

**Wyoming Enters 2012 After Enjoying One of the Most Successful Seasons
in Recent Cowboy History**

The Wyoming Cowboys enter the 2012 season coming off one of their most successful seasons in recent history. In terms of overall record, the 2011 season was the team's best in 14 years. The Cowboys 8-5 record marked the most wins since the 1998 Cowboy team went 8-3. The Pokes captured sole possession of third-place in the conference race a year ago, going 5-2 in Mountain West play losing only to eventual conference champion TCU and second place Boise State. Those five conference wins tied the 2006 Cowboys for the most victories in Mountain West play since UW joined the conference. The Cowboys defeated every other Mountain West opponent in 2011, including key road wins at Air Force and San Diego State to earn a trip to the 2011 Gildan New Mexico Bowl.

That was quite an accomplishment for a Wyoming team that began the 2011 campaign not knowing who its quarterback would be and being selected No. 6 out of eight teams in the Mountain West preseason poll.

Now turn the page to the 2012 season, and the excitement that was generated by that successful 2011 campaign has turned to optimism for the coming year. In one season, the Cowboys went from not knowing who their quarterback would be to having the top returning quarterback in the league in 2011 Mountain West Freshman of the Year **Brett Smith**. The native of Salem, Ore., ranked No. 2 in the MW in total offense in 2011, averaging 256.3 yards per game, and he ranked him No. 33 in the nation. Only former Boise State QB Kellen Moore averaged more yards of total offense among Mountain West players a year ago. Along the way, Smith also shattered the Mountain West record for total offense by a freshman, with 3,332 yards. The previous MW record was held by former TCU quarterback Andy Dalton, who accounted for 2,691 yards of total offense as a freshman in 2007.

Also returning in 2012 and adding to the excitement surrounding the program is head coach **Dave Christensen**, who signed a new five-year contract that runs through December of 2016. Christensen was named the 2011 Mountain West Coach of the Year, becoming the first Cowboy football coach to earn that honor since Joe Tiller was named Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year back in 1996.

The offense returns five starters, including 2011 Second Team All-Conference performers and seniors **Nick Carlson** at center and **Chris McNeill** at wide receiver. Carlson will enter his senior season having been named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List for the second consecutive season. The Rimington Trophy honors the top center in college football each season. McNeill achieved Second Team All-Conference honors despite missing the final four games of 2011 due to an injury suffered in the Air Force game. McNeill was the team leader in receiving yards, with 504. Junior offensive guard **Tyler Strong** also returns after earning Honorable Mention All-Mountain West honors as a sophomore. The other returning starter is junior wide receiver **Robert Herron**, who ranked second on the team in receptions in 2011 with 43 for 379 yards.

Another key performer returning to the Cowboy offense is UW's leading receiver from 2011 -- sophomore **Dominic Rufran**. Rufran started only four games as a true freshman, but when McNeill missed the final four games of the season due to injury it was Rufran who stepped up to lead the team in receptions with 44 for 402 yards.

On defense, seven starters return led by seniors **Luke Ruff** at free safety, **Mike Purcell** at defensive tackle and **Korey Jones** at linebacker. Ruff earned Second Team All-Mountain honors as a junior after ranking sixth in the MW and 88th in the nation in tackles, averaging 7.9 per game. He has already been named to the 2012 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List, named after former USC Trojan, San Francisco 49er and Oakland Raider Ronnie Lott. Purcell started for the second consecutive season as a junior in 2011 and is an emotional leader for the Pokes. Jones ranked eighth on the team in tackles in his first year at Wyoming after transferring from Garden City Community College in Kansas.

Two other key returning starters on defense are sophomore cornerback **Blair Burns** and junior cornerback **Marqueston Huff**. Burns earned First Team Freshman All-America honors from the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and CBSSports.com. He ranked No. 2 in the MW and No. 38 in the NCAA in interceptions with four. Huff had three interceptions, ranking him No. 4 in the MW and No. 90 in the nation. The other returning starters, senior safety **Luke Anderson** and junior linebacker **Devyn Harris**, will be competing for starting spots again this year, and will provide the Cowboy defense excellent depth and experience.

Quarterback Smith led the Cowboys in rushing in 2011, with 710 yards and 10 rushing touchdowns. The key loss for the Cowboys was the loss of junior Alvester Alexander, who decided to declare himself eligible for the 2012 NFL Draft following his junior season. Alexander rushed for 695 yards and six touchdowns last season. For his career, he ended his Wyoming career ranked No. 9 in UW school history, rushing for 2,127 yards in his three seasons. Alexander signed a free-agent contract with the Chicago Bears in the spring of 2012.

Looking to assume more of the rushing load this coming season will be junior **Brandon Miller** and sophomore **Kody Sutton**. Miller had 66 carries for 364 yards rushing as a sophomore in 2011. He also is a very effective receiver out of the backfield, catching 20 passes for 199 yards a year ago as a combination running back/wide receiver. Sutton carried the ball 30 times for 146 yards as a true freshman.

Two freshmen will join the competition at running back when fall camp opens in August. **D.J. May** rushed for 1,320 yards as a senior and 1,310 yards as a junior at Federal Way High School in Federal Way, Wash. **Shaun Wick**, from Ventura, Calif., accounted for 1,271 rushing yards as a senior and 1,219 as a junior for St. Bonaventure High School.

H-Backs

Sophomore **Riley Lange** returns as the Cowboy H-Back again in 2012. Lange was a key run blocker and pass protector in his first season at the H-Back spot as a redshirt freshman. His improved play may lead to additional use of the H-Back by the Wyoming offense in 2012. He will be backed up by junior **Tedder Easton**.

Wide Receivers

The Cowboys return their top three receivers in terms of receptions from last year's team, and it is a very balanced receiving corps. Sophomore **Dominic Rufran** led Wyoming with 44 receptions for 402 yards as a freshman in 2011. **Robert Herron**, a junior this coming season, had 43 catches for 379 yards, and senior-to-be **Chris McNeill** caught 42 passes for 502 yards. Running back Miller's 20 receptions for 199 yards ranked sixth on the team in 2011.

The key losses are 2011 senior Mazi Ogbonna, who had 40 receptions for 430 yards last season, and Josh Doctson, who caught 35 passes for 393 yards as a true freshman last season. Doctson, a native of Fort Worth, Texas, decided to walk onto the football team at TCU in the spring of 2012. Former running back Alexander also contributed 12 receptions for 200 yards out of the backfield in his final year as a Cowboy.

Other returners who look to compete for playing time this season are: sophomore **Trey Norman**; junior **Spencer Bruce** from Gillette, Wyo.; and sophomores **Josh Smith**, a converted quarterback, and **Shane Sullivan**. Another sophomore, **Sam Stratton**, is expected to miss the 2012 season after suffering an injury in winter conditioning.

Position-by-Position Breakdown

Offense **Quarterbacks**

Brett Smith had the greatest freshman season for a quarterback in University of Wyoming history. He accounted for 3,332 yards of total offense, which was the best by a Wyoming freshman in history and ranked No. 3 all-time in school history behind only Josh Wallwork's 1996 season of 4,209 yards and Joe Hughes 1993 season of 3,406 total yards. Both Wallwork and Hughes were seniors when they posted those numbers.

Smith set a new Mountain West freshman record for total offense, and ranked No. 33 in the nation in total offense in 2011. In addition to earning MW Freshman of the Year honors, Smith was also named a First Team Freshman All-American by CollegeFootballNews.com and earned Second Team Freshman All-America recognition from Yahoo! Sports. Smith recovered well from offseason surgery. He threw the ball well in 2012 spring drills, however he was held out of all contact drills during the spring.

Backing up Smith will be junior **Colby Kirkegaard**. Kirkegaard, like Smith, has one year of experience in the Cowboy offense. He transferred to Wyoming a year ago from Phoenix Community College in Phoenix, Ariz. Kirkegaard appeared in four games in 2011, completing 5 of 10 passes for 37 yards. Due to Smith missing all contact drills in the spring of 2012 due to offseason surgery, Kirkegaard gained valuable experience in the spring.

The third QB on the Cowboy roster come next fall will be true freshman **Jason Thompson** from Renton, Wash. An outstanding all-around athlete, Thompson was also offered a scholarship by the University of Washington as a defensive back.

Running Backs

Wyoming returns its top rusher from last season, but it may surprise people who that is.

Among the newcomers who may contribute immediately are three true freshmen in the 2012 recruiting class. **Eric Nzeocha**, from Neusitz, Germany, got a head start on the rest of the freshman class, joining the Cowboy Football team for spring drills in 2012. **Nico Brown** and **Trent Sewell**, who come to Wyoming from Leander, Texas, and Bothell, Wash., respectively, both bring with them impressive high school credentials. Brown is 6-3 and 200 pounds, and earned First Team All-District 16-5A honors his senior season. Sewell was ranked as the top wide receiver recruit in the state of Washington this past year by both Rivals.com and ESPN.com.

Offensive Linemen

The Cowboys return two full-time starters and three other offensive linemen who have starting experience. The offensive line begins with senior center **Nick Carlson**, who was Second Team All-Conference as a junior and will be a candidate for the Rimington Trophy again this season. Carlson has started 33 of 34 career games he has played in, including the last 25 consecutive. At left guard is junior **Tyler Strong** -- an Honorable Mention All-Mountain West choice as a sophomore in 2011. Strong started the last 11 games of his sophomore season.

Among the four other veteran linemen who have previous starting experience are senior **Josh Leonard**, who is slotted to start at left tackle. A very versatile linemen, Leonard started three games at right tackle last season, and started 10 games as a sophomore in 2010. Fellow seniors **Zach Rushing** and **Kyle Magnuson** also provide experience as starters. Rushing, the projected starter at right guard entering the fall, started the first four games at right guard last season. Magnuson has played both guard and tackle. He has three career starts to his credit and is battling for the starting right tackle spot.

The lone projected starter with no starting experience is sophomore right tackle **Daniel Fleischman**. Fleischman is a talented, athletic big man who was limited by injuries early in his Cowboy career, but he enjoyed a strong spring in 2012 to get the nod at right tackle entering fall camp.

Defense Secondary

One of the areas of strength on a Cowboy Defense that returns seven starters will definitely be its three talented returning starters in the defensive secondary. Leading the way is senior free safety **Luke Ruff**. Ruff earned Second Team All-Mountain West honors in his first season starting in 2011. He ranked second on the team and No. 6 in the Mountain West in tackles, with 102 total tackles. A First Team Academic All-District selection, Ruff carries a 3.59 cumulative-grade-point-average in civil engineering, and he has already been named to the 2012 Lott IMPACT Trophy Preseason Watch List. Ruff switched from strong safety to free safety this past spring.

Joining Ruff in the Cowboy secondary will be sophomore cornerback **Blair Burns**, who earned First Team Freshman All-America honors from the Football Writers Association of America and CBSSports.com., and was named an Honorable Mention All-Mountain West performer as a true freshman. The other corner spot is held down by junior **Marqueston Huff**, who had an outstanding season last year, but was somewhat overshadowed by his other three secondary mates who all earned postseason recognition. Huff had 47 tackles, three interceptions and three fumble recoveries in the season, including a 48-yard fumble return for Wyoming's final touchdown to seal a 25-17 road win over Air Force.

The key loss in the Cowboy secondary is free safety Tashaun Gipson. Gipson, who along with Ruff earned Second Team All-Mountain West honors in 2011, started every game from the first game of this true freshman season throughout his senior season -- 50 consecutive starts. While Ruff has switched from strong safety over to free safety this year, among the contenders for that other starting safety spot will be German native and sophomore **Mark Nzeocha**, who came out of the spring No. 1 at strong safety. Other contenders include senior **Kenny Browder**, who was listed No. 2 at free safety behind Ruff to conclude spring drills, and senior **Luke Anderson**, who started the final eight games of the 2011 season at a hybrid defensive back/outside linebacker position. A couple key special teams' performers from last season -- sophomore **Chad Reese** and junior **Andrew Meredith** -- could also vie for playing time at safety or at nickel back.

Linebackers

Talented senior **Korey Jones** will lead a linebacking unit that features several experienced returnees, but was a unit that was limited by injuries during 2012 spring drills. Jones started 11 games a year ago in his first season at Wyoming after transferring from Garden City Community College in Kansas. Jones recorded 59 tackles, 4.0 sacks and 6.0 tackles for loss in his first season at the NCAA Division I level. He began the season at defensive end, but was moved back to his natural linebacking position in the sixth game of the season.


Jones is joined by three other experienced linebackers in junior **Devyn Harris** and seniors **Oliver Schober** and **Ghaali Muhammad**. Harris ranked sixth on the team in tackles in 2011, with 65, starting seven games at middle linebacker. He will compete with redshirt senior **Oliver Schober** for that starting middle linebacker spot. Schober missed the entire 2011 season due to injury, but in 2010 he recorded 46 tackles as he played in all 12 games for UW, starting three in his first season of college football after playing on the German National Team as a youth. Schober saw some action in the final scrimmage of 2012 spring drills, but he was limited for much of spring camp. Another senior who was held out of 2012 spring drills due to offseason surgery was **Ghaali Muhammad**. Muhammad started eight games at outside linebacker as a sophomore in 2010, and ranked fourth on the team in tackles with 75. He moved to running back in 2011 where he rushed for 379 yards in eight games before suffering a season-ending injury. Now back at outside linebacker, he along with Schober should be healthy by the time fall camp opens in early August.

The exciting new face among the linebackers is redshirt freshman **Zack Berg**. Berg had one of the best spring camps of any Cowboy defender and earned the No. 1 position at one of the outside spots heading into fall camp. Other returning players who provide added experience are junior **Todd Knight** and sophomore **Alex Borgs**. Borgs, like Schober and the Nzeocha brothers, is a native of Germany.

The key loss to the linebacking corps was senior Brian Hendricks, a three-year starter and 2011 Second Team All-Conference selection.

Defensive Line

While the Cowboy defense line has lost two dynamic performers from 2011 in senior defensive ends **Josh Biezuns** and **Gabe Knapton**, the return of one senior starter, the emergence of a second senior in the spring of 2012 and the return of a starter from two seasons ago could make this year's Cowboy defensive line unit a very productive one again.

Senior defensive tackle **Mike Purcell** is the leader of the defensive line. Purcell recorded 48 tackles, 2.0 sacks and 3.0 tackles for loss from his defensive tackle position as a junior, and he also blocked two kicks. He has started 24 of 30 career games, and should be one of the top defensive linemen in the league in 2012. A second senior, **Kurt Taufa'asau**, was credited with 27 tackles, 1.0 sack and 2.5 TFLs last season, while starting three games. Taufa'asau enjoyed a breakout spring and earned the No. 1 spot at one defensive tackle position at the conclusion of spring drills.

Add to this group junior defensive tackle **Patrick Mertens**. Mertens missed the entire season a year ago due to illness, but he returned to participate in spring drills in 2012. As a redshirt freshman in 2010, Mertens started all 12 games at defensive tackle and earned Second Team Freshman All-America honors.

Among the other players who will challenge for starting spots are: sophomore **Sonny Puletasi**, who earned the No. 1 spot at one defensive end position entering fall camp; senior defensive end **Miraldo Michel**, who is the projected starter at the other end position; redshirt freshman defensive end **Eddie Yarbrough**; senior defensive tackle **B.J. Sumter**; and first-year junior college defensive end **Justin Bernthal**, who will join the Cowboys in the fall from Fullerton Community College in California, should all have a chance to contribute this coming season.

Special Teams
Specialists

Sophomore **Daniel Sullivan** returns as the Cowboys starting place-kicker after making 7 of 11 field goals as a true freshman in 2011. Sullivan started the last 12 games of his true freshman season for the Pokes.

Also returning is long snapper **Zach Ewan**, who started all 13 games as a true freshman a year ago.

The Cowboys will have a new starting punter this season. Australia native **Tim Gleeson**, who joined the Pokes for 2012 spring drills, will take over for four-year starter Austin McCoy.

University of Wyoming Football

Wyoming Ranks as the Sixth Most Improved Team in the Nation in 2011 Out of 120 FBS Schools, and the Most Improved Team in Mountain West:

Wyoming concluded the 2011 season with one of the most improved records in the nation when compared to its previous season in 2010.

The Cowboys tied for No. 6 among the most improved teams in the nation in 2011. That is No. 6 out of 120 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams participating in 2011. Wyoming's 8-5 overall record was a significant improvement over its final record in 2010 of 3-9. The Cowboys were also the most improved team in the Mountain West in 2011.

Cowboys Reach Many Milestones During 2011 Season: The Wyoming Cowboys reached a number of milestones during the 2011 season.

•Dave Christensen became the first Wyoming head coach to earn Coach of the Year honors since Joe Tiller in 1996.

•Christensen is the first Cowboy head coach to be named Coach of the Year since Wyoming joined the Mountain West in 1999.

•With its 8-5 record, Wyoming won eight games in a season for the first time since 1998, when the Cowboys posted an 8-3 record.

•Wyoming's 5-2 Mountain West record tied for the most MW wins with the 2006 Cowboys.

•By finishing third in the Mountain West, the 2011 Pokes also tied the 2006 team for the best conference finish since Wyoming joined the Mountain West.

•Wyoming's appearance in the 2011 and 2009 New Mexico Bowls meant that Wyoming appeared in two bowl games in a three-year span for the first time since 1988-90.

•Christensen led Wyoming to the 2009 New Mexico Bowl Championship, 35-28 in double overtime over Fresno State.

•Christensen's three Wyoming teams became the first to defeat Colorado State in three consecutive seasons since 1987, '88 and '89 under head coach Paul Roach.

•For the first time since the 1996 and '98 seasons, the Cowboys won back-to-back road games in Fort Collins in 2009 and 2011.

•The 2011 Cowboys defeated both Front-Range rivals Air Force and Colorado State in the same season for the first time since 1996 under head coach Joe Tiller.

•Wyoming has posted two seasons of at least seven wins during Christensen's three years as head coach at Wyoming. The last time that happened in a three-year period was 1997-99. Christensen's 2009 team won seven games to go with last year's eight wins.

Wyoming the Surprise Team of the Mountain West in 2011, Captures Third

Place in 2011 MW Race: The Wyoming Cowboys were the surprise team in the Mountain West in 2011. Wyoming concluded the regular season by capturing sole possession of third place in the conference, with its only MW losses coming at the hands of league champion TCU and second-place Boise State. Eleven Wyoming Football Players Earned 2011 All-Mountain West

Conference Recognition, Head Coach Dave Christensen Named Coach of the Year and Quarterback Brett Smith Named Freshman of the Year: The Mountain West announced its 2011 All-Conference Football Team on Tuesday, Dec. 6 and eleven Wyoming players plus head coach **Dave Christensen** earned recognition.

Wyoming received two of the five conference individual honors in voting by Mountain West head coaches and media members. Head coach **Dave Christensen** was named **Coach of the Year** and quarterback **Brett Smith** was voted **Freshman of the Year**.

Christensen became the first Cowboy head football coach to receive conference Coach of the Year honors since Joe Tiller received the honor in 1996. It was also the first time a Wyoming head football coach earned Coach of the Year honors in the Mountain West Conference era.

Smith became the second Wyoming freshman to earn MW Freshman of the Year honors. UW quarterback Austyn Carta-Samuels earned the honor in 2009.

While Wyoming had no First Team All-Conference selections, it had eight Second Team honorees, including five on defense and three on offense.

Wyoming's defensive honorees on the Second Team included four seniors: defensive ends **Josh Biezs** and **Gabe Knapton**, linebacker **Brian Hendricks** and free safety **Tashaun Gipson**. They were joined by junior strong safety **Luke Ruff**.

Biezs was a Second Team selection for the second consecutive season. Knapton, Hendricks and Gipson were Honorable Mention choices a year ago, while Hendricks earned Second Team honors as a sophomore in 2009. It was the first All-Conference recognition for Ruff.

The offensive players who earned Second Team All-Mountain West Conference recognition were: senior offensive tackle **Clayton Kirven**, junior center/guard **Nick Carlson** and junior wide receiver **Chris McNeill**. Carlson was an Honorable Mention choice in 2010. Kirven and McNeill earned All-Conference honors for the first time.

Two young Cowboys received enough votes to garner Honorable Mention All-Conference. Those two were: sophomore offensive guard **Tyler Strong** and freshman cornerback **Blair Burns**. It was Strong's first honor, and Burns earned the honor in his first season playing at the collegiate level.

2011 Home Attendance Ranked Sixth All-Time in UW History:

Wyoming's 2011 home attendance ranked No. 6 in school history, with an average of 22,162 Cowboy fans attending home games.

Wyoming's first four home games of 2011 attracted over 20,000 fans: 21,492 fans attended the season opener versus Weber State; 23,248 for the Texas State game; 32,617 attended the Wyoming-Nebraska game; and 22,985 watched the Cowboys defeat UNLV.

Wyoming's Nick Carlson Named to Rimington Trophy Preseason Watch List for Second Consecutive Year:

University of Wyoming senior center **Nick Carlson** was named to the 2012 Rimington Trophy Preseason Watch List in May 2012.

Carlson was one of 21 student-athletes that returns this season after being selected to the 2011 Rimington Watch List, and is one of 50 centers being considered for this year's award. The Rimington Trophy is awarded each year to the most outstanding center in college football. It is named for former Nebraska All-America center Dave Rimington.

Carlson earned Second Team All-Mountain West honors as a junior in 2011. The senior from Arlington Heights, Ill., led an offensive line that allowed only 12 quarterback sacks in 13 games in 2011 to rank No. 11 in the nation in fewest sacks allowed. He also was a key contributor in Wyoming averaging 181.6 rushing yards per game to rank No. 33 in the nation.

Carlson will enter his senior season having started 33 of 34 career games, including the last 25 consecutive. This past spring, he was selected as one of four team captains for the 2012 Wyoming Cowboys. An outstanding student, he has earned Academic All-Conference honors twice during his career.

As a sophomore in 2010, he was an Honorable Mention All-MWC selection.

He also started eight games as a freshman on Wyoming's 2009 New Mexico Bowl Championship team.

Wyoming Offense Returns Top Passer, Top Rusher and Top Three Receivers in 2012:

When the Wyoming Cowboys open 2012 fall camp in August, they will return their top passer, top rusher and top three receivers from a year ago.

In the case of their top passer and top rusher, those are one in the same person -- 2011 Mountain West Freshman of the Year **Brett Smith**. As a true freshman, Smith led the Cowboys in passing (2,622 passing yards) and rushing (710 net rushing yards).

Along the way, Smith shattered the Mountain West freshman total offense record, accumulating 3,332 yards of total offense. The record was previously held by TCU's Andy Dalton, who accounted for 2,691 yards of total offense as a freshman in 2007.

Smith's 710 rushing yards edged out former Cowboy Alvester Alexander, who rushed for 695 yards in 2011 prior to foregoing his senior season to declare for the NFL Draft.

The Cowboys top three receivers in terms of receptions all return in 2012. **Dominic Rufran**, a true freshman in 2011, led UW with 44 receptions. **Robert Herron** caught 43 passes as a sophomore in 2011, and **Chris McNeill** caught 42 balls and led Wyoming in receiving yards, with 504, despite missing the final four games of the season due to injury. McNeill earned Second Team All-Mountain West honors as a junior in 2011.

Brett Smith Ranked Among Top Freshman QBs in the Nation: Wyoming's true freshman quarterback **Brett Smith** was among **10 freshmen QBs who were ranked among the NCAA's statistical leaders in 2011**. The NCAA ranks quarterbacks in five categories: total offense, passing efficiency, passing yards per game, total passing yards and pass completions per game.

But the most important statistic is a team's won-loss record. Wyoming's Smith led the Cowboys to an 8-5 record as a true freshman, starting every game for the Cowboys in 2011. Louisiana Tech's Nick Isham helped lead his team to an 8-5 record, and Gary Nova of Rutgers helped lead Rutgers to a 9-4 mark, however, both Isham and Nova shared quarterbacking duties at their respective schools.

Conference Games: Wyoming's defense improved throughout the 2011 season. The Cowboys were one of the best teams in the nation in forcing turnovers and in preventing teams from scoring once they reached the red zone.

But since the start of Mountain West play, the Cowboy defense allowed the third fewest points of any team in the Mountain West -- only 154 points in seven games.

Only TCU, which allowed 107 points in its seven MW games, and Boise State, which allowed only 145, were better. Wyoming's final rankings in some key defensive categories during the 2011 season are below.

Wyoming's Luke Ruff Selected to 2012 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List

Senior Safety Among 42 Named to Watch List: Wyoming senior free safety Luke Ruff was selected to the 2012 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List, which was released in early May.

Ruff, a product of Castle Rock, Colo., recorded 102 tackles (54 solo), 2.0 tackles for loss, two pass breakups and one forced fumble as a junior in 2011. He contributed to a Wyoming defense that ranked third in the Conference in pass defense, allowing only 199.6 yards per game through the air.

Ruff was named as one of four Wyoming team captains for the 2012 season. The Mountain West is one of six leagues (ACC, Big 12, Big Ten, Pac-12, SEC) with multiple student-athletes named to the 42-person Lott Watch List for 2012.

Sponsored by The Pacific Club IMPACT Foundation, the award is given to a student-athlete who exhibits the same characteristics Ronnie Lott embodied during his Hall of Fame playing career: integrity, maturity, performance, academics, community and tenacity.

Voters for the Lott Trophy include selected members of the national media, previous finalists, members of the Pacific Club IMPACT Foundation Board of Directors, the Legends Coaches and distinguished alumni of various schools around the nation. The winner, who will be announced at the annual black-tie gala in December, receives \$25,000 for his institution's general scholarship fund.

Wyoming's Luke Ruff Earns First Team Academic All-District 7 Honors for the Second Consecutive Year in 2011:

University of Wyoming junior strong safety Luke Ruff was named a First Team Capital One Academic All-District 7 selection by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) on Nov. 10, 2011.

It is the second consecutive year that Ruff has earned First Team Academic All-District 7 honors. The native of Castle Rock, Colo., Ruff has achieved a 3.56 cumulative grade-point average in civil engineering.

Student-athletes who earn First Team Academic All-District honors advance on to the national ballot for Academic All-America consideration. The Capital One Academic All-America Football Team will be announced on Thursday, Dec. 8, 2011.

Ruff has started every game at strong safety for the Cowboys this season.

He was named to the Mountain West Conference Academic All-Conference team in both 2009 and 2010, and was also a Mountain West Conference Scholar-Athlete selection both years.

The criteria for ESPN Academic All-District honors requires a student-athlete to have achieved a minimum of a 3.30 cumulative gpa, must be a starter or important reserve on his or her team, must have completed one full calendar year at his/her current institution and must have reached sophomore athletic eligibility.

CoSIDA selects Academic Teams in 12 sport programs. District 7 consists of the states of: Wyoming, Colorado, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, Oklahoma, New Mexico and Texas.

Double-Figure Tackle Games in 2011: Six Wyoming Cowboys recorded double-figure tackle games during the 2011 season. Those six were junior strong safety **Luke Ruff**, senior free safety **Tashaun Gipson**, senior linebacker **Brian Hendricks**, senior defensive end **Gabe Knapton**, junior defensive back/linebacker **Luke Anderson** and sophomore linebacker **Devyn Harris**.

Leading the way was Ruff, who had five double-figure tackle games. He concluded the season with 102 tackles, second only to Hendricks, who had 105 on the year.

2012 Wyoming Football Schedule Highlighted by Home Games Versus Air Force, Boise State, Colorado State and San Diego State and Features Six

2011 Bowl Teams , Four of Those Bowl Teams to Play in Laramie: Wyoming's 2012 football schedule will feature a number of home games versus longtime rivals, as well as six bowl teams -- four of whom will play in Laramie.

The Cowboys will host Mountain West rivals Air Force, Boise State, Colorado State and San Diego State in 2012.

Wyoming, coming off its own appearance in the 2011 Gildan New Mexico Bowl, will face a 2012 schedule with half of its 12 opponents having played in bowls in 2011. Wyoming will host bowl teams Toledo, Air Force, Boise State and San Diego State in Laramie this coming season. The Pokes will travel to 2011 bowl participants Texas and Nevada.

"I think the schedule lays out well," said head coach Dave Christensen. "It will be a challenging schedule, but I think it is a great home schedule for our fans. I like our bye falling right before we begin conference play. If you are going to have a bye, it is probably best to have it right before we play our first conference game at Nevada."

"With the addition of Hawai'i, Fresno State and Nevada to an already talented group of teams, this league should be very competitive. We're looking forward to the challenge."

Wyoming will open the 2012 season on the road at Texas on Saturday, Sept. 1. It will be the final game of a three-game series between the Cowboys and Longhorns. Texas defeated California (21-10) in last season's Bridgepoint Education Holiday Bowl. The following weekend, UW's home opener will feature the Toledo Rockets on Saturday, Sept. 8. Toledo defeated Air Force (42-41) in the 2011 Military Bowl. The other non-conference home game for the Cowboys this season will be against Cal Poly on Saturday, Sept. 15.

Both Toledo and Cal Poly will be making their first trips to Laramie. Wyoming has played Toledo only one other time, defeating the Rockets 20-15 in Toledo in 2010. Wyoming and Cal Poly have never played each other in football prior to this season.

Wyoming's other non-conference game in 2012 will be played in Moscow, Idaho, on Saturday, Sept. 22 against the Idaho Vandals of the Western Athletic Conference.

The conference slate of home games features longtime rivals Air Force and Colorado State visiting Laramie on Saturday, Oct. 13 and Saturday, Nov. 3, respectively. The Cowboys will also host Mountain West members Boise State and San Diego State in their final year as conference members. The Broncos, who defeated Arizona State (56-24) in the MAACO Las Vegas Bowl, will visit Wyoming's War Memorial Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 27. San Diego State, which lost (30-32) to Louisiana-Lafayette in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, will be the Pokes's season-ending game on Saturday, Nov. 24.

The Cowboys' first Mountain West game of 2012 will be played against first-year conference member Nevada in Reno, Nev., on Saturday Oct. 6. Nevada lost (17-24) to Southern Miss in the 2011 Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl. UW will also play road games: at first-year Mountain West member, Fresno State, on Saturday, Oct. 20; at New Mexico on Saturday, Nov. 10; and at UNLV on Saturday, Nov. 17.

Pokes' Overtime History: The Wyoming Cowboys have played eight overtime games in their history. The most recent overtime game the Cowboys played was in 2009. UW captured the 2009 New Mexico Bowl Championship, defeating Fresno State 35-28 in double overtime.

Two of Wyoming's eight overtime games have been played on neutral sites in postseason -- the 1996 Western Athletic Conference Championship game in Las Vegas, Nev., and the 2009 New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque, N.M.

The other six Wyoming overtime games have been played on the road.

The Cowboys have **never played an overtime game at home**.

Cowboy Offensive Attack Enjoys Strong Year in 2011 -- Offense Looking to Continue Tradition of Cowboy Offensive Attacks of the Past:

With the hiring of **Dave Christensen** as head coach, Wyoming fans can't help envisioning the return of a wide-open offense to Cowboy Football. An offense that would resemble those that successful Cowboy teams in the 1980s and 90s were built upon.

Christensen has brought to Wyoming his no-huddle, spread offensive attack that made the University of Missouri one of the highest-scoring and most productive offenses in the country from 2005-08. In 2007, Missouri ended the season ranked No. 4 in the final Associated Press poll -- the school's highest year-end ranking in history.

Prior to the 2011 season, new offensive coordinator **Gregg Brandon** was added to Christensen's coaching staff. Brandon was previously an assistant at Wyoming from 1987-90 under then head coach Paul Roach.

Wyoming fans can remember some high-powered offenses of their own under Roach and Joe Tiller. Those Cowboy offenses of the late 1980s and 1990s were not only among the most explosive and exciting in school history, but they fueled a period of success that resulted in four conference championships, four bowl berths and numerous national rankings for the Pokes.

Wyoming Cowboys Post 4-2 Road Record in 2011, Go 3-1 in Mountain West

Play on the Road: With a 22-19 win at Colorado State to conclude the regular season, the Wyoming Cowboys improved their 2011 road record to 4-2 overall and 3-1 in conference play.

UW defeated Bowling Green (28-27), San Diego State (30-27), Air Force (25-17) and Colorado State (22-19) on the road this season. Wyoming's only two road losses this year came at Boise State (14-36) and at Utah State (19-63).

The Pokes also won their third Mountain West road game of the season by defeating CSU. UW began its 2011 conference road schedule with a 30-27 road win at San Diego State on Oct. 29. That broke a four-game road losing streak in conference play for UW. The Pokes followed that up with a 25-17 road victory at Air Force on Nov. 12 before losing at Boise State.

Wyoming is 8-10 in road games during the Dave Christensen era, which breaks down to a 3-3 road record in 2009, a 1-5 road record in 2010 and a 4-2 record in 2011. UW is 3-3 in non-conference road games under Christensen and is 5-7 in MW road games.

Cowboys Continue Recent Success When Traveling East of the Mississippi:

It's not often that the Wyoming Cowboys travel east of the Mississippi River to play football, but when they do the Pokes have enjoyed some recent success. On Sept. 17, 2011, Wyoming defeated Bowling Green, 28-27, on the Falcons' home field in Bowling Green, Ohio. Wyoming has won five consecutive games when traveling east of the Mississippi. Over the past dozen years, Wyoming has traveled east 12 times and has posted a 6-6 (.500) record in those road games.

Mountain West Has Five Bowl Agreements in Place for the 2012 College Football Season:

As a member of the Mountain West, Wyoming has several opportunities for football postseason play. Now entering its 14th year of existence, the Mountain West has five bowl agreements in place for the 2012 season.

The 2012 college football bowl season will once again kickoff with the seventh annual Gildan New Mexico Bowl on Saturday, Dec. 15 serving as the first game of the bowl season. The Mountain West is scheduled to play a team from the Pacific-12 Conference, with ESPN televising. Wyoming defeated Fresno State 35-28 in double overtime in the 2009 New Mexico Bowl, and lost to Temple, 15-37, in the 2011 Gildan New Mexico Bowl.

The MW will send a team to the Maaco Las Vegas Bowl for the 14th consecutive year in 2012. The Las Vegas Bowl will feature teams from the Mountain West and Pacific-12 conferences. This year's contest will be played on Saturday, Dec. 22, 2011, and will be televised by ESPN. Since entering into its original agreement in 1999, teams from the MWC have posted an 8-5 record in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Wyoming Cowboys won the 2004 Vegas Bowl by a score of 24-21 over UCLA. Again this year, the host venue for the game will be Sam Boyd Stadium in Las Vegas.

The 2012 season will mark the eighth year that the Mountain West will have a team play in the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl in San Diego's Qualcomm Stadium. This year, a team from the Mountain West is scheduled to face BYU, if the Cougars qualify for bowl eligibility, on Thursday, Dec. 20 in a game to be televised on ESPN.

Once again, the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl will feature a team from the Mountain West versus a representative from Conference USA. The game will be played on Saturday, Dec. 29, and will be televised on ESPN.

The newest addition to the Mountain West's bowl games is the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl, which will take place on Christmas Eve, Monday, Dec. 24. A Mountain West team will play a team from Conference USA. The 2012 season will mark the 11th Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl, and it will be played on Christmas Eve for the eighth time in its history. ESPN will televise the 2012 game.

Wyoming has won **66.9 percent** of its games in War Memorial Stadium.

"The War" first opened on Sept. 16, 1950, with UW recording a 61-13 win over Montana State. War Memorial's original capacity was 20,000 in 1950. It was expanded to 25,500 in 1970, and the seating was increased to a capacity of 33,500 in 1977.

Following reconstruction of the upper deck on the West side of War Memorial Stadium in the summer of 2004, the new capacity of War Memorial Stadium was 30,514. With the construction of the Wildcatter Stadium Club & Suites in 2009-10, the current capacity is 29,181.

New Tradition Began for Wyoming Football in 2009 With the Carrying of a United States Army Special Forces Flag and a Wyoming State Flag: The Wyoming Cowboys began a new tradition on Saturday, Oct. 10, 2009, versus New Mexico. The Cowboys entered the field carrying two flags -- a United States Army Special Forces Flag and a Wyoming State Flag.

On Friday, Oct. 9, 2009, members of the Special Forces Association Cowboy Chapter 71 presented the Wyoming Football team with an official flag of the United States Army Special Forces along with a symbolic Green Beret once worn by a fallen Green Beret in Afghanistan.

The U.S. Army Special Forces Flag is carried onto the field each week by the Wyoming Cowboy who scored the most points as a special forces (special teams) player the previous week.

Also the week leading up to the Oct. 10 game versus New Mexico, the Wyoming Football team was sent a package by the 115th Fires Brigade based out of Cheyenne. One of the items in that package was a Wyoming State Flag, which had been flown over Camp Arifjan in Kuwait. The Wyoming State Flag is carried each week by a player who is a native of the state of Wyoming to honor those from Wyoming who are serving overseas.

Dave Christensen enters his fourth season as head coach of the Wyoming Cowboys in 2012. His third season at Wyoming was his team's best, as he led Wyoming to a third-place finish in the Mountain West Conference and was named Mountain West Coach of the Year. He became the first Wyoming football coach to earn Coach of the Year honors since Joe Tiller in 1996.

Wyoming's third-place finish in the Mountain West in 2011 placed them behind only No. 13 ranked TCU and No. 6 ranked Boise State. His Cowboys ranked as the sixth most improved team in the nation in 2011, and they were the surprise team in the Mountain West, finishing third after being picked sixth in the conference's preseason poll. UW's 8-5 record was its first eight-win season since 1998. The Cowboys' third-place finish and 5-2 conference record matched Wyoming's best since becoming a member of the Mountain West in 1999.

The Cowboys' victories in 2011 included road wins over Mountain West rivals Colorado State, Air Force and San Diego State. The Pokes' win over CSU marked the third consecutive over the Rams. Wyoming hadn't won three in a row over Colorado State since 1987, '88 and '89, and hadn't won consecutive road games vs. CSU since 1996 and '98. By defeating both Air Force and Colorado State in 2011, the Pokes accomplished a sweep of their Front Range rivals for the first time since 1996.

The 2011 season concluded with Wyoming earning a bid to the Gildan New Mexico Bowl versus Temple. It was the second time in his three seasons as head coach that Christensen guided Wyoming to a bowl game. The last time that occurred at Wyoming was 1988-90.

The only conference teams to defeat UW in 2011 were nationally-ranked TCU and Boise State, who finished first and second in the MW, respectively. Christensen's 2011 team became his second in three seasons to win at least seven games. His 2009 Cowboy squad posted a 7-6 record.

On Jan. 12, 2012, it was announced that the University of Wyoming had signed Christensen to a new five-year contract that will run through Dec. 31, 2016.

You couldn't have asked for much more from a head coach in his first season. Dave Christensen's first year as a college head coach in 2009 was filled with highlights. He led the Wyoming Cowboys to a bowl game in his first season, becoming only the second Cowboy head coach to accomplish that feat -- the other being Paul Roach in 1987. Christensen became the first UW head coach to win a bowl game in his first season, as his Pokes defeated Fresno State, 35-28 in double overtime, in the New Mexico Bowl. He also guided Wyoming to a road win over archrival Colorado State in the regular-season finale, bringing the Bronze Boot back to Laramie.

For a team that began the season picked to finish last (ninth) in the Mountain West Conference preseason poll, Christensen's Cowboys ended the season with a 7-6 overall record, a 4-4 league mark and a fifth-place finish in a league that had three teams end the season ranked among the Top 18 in both the Associated Press Media Poll and USA Today Coaches' Poll. And his team accomplished all this while playing a schedule that was ranked as the eighth toughest in the nation and included BCS national runner-up Texas. All told, Christensen had seven of his Cowboys earn All-Conference honors his first season at UW.

While he delivered on his promise to the 2009 senior class that he would do everything he could to get them to a bowl game, he also built a team with an eye toward the future.

In his second season at UW, Christensen's young team faced one of the nation's most difficult schedules, playing three teams that were ranked in the Top 5 in the nation at the time the Cowboys faced them (No. 3 Boise State, No. 4 Texas and No. 5 TCU) and playing a fourth Top 10 ranked team in No. 10 Utah. Wyoming ended Christensen's second season on a high note, defeating archrival Colorado State, 44-0, in the season finale. Eight Cowboys earned All-Conference recognition at the conclusion of the season -- two Second Team selections and six Honorable Mention honorees.

Wyoming Football hired its dynamic and innovative new leader on Dec. 1, 2008, as University of Wyoming Athletics Director Tom Burman announced that Christensen, then the Assistant Head Coach and Offensive Coordinator at Missouri, had been selected as the new head coach of the Cowboys.

Christensen became the 31st coach in Wyoming Football history, and was signed to a five-year contract -- a contract that was extended in the spring of 2010 to run through Dec. 31, 2014.

While the offensive coordinator at Missouri, Christensen was named the 2007 National Offensive Coordinator of the Year by Rivals.com and was also runner-up for the 2007 Frank Broyles Award, which honors the top assistant coach in the nation each season.

He helped lead the Missouri Tigers to the Big 12 Championship game in both the 2007 and 2008 seasons as champions of the Big 12 North.

In 2008, Mizzou ranked No. 4 in the NCAA in passing offense (330.4 yards per game), No. 6 in scoring offense (42.2 points per game) and No. 8 in total offense (484.1 yards per game). The Tigers concluded the 2008 season ranked No. 16 in the final USA Today Coaches' Poll, No. 19 in the final Associated Press Media Poll and were No. 21 in the final BCS Rankings entering the college bowl season. Missouri defeated Northwestern, 30-23 in overtime, in the 2008 Valero Alamo Bowl.

The 2007 season saw Missouri conclude the season ranked No. 4 in the final Associated Press ranking. That was the highest season-ending ranking in school history for the Tigers. Mizzou finished the season by defeating Arkansas, 38-7, in the Cotton Bowl, giving the Tigers a school record 12th win on the season. 

Brett Smith's first career victory was a big one, as the true freshman quarterback led UW on a game-winning touchdown drive with less than two minutes left to claim a dramatic 35-32 win over Weber State. More than 21,000 fans saw Smith connect with sophomore wide receiver Robert Herron in the back of the endzone with 22 seconds to go for the go-ahead score. Smith finished his first career start 27-of-41 for 294 yards and three touchdowns.

Herron had a career game with seven catches for 104 yards and two touchdowns to earn his first 100-yard receiving game. Junior running back Alvester Alexander and senior wide receiver Mazi Ogbonna made six catches each for 62 and 42 yards respectively, and Ogbonna had a touchdown also. Alvester added 30 yards and a touchdown on the ground, while sophomore running back Brandon Miller led UW with 59 yards on 10 carries.

Defensively, junior strong safety Luke Ruff paced Wyoming with 10 tackles. Junior defensive end Korey Jones and sophomore cornerback Marqueston Huff each had nine tackles, while senior defensive tackle Gabe Knapton had six tackles and UW's only sack.

It was a total team effort for UW, as the Cowboys hung a dominant 45-10 win over Texas State in front of 23,248 fans in War Memorial Stadium. The Bobcats scored early in the second quarter to pull within 14-10 and went into halftime down just a touchdown, but Texas State wouldn't push the ball past midfield in the second half and the Cowboys rolled.

Freshman Brett Smith put forth another solid effort, as the QB passed for 236 yards and one touchdown on a 16-for-31 effort, while adding 73 yards and two touchdowns on the ground. Junior running back Ghaali Muhammad rumbled for 123 rushing yards and sophomore Brandon Miller had 101 to go with a touchdown for both, as the duo notched their first career 100-yard efforts on the ground. Freshman wide receiver Dominic Rufran had five catches for 96 yards.

Defensively, freshman linebacker Devyn Harris led the Cowboys with seven tackles, while safety Luke Anderson, linebacker Brian Hendricks and safety Luke Ruff each had six stops. Junior defensive end Korey Jones added four sacks, with three of them coming on successive plays. The UW defense held Texas State to just 189 yards of total offense.

Playing in the most anticipated game in program history, Wyoming went into halftime trailing No. 9 Nebraska by just seven points, but the Huskers outplayed the Cowboys in the second half to come away with a 38-14 victory.

Wyoming (3-1) went blow-for-blow with the Huskers (4-0) in the first half, as freshman QB Brett Smith hit senior wide receiver Mazi Ogbonna for a 48-yard touchdown pass late in the second quarter to go in at halftime down 14-7. Nebraska rattled off 17 unanswered points, though, and kept the Cowboys out of the endzone until midway through the fourth quarter.

Smith paced UW's efforts with a 17-for-33 effort for 166 passing yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore wide receiver Robert Herron had four catches for 35 yards and a touchdown, while Ogbonna added 54 yards and a touchdown. Junior running back Alvester Alexander contributed 55 rushing yards on 14 carries.

Defensively, senior defensive end Josh Biezens notched eight tackles, while sophomore linebacker Devyn Harris and senior linebacker Brian Hendricks each contributed seven stops. Defensive tackle Gabe Knapton earned a sack to go with six tackles, as the senior moved into 10th all-time on UW's career tackle chart.



Wyoming junior Luke Anderson intercepted Boise State quarterback Kellen Moore on the first possession of the game for the Broncos and returned the interception 29 yards to give Wyoming a 7-0 lead over No. 7 ranked Boise State. UW held that lead until 1:10 remaining in the first half, before BSU scored 14 points in the final 1:10 to take a 13-7 halftime lead over the Cowboys.

Boise State scored 23 second-half points to secure a 36-14 victory.

Offensively, Cowboy freshman quarterback Brett Smith went 17-for-25 for 78 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Smith added 37 yards rushing to total 115 yards on the day, bringing his season total to 2,859 total yards, which is the Mountain West freshman record for total offense. Redshirt freshman Sam Stratton led the Pokes in rushing with 54 yards, and freshman receiver Josh Doctson led UW in receiving, snagging three passes for 39 yards and one touchdown.

Defensively, senior free safety Tashaun Gipson had 12 tackles and a fumble recovery and junior strong safety Luke Ruff had 10 stops.

Wyoming freshman wide receiver Josh Doctson made his debut in the Border War a memorable one.

Doctson had three catches for a career-high 129 yards and two touchdowns to power Wyoming to a 22-19 come-from-behind win over Colorado State in Hughes Stadium. The win kept the traveling Bronze Boot trophy in Laramie, where it has been for the last two years.

An announced crowd of 17,207 braved the 26-degree temperatures and snowy stands to watch the back-and-forth battle between the Rams and Cowboys (8-4, 5-2 MW) for the Bronze Boot trophy. Freshman quarterback Brett Smith threw for 127 yards and two touchdowns, but his efforts weren't quite enough as Wyoming lost to Temple 37-15 in the New Mexico Bowl.

Smith was 20-for-30 with two touchdowns and three interceptions on the day. Smith's scoring tosses went to freshman running back Kody Sutton and freshman wide receiver Josh Doctson. Sutton's 14-yard catch-and-run touchdown late in the fourth quarter was his first career score as a Cowboy.

Smith had 127 yards passing and 65 yards rushing for 189 total yards, which gave him 3,329 yards for the season. That mark moved Smith to No. 3 on UW's single-season total offense chart.

Cowboy senior linebacker Brian Hendricks had 13 tackles, moving him to No. 11 on UW's all-time list. Senior defensive end Gabe Knapton also had seven stops, giving him a total of 368 for his career. Knapton is fifth all-time in Cowboy history.

Wyoming ended its season 8-5 overall and 5-2 in the Mountain West.
