which was presented to the top pitcher in college baseball. Laysan also provided media services to the Houston Super Bowl Host Committee, the Harris County-Houston Sports Authority and USA Football.

He first came to Houston in 1985 when he joined the Houston Astros as the assistant director of public relations. He remained with the Astros through the spring of 1992 when he was selected to create the media relations department of the expansion Florida Marlins. He returned to the Astros in 1998 before entering private business in 1999.

Pool is a 1980 graduate of the University of Nebraska where he played freshman football (1977). He joined the Huskers' SID department as a student assistant and was named Publications Coordinator/Sports Information Assistant upon graduation.

During his time at Nebraska, he was part of publicity efforts that garnered a Heisman Trophy, three Outland, two Rotary Lombardi Award winners and 10 consensus All-America selections in football. He also headed up publicity efforts for the Huskers' gymnastics and swimming programs, and served as media coordinator for three NCAA men's gymnastics and one NCAA women's swimming and diving championship.

He is a member of the FWA and the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). He is a past president of Pearland Little League and has served on the Advisory Council of the Rotary Lombardi Award.

Pool and wife Laura reside in Pearland. They have four children, Kevin (26, who received his degree from Rice in 2011 and coaches football at Ft. Bend Austin HS), Cameron (22, who is serving his country as a Lance Corporal in the Marines) Kelli (21, who attends Lamar University where she is a student athletic trainer) and Courtney (17, who is entering her senior year at Pearland HS).

Scott McGonagle was named the Associate Athletic Director for Sports Performance July 1, 2013. He originally joined the Owls at the start of the 2012 campaign.

In the season opener, Rice University football put forth a strong effort but fell at No. 17 Notre Dame, 48-17, in front of 80,795 fans at Notre Dame Stadium.

After falling behind 7-0 in the first quarter, the Owls quickly responded with a 65-yard scoring drive, highlighted by a 30-yard pass from Driphus Jackson to Dennis Parks and punctuated by Zach Wright's first-career touchdown, a 26-yard snag.

The tie game lasted just 12 seconds, as the Irish's Everett Golson connected on a 75-yard strike to Will Fuller to put the home team back in front, 14-7 near the end of the opening frame.

That score held for nearly 15 minutes before James Hairston kicked his first-career field goal, a 33-yarder, with five minutes remaining before the half to pull Rice within four points.

Notre Dame responded three minutes later with an 86-yard drive to up the score to 21-10 with just 2:33 left in the opening half. Rice drove to midfield on the ensuing possession before committing the game's first turnover with 21 ticks left on the clock.

Two plays after regaining possession, Golson connected with C.J. Prosise on a 53-yard touchdown pass to give the home team a 28-10 lead at the intermission. ND scored all 10 points in the third quarter to push the advantage to 38-10, and tacked on a fourth-quarter field goal before the Owls responded.

Later in the fourth, Tyler Stehling entered at quarterback and completed the first pass of his career to true freshman James Mayden for a 53-yard touchdown strike, cutting the score to 41-17 midway through the period.

Notre Dame added one more score late in the game on a three-play drive, providing the final 48-17 margin.

Jackson finished the day with 163 yards on 13-of-24 passing with one touchdown and an interception. He also rushed for a team-high 61 yards on 11 carries, including a 19-yarder.

Jowan Davis added 33 yards on a team-high 14 carries, while Brandon Hamilton added 29 yards on six rushes.

Zach Patt made his first start at defensive end and led the team with a career-high six tackles, including one sack and a quarterback hurry. Safety Jaylon Finner also made his first start and matched Patt's six tackles and assisted on a tackle for loss. Gabe Baker also made six tackles and added a pass breakup in the game.

Notre Dame owned a 576-367 advantage in total yards, including 281 on the ground.

TEXAS A&M 38, RICE 10

Rice University football's offense put together a strong ground game, but was unable to overcome the seventh-ranked Texas A&M Aggies in a 38-10 setback in front of 103,867 fans at Kyle Field.

The Owls (0-2) held the ball for a whopping 43:14 on the night, tallying 481 yards, including a balanced 241 through the air and 240 on the ground.

Sophomore Jowan Davis carried the ball a career-high 23 times for 86 yards, followed by another career rushing performance by junior quarterback Driphus Jackson, who totaled 84 yards on 13 rushes.

Jackson completed 21-of-32 passes for 212 yards and a score. Senior Mario Hull found himself on the receiving end of Rice's lone touchdown, a 20-yard strike in the second quarter to pull the Owls within 14-7. It was Hull's first-career score, and his 57 yards on three catches led the team.

After the Owls narrowed the margin with the score, the Aggies rattled off 21-straight points in the second and third quarters to regain control of the game at 35-7.

James Hairston then knocked through a 33-yard field goal to break the streak. Rice then held the Aggies to just one more score in the fourth quarter. It was TAMU's lowest-scoring output of the season as the squad entered the game averaging 62.5 points per game.

On defense, Gabe Baker and Jaylon Finner led the team with six tackles each. Malcolm Hill forced the team's first turnover of the season with a fourth-quarter interception. It was the sixth theft of the senior's career.

Defensive linemen Dylan Klare and Brian Nordstrom each recorded a sack as the Owls recorded four tackles in the backfield.

OLD DOMINION 45, RICE 42

SEPT. 20, 2014 • RICE STADIUM • HOUSTON, TEXAS

Ricky Segers nailed a 25-yard field goal as time expired to thwart a stellar second half comeback by Rice and give Old Dominion a memorable debut as a member of Conference USA with a 45-42 win at Rice Stadium on Saturday.

The win not only was the first ever by the Monarchs in C-USA, it snapped the Owls' nine-game home winning streak, which was tied for the ninth longest active streaks in the nation.

After ODU took a 35-14 lead early in the third, Owls quarterback Driphus Jackson led a spirited comeback by the Owls despite playing with a separated left shoulder.

He threw for 142 yards over the final two quarters and led the Owls to four touchdowns, the last of them tying the game with just 1:05 left on the clock. But ODU senior QB Taylor Heinicke, who had participated on an MTV 2 reality show "The Ride" with Jackson when the two were in high school and finished with 430 yards passing and five

touchdowns, led the Monarchs back down the field to set up Segers' winning kick.

The winning drive opened with a horse collar penalty against the Owls and was sparked by a 45-yard completion from Heinicke to Zach Pascal to the Rice 14. Prior to that completion, the Owls had held Heinicke to only 77 yards through the air in the second half after he took advantage of an Owls defense which was missing four starters from the previous two weeks and would lose three more starters during the game for 308 yards and three scores in the first half.

Jackson was injured while throwing a 31-yard touchdown pass to Zach Wright on the Owls' first possession. Tyler Stehling replaced Jackson and engineered one scoring drive, but trailing 28-14 at the half, Bailiff was given the unexpected news that Jackson was cleared to return to action.

Jackson engineered scoring marches of 75, 65, 75 and 80 yards on the Owls last four possessions in the second half, mixing his throwing with the powerful running of backs Jowan Davis and Darik Dillard who both ran for career highs.

Davis plowed through the tiring Monarchs for 150 yards on 24 carries while Dillard added 70 on 14 carries and scored three touchdowns, including the tying score with less than a minute remaining.

Wright finished with six catches for 80 yards, both career bests. Dennis Parks matched Wright with six catches, also a career high.

The loss also snapped the longest winning streak in Rice Stadium history for the Owls in addition to a six-game home streak inside C-USA.

RICE 41, SOUTHERN MISS 23

Rice University football broke open a tie game late in the first half to claim a 41-23 victory over Southern Miss at M.M. Roberts Stadium.

The Owls owned a 217-to-40 advantage in rushing yards, led by Jowan Davis. The sophomore racked up 131 yards on 29 carries with a pair of touchdowns. He also caught two passes for 38 yards in the win.

Rice added 178 yards in the air, as Driphus Jackson completed 14-of-22 passes for two scores. Southern Miss notched 323 yards on the night but turned the ball over three times in the loss.

Rice drove 55 yards on its opening drive to set up a 27-yard field goal, scoring the only points of the opening period. USM responded with a 52-yarder early in the second quarter to knot the score at 3-3.

Davis then capped off a 12-play, 69-yard drive on the next possession with a six-yard touchdown run for his first score of the season. The Golden Eagles again tied the score with a three-minute drive with four minutes to play in the half.

Set up by a long kickoff return by Brandon Hamilton, Rice took the lead for good with a three-play, 56-yard drive spanning just 1:01 on the clock. Davis again scored on a six-yard run, but the drive was highlighted by Jackson's career-long 43-yard scramble.

With three minutes to play in the half, Southern Miss saw its drive cut short by Garrett Fuhrman's first interception, which set the Owls up for another James Farrimond field goal to stretch the advantage to 20-10 late in the half.

USM then drove down the field before throwing an interception on the last play of the half. Ryan Pollard picked off the pass for his first-career interception. Southern Miss pulled within four points at 20-16 with a touchdown drive late in the third quarter. The Owls answered at the end of the period with a 73-yard drive, including a 40-yard pass from Jackson to Mario Hull for the score and a 27-16 cushion.

Rice then capitalized off a fumble, forced by Graysen Schantz, early in the fourth quarter as Luke Turner notched his first rushing score of the season to make it 34-16.

The back-and-forth continued as USM cut it to 34-23 in the fourth quarter, but one last long scoring drive by the Owls put the game away. Luke Turner ran in from one yard out to seal the victory.

Jaylon Finner led the visitors with seven tackles, while Alex Lyons and Tabari McGaskey recorded five apiece.

RICE 28, HAWAII 14

Darik Dillard ran for a career-high 141 yards and Jordan Taylor topped 100 yards receiving for the fifth time in his career while a tenacious defense registered its highest sack total in a decade to spark a second half resurgence and lead Rice to a 28-14 win over Hawaii at Rice Stadium.

The Owls won for the 10th time in their last 11 home games despite three turnovers and being stymied through most of the first half by a blitzing Rainbow Warriors defense.

Driphus Jackson shook off a slow first half to finish with 248 yards passing and a pair of touchdowns, including a 31-yard toss to Taylor in the final moments to ice the victory. After being held to 146 yards in the first half, 81 of them on Jackson to James Mayden touchdown pass, Rice responded to gain 245 yards in the second, while holding Hawaii to 129 yards and just six first downs.

The Owls defense sacked UH quarterback Ikaika Woolsey seven times on the night, their highest total since they sacked Kevin Kolb of Houston nine times in 2004 and one shy of their total from the first four games of the season. They finished the night with 12 tackles for loss, five shy of their total for the year heading into the game.

The Owls responded to the deficit with their lone offensive highlight of the first half as Jackson found freshman James Mayden open in the left flat and then watched him blaze past the Hawaii defense for an 81-yard score. It matched the fourth-longest scoring pass in school history and the second scoring toss of better than 80 yards in Jackson's career. He teamed with Sam McGuffie to set the school record with an 88-yard connection vs. Houston in 2012.

The Owls mounted their comeback late in the third. Dillard carried for 27 yards and Taylor caught a 28-yard pass to set them up at the Hawaii 10. Dillard crashed home two plays later to tie the game, 14-14.

After a series of punts, the Owls regained possession with 8:09 left and fashioned the drive that allowed them to take the lead for good. After three carries by Dillard gained 15 yards, Jackson rebounded from a sack to hit Taylor for 14 and Mario Hull for 50 to move the ball to the UH 40 where Dillard skirted the left end to put Rice up 21-14.

Trailing for the first time, Hawaii took over at its 34 with 4:18 left and quickly moved into Rice territory before the Owls stiffened and forced an incompletion on fourth down at the Rice 43.

The Owls then rode the running of Dillard to thwart Hawaii's hopes of getting the ball back one more time. He carried five times for 38 yards to move the ball to the Rainbows' 19. A bad snap on third down moved the ball back to the 31, but rather than attempt a field goal or punt, the Owls chose to go for it with 12 seconds remaining and Jackson found Taylor crossing over the middle for his first TD of the year and his 14th career TD catch.

In the final non-conference action of the season, Rice University football took an early lead and never let up in a 41-21 win at Army. The Owls gained 391 yards to the Black Knights' 341 and forced a pair of turnovers to secure the victory.

Rice took the ball first and marched 73 yards for a score as Brandon Hamilton recorded his first-career touchdown on a two-yard rush. The drive was highlighted by Darik Dillard's career long 35-yard run. Army responded to tie the game late in the first quarter after taking advantage of good field position.

The Owls then tacked on three more scores in the second quarter, including touchdowns by Dillard and Mario Hull and a James Farrimond 23-yard field goal, to push the lead to 24-7. The Black Knights responded just before the half with a touchdown to pull within 10 points at the intermission, 24-14.

On the opening drive of the third quarter, Christian Covington recovered an Army fumble and set up the Owl offense with a short field. The visitors needed just one play to capitalize as Driphus Jackson hit Jordan Taylor with a 41-yard touchdown pass on the first play. It was Taylor's 15th career score, moving him into a tie for fifth place in Rice's career record book.

Army responded with a long touchdown drive on its next possession to cut the Rice lead to 10 points once again, but it wasn't a two-score game for long. The Owls answered with a 62-yard touchdown drive, capped off with a nine-yard pass from Jackson to Dillard. Later in the fourth quarter, the Owls tacked on the day's final points courtesy of a second Farrimond field goal.

Jackson completed 15-of-21 passes for 209 yards and three scores, and ran the ball seven times for 29 more yards. Davis led the team with 77 yards on 21 carries while Dillard finished with 73 yards on nine rushes.

Taylor's 72 receiving yards led the team while Zach Wright added 47 on five catches.

Gabe Baker led the defense with eight tackles and a fumble recovery, just ahead of Covington and James Radcliffe with seven tackles apiece. Radcliffe also had three tackles for loss as the team racked up a season-high 13 TFL, one more than last week's total against Hawai'i.

Army's Angel Santiago rushed 23 times for 106 of his team's 250 yards on the ground. He also completed five passes for 37 yards and a score.

The Owls allowed a season-best 91 passing yards on 14 attempts.

RICE 41, NORTH TEXAS 21

Ryan Pollard returned an interception 60 yards for the go-ahead touchdown and his Rice defensive teammates shackled North Texas to only 45 yards in the second half to spark the Owls to their fourth consecutive win, 41-21.

Rice outscored NT 27-0 in the second half to move to 4-3 on the season and 2-1 in Conference USA while North Texas dropped its fourth straight. The win was Rice's 10th in its last 11 home games and completed its first unbeaten October since 1960 when it was 5-0.

After the teams traded scores and ended the first quarter tied 14-14, North Texas took a 21-14 lead midway through the second on a 1-yard run by Carlos Harris and as the second half drew to a close, the Mean Green appeared headed for a two-score advantage.

Quarterback Andrew McNulty hit a pair of passes for 34 yards to reach the Rice 33 with a first down and just over one minute remaining, but Christian Covington and Zach

Patt stormed in to sandwich McNulty for a loss of 11. On second down, Graysen Schantz forced a hurried throw by McNulty which was incomplete and on third down, Dylan Klare came free on a stunt to drop him for a loss of 10 and end the threat.

Cole Thomas blasted the ball free from Harris on his return of the second half kickoff and Tabari McGaskey recovered to set up a field goal to trim the lead to 21-17.

Five plays later, Pollard jumped a McNulty throw at the Rice 40, darted up the sideline before cutting back to spring free and complete the Owls' first interception return for a touchdown since Michael Kutzler returned one for a score against Kansas in 2013.

Pollard's touchdown was the highlight of a resounding second half performance by the Owls, who held UNT to 34 yards in the third quarter and just 11 in the fourth after surrendering 171 in the opening two quarters.

The Owls held onto their three-point margin until late in the third when Driphus Jackson and the offense found their momentum and fashioned an 11-play, 79-yard scoring march to go up by 10 early in the fourth.

Jackson, who threw for 233 yards, 88 of them on the game's first play to Jordan Taylor to match the longest scoring play in school history, was 5-5 on the drive for 64 yards to set up a one-yard plunge by Darik Dillard.

The Owls added 10 more points in the quarter to reach their final margin of victory. Jackson and Taylor electrified the crowd of 18,430 before most had settled in their seats, connecting on the game's first play. It was Jackson's third career scoring toss of better than 80 yards.

Taylor topped 100 yards receiving for the second straight home game, finishing the day with 137 yards on four catches. He also became the fourth Owl to top 2,000 yards in career receiving.

Rice University football jumped out to a 17-0 lead in the first quarter and held off FIU to claim a 31-17 win in the first meeting with the new Conference USA foe at FIU Stadium.

For a second-straight game, the Owls struck early. After forcing and recovering a fumble on FIU's opening drive, Jowan Davis ran 19 yards for a touchdown on Rice's first play from scrimmage less than a minute into the game.

After forcing a punt on the next possession, Rice drove 39 yards on eight plays to set up James Farrimond for a career-long 40-yard field goal to give the visitors a 10-0 advantage just midway through the first quarter.

Rice tacked on seven more points in the frame as Driphus Jackson connected with Jordan Taylor for a 63-yard touchdown to push the lead to 17-0. FIU then got on the board late in the period with a 52-yard strike.

Jackson finished the day with 230 yards and a pair of

touchdowns on 11-of-24 passing and ran the ball nine times for 66 yards. Taylor notched a season-high 115 yards on six catches.

After another Panther touchdown early in the second quarter, Rice responded with another long strike as Jackson found freshman James Mayden for a 69-yard completion. That score pushed the advantage back to double figures at 24-14 before FIU notched a field goal just before halftime to take a 24-17 deficit into the locker room.

The teams battled to a scoreless third quarter before Rice pushed its advantage back to multiple possessions early in the fourth. Luke Turner punctuated a six-play drive with a one-yard touchdown run from the Wild Owl formation early in the frame to put the visitors ahead, 31-17.

That would conclude the scoring as the Owls shut down each of FIU's final drives before they gained momentum.

After missing several games with an injury, defensive end Zach Patt tallied five sacks, with three forced fumbles. Gabe Baker, Jaylon Finner and Alex Lyons each added six tackles in the game as Rice limited FIU to 261 yards in the game.

On a day reserved for honoring past accomplishments, the current members of the Rice football team added another chapter to their own recent history, downing UTSA 17-7 to win their sixth straight this season and their 10th consecutive homecoming game, while posting the most successful three-year run in school history and reach bowl eligibility for the third consecutive year.

Homecoming 2014 featured special recognitions of the Owls 2013-14 C-USA Championship squads, the 2014 Class of Honor Jerseys, two-time Super Bowl champion Darryl Grant and the 1994 Southwest Conference Champion football team and all were treated to another dominant afternoon the Rice defense.

The Owls ground out 420 yards of total offense, but once again turned to their defense to cement the win, which was their 11th in their last 12 at Rice Stadium and their 14th consecutive home win in November.

Brian Nordstrom's sack and forced fumble of backup UTSA quarterback Austin Robinson at the Rice 11 with just under a minute left in the game quelled the Roadrunners' hopes for an improbable late rally. The junior who was named to the Ted Hendricks Award Watch List on Friday, finished with a career-high seven tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss (2.5 sacks). He raised his season TFL total to 17.5, which ranks third in school history.

Most of the afternoon, the defense effectively bottled up the UTSA attack, while the offense sputtered after an impressive opening drive that covered 80 yards on 13 plays. After taking the opening kickoff, Driphus Jackson engineered an efficient drive down the field before covering the final nine yards himself to give the Owls points on their opening possession for the fourth consecutive game.

UTSA found its footing just before halftime driving to the Rice six. But with seven seconds left, UTSA elected to run the ball with Robinson, who was met by James Radcliffe

and Gabe Baker at the three. Robinson continued to try to drive into the end zone as the clock wound down and the Roadrunners were unable to call time out and set up a field goal.

After missing a field goal on their first possession in the second half, the Owls extended their lead to 17-0 late in the third when Jackson found Mario Hull in the corner of the end zone.

Leading 17-0 heading into the 4th quarter, the Owls were looking to extend their second half shutout streak to seven quarters and register their first shutout since the opening game of the 1995 season, but Robinson ended those hopes with a 24-yard touchdown pass to Kenny Bias with 9:36 left in the game.

Nordstrom's 2.5 sacks on the day give him 7.5 this season, matching fellow defensive end Zach Patt for the team lead and the sixth-best total in school history. Patt chipped in

Rice University football saw its six-game winning streak come to an end with a 41-14 setback at No. 21 Marshall at Joan C. Edwards Stadium. The Thundering Herd improved to 10-0 on the season.

Marshall broke Rice's (6-4, 4-2 C-USA) string of four-straight games of scoring first as the Herd kicked a 33-yard field goal late in the first quarter, following a Zach Patt sack on third down, to get on the board. It was just the third time this season, and first time in five games, that the Owls were held scoreless in the first quarter.

The sack gave Patt 8.5 on the season, tying him for second on the program's single-season list.

The Herd then found pay-dirt early in the second quarter to punctuate a 59-yard drive and increased its lead to 10-0. The home team followed that drive up with an 85-yarder to put the Owls in a 17-point hole with another touchdown.

MARSHALL 41, RICE 14

The Owls responded shortly before halftime, as Bryce Callahan picked off his 12th career interception and returned 28 yards it to the Marshall 17-yard line. The Owls needed just four plays to score as Jordan Taylor hauled in an 18-yard catch on third down to set up Jowan Davis' three-yard touchdown run.

Callahan's interception gave him sole possession of fourth place on the program's career list, passing Nathan Bennett and LaDoughyous McCalla. Taylor caught a career-high nine passes (for 88 yards) for a second week in a row and moved past David Houser and James Casey for fourth on the program's career receptions list with 158 catches.

The Herd finished out the second quarter with a six-play, 68-yard drive to tack on a field goal and take a 20-7 lead into the intermission. The 17-point frame was the highest scoring quarter allowed by the Owls on the season.

Marshall picked up where it left off in the third quarter with

14-straight points to up the advantage to 34-7 before the Owls pounced on a fumble on a punt. The recovery by Nick Elder set up favorable field position, but the Owls were unable to convert on downs inside the 10-yard line.

Elder and fellow linebacker Alex Lyons led the squad with 10 tackles apiece. The mark was a career high for both players.

After the Herd tacked on another score, Rice was able to respond with a 75-yard drive capped off by a 10-yard scoring run by Darik Dillard, his eighth touchdown of the season. That pulled Rice within 41-14 closed out the scoring on the day.

The Owls finished the day with a season-low 180 yards of total offense (99 passing, 81 rushing). Marshall racked up 581 yards, including 297 passing yards by Rakeem Cato. The quarterback completed 23-of-37 passes with four touchdowns.

Mario Hull saved his finest performance as a Rice Owl for his final game at Rice Stadium, catching six passes for a career-high 150 yards and a touchdown to lead Rice to a 31-13 win over UTEP.

With the win, the Owls reached the seven-win plateau for the third consecutive year for the first time in school history. Rice assured itself of earning a third straight bowl berth for the first time and extended its home winning streak in November to 15 consecutive games.

Hull posted the Owls' top receiving game of the year and the most receiving yards since Jordan Taylor finished with 185 yards against UTEP last season.

Driphus Jackson, who threw for 227 yards on just nine completions to move his season total to 2,187 while adding 53 on the ground, knew going into the game that for Rice to win, one or more of his receivers would need to come up big.

While Hull sparked the Owls' offensive efforts, the Rice defense rose to the challenge presented by the UTEP's rushing attack, holding the nation's 24th ranked unit to just 53 yards on the night, including a -5 yards in the second half. The Owls throttled UTEP's Aaron Jones, who came in as C-USA's second-leading rusher at 118 yards per game, to just 23. Jones raced to 186 yards against the Owls last season at Rice Stadium.

After pregame ceremonies to honor Hull and his 18 fellow seniors, the Owls started sluggishly, failing to register a first down and gaining only five yards on nine plays while UTEP ground out 45 yards on the ground and held on to the ball for nearly 10 minutes.

Hull provided the first of many sparks early in the second quarter, latching on to a 12-yard pass from Driphus Jackson to give the Owls their initial first down of the night. Rice drove to the UTEP 11 before stalling, but James Hairston booted a 32-yard field goal to give Rice a 3-0 lead.

UTEP answered with a field goal, but Rice responded with a 10-play drive to take the lead for good just before halftime. Darik Dillard darted in for the first of his two scores on the ground to put Rice up 10-3 heading to the locker room. Rice stormed out of the locker room in the second half to extend the lead to 17-3 thanks to Hull. He caught passes for 28 and 38 yards on the drive, then watched teammate Jordan Taylor make a circus catch for a 24-yard touchdown.

The Miners road the passing of quarterback Jameill Showers to cut the lead to 17-13 late in the third, before Hull answered with a career-best, 55-yard reception to set up a second run by Dillard to push the lead back to 24-13.

In the final quarter, the Owls turned the tables on UTEP, which came into the game leading the conference in time of possession, holding the ball for nearly 11 minutes. Hull finally found the end zone with just under six minutes left, gathering in a five-yard pass from Jackson to push the final margin to 31-13.

Rice junior quarterback Driphus Jackson set a school bowl record by throwing for 318 yards and tied a second with three touchdown passes, while a rejuvenated Owls defense held Fresno State out of the end zone to lead them to a 30-6 win in the 13th Hawai'i Bowl.

The victory marked a redemptive rebound for the Owls defense, who surrendered 76 points in their regular season finale at Louisiana Tech in late November. They bottled up the Mountain West's fourth-best offense, holding the Bulldogs to 158 yards and 22 points below their season averages. Fresno State ran only two plays inside the red zone for -3 yards and was held to -4 yards on seven plays inside the Owls' 25. It marked the first time in the history of the Hawai'i Bowl that a team was held without a touchdown and was the first time Rice had held a foe out of the end zone since the Memphis game in 2011.

The win allowed the Owls to reach eight wins in a season for just the ninth time in school history.

Jackson made an immediate statement in the opening quarter, leading the Owls to a 16-3 lead that proved to be all they would need to grab their third bowl title in four opportunities under head coach David Bailiff.

Jackson and the Owls started quickly, marching down the field for an opening field goal, but then saw Fresno State answer with a field goal of its own thanks to a pair of penalties by the defense.

But he had a quick answer for the Bulldogs hopes, combining on a 53-yard pass play to Dennis Parks which set up a 14-yard touchdown toss to Jordan Taylor. Rice got the ball right back on the Bulldogs first play after the score as J.T. Blasingame picked up his first career interception and Jackson wasted no time, hitting Mario Hull on a 69-yard scoring play which was the longest touchdown pass in Rice Bowl history.

The 16-point first quarter was the most productive opening bowl quarter in school history and the most points in any bowl game quarter since the Owls scored 21 in the second quarter of their first-ever bowl appearance, the 1938 Cotton Bowl.

Fresno State tallied a second field goal in the second quarter to cut the margin to 16-6 at halftime and after the teams traded punts to open the third quarter, the Bulldogs' Marteze Waller broke off a 41-yard gain to the Rice 24 to put them on the doorstep of more points. But the drive stalled and on fourth down Brian Nordstrom broke through to block the field goal attempt.

Nordstrom and the rest of the Rice defense consistently rose to meet each challenge fashioned by Fresno State, thanks in large part to 12 tackles for loss and a stout effort on fourth down as the Owls stopped the Bulldogs four times on fourth down to run their season total to 15 stops in 20 chances (25%).

KEN HATFIELD**(1994-2005)**

Hatfield followed his former aid, Fred Goldsmith, as the Owls' head coach. Like Jimmy Kitts some 60 years before him, Hatfield won an SWC title in his first season. It was Rice's first conference title since 1957 and was highlighted by a 19-17 victory over Texas. The Owls' previous win over Texas came in 1965. 

This season, two Owls will continue the tradition of honoring past Rice Football greats by changing their jersey numbers. The Honor Jersey program began in 2012.



He was a two-time All-Southwest Conference lineman and was elected by his teammates as winner of the George Martin Award for being the most valuable player on the team. He was selected by the Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs in the NFL Draft, but elected to attend UT Medical School in Galveston instead of playing professional football. He is on staff at Methodist Hospital specializing in treatment for arthritis, arthroscopic surgery, ACL reconstruction, hip, knee and shoulder replacement, and sports-related injuries in addition to serving his alma mater as the head team physician for Rice Athletics.

Rose was a three-year letterman and senior co-captain in 1976 as a defensive lineman for the Owls and was presented the Jess Neely Award for defensive linemen as a senior. He was signed by the San Francisco 49ers as a free agent and attended training camp. He then began a career in banking as a national bank examiner for the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency. In 1984 he became Texas' first African-American president of a major holding company bank when Texas Commerce Bank -- Greenway Plaza (now JPMorgan Chase)

promoted him and also named him to its board of directors. He currently serves as the Risk Management Officer and Director of Credit Review for the Banc of California. A life member of the Owl Club, has been an active member of the "R" Association, served on the ARA board from 1984 to 1987, lent his efforts to the Association of Rice University Black Alumni and was president of the ARA from 2005 to 2006. He was named to the Rice Board of Trustees in 2007
